MOVEMENT OF EVAPORATED BILK MUCH HEAVIER THAN CONDENSED MILK

THE MOST NOTICEABLE FEATURE REVEALED BY A REVIEW OF THE LATEST AVAILABLE REPORTS FROM THE MOST NOTICEABLE FEATURE REVEALED BY A REVIEW OF THE LATEST AVAILABLE REPORTS FROM MILK MANUFACTURERS, IS THE ACTIVITY IN THE MOVEMENT OF UNSWEETENED EVAPORATED STOCKS AS COMPARED WITH SWEETENED CONDENSED DURING THE PAST MONTH. BUSINESS IN THE FORMER CLASS OF GOODS WAS OF MUCH MORE SATISFACTORY VOLUME THAN THE LATTER, AND THE TONE OF THE MARKET CORRESPONDINGLY BETTER. THIS APPLIES TO CASE GOODS PRIMARILY, AS THE APPROACH OF THE TORRESPONDINGLY BETTER. THIS APPLIES TO CASE GOODS FERFCIALLY FROM THE ICE SOOLER WEATHER HAS NATURALLY REDUCED THE DEMAND FOR BULK GOODS, ESPECIALLY FROM THE

CREAM TRADE.

MANUFACTURERS REPORTS OF TOTAL STOCKS ON HAND SEPT. I, INDICATED APPROXIMATELY THE SAME SURPLUS OF CONDENSED CASE GOODS AS THE PREVIOUS MONTH, BUT SHOW A NOTABLE DECREASE IN THE QUANTITIES OF EVAPORATED CASE GOODS OF OVER 35%. THE SAME COMPARISON HOLDS WITH REFERENCE TO UNSOLD STOCKS ALSO, CONDENSED CASE GOODS BEING PRACTICALLY THE SAME AS AUG , WHILE UNSOLD STOCKS OF EVAPORATED CASE GOODS SEPT. WERE ALMOST 50% LOWER. STOCKS OF BOTH CLASSES OF CASE GOODS WERE LESS THAN HALF OF THOSE REPORTED A YEAR AGO.

MANUFACTURERS' SELLING PRICES TO DOMESTIC TRADE DURING AUG.REMAINED PRACTICALLY THE

SAME AS DURING JULY, SUT REDUCTIONS OCCURRED IN PRICES TO FOREIGN TRADE. THE GREATEST

CUTS WERE MADE IN PRICES OF SWEETENED CONDENSED WHICH AVERAGED 34¢ LOWER PER CASE. UT
SWEETENED EVAPORATED PRICES TO FOREIGN TRADE WERE NOT SO GENERALLY REDUCED BY ALL MAN TRACTURERS, AS SOME SEEM TO HAVE ADVANCED THESE PRICES SLIGHTLY WITH THE RESULT THAT LOW
