MAND IN ENGLAND IS REPORTED AS SOMEWHAT ON ACCOUNT OF THE LOWER PRICES AT WHICH HEAVIER, BUT AMERICAN MANUFACTURERS HAVE THIS CLASS OF GOODS COULD BE SOLD.
AS COMPETITORS AN INCREASING NUMBER OF EURO- LIGHT SUMMER DEMAND FROM ICE CREAM MECTRICAL FAN FACTORIES WHICH ARE ABLE TO LAY DOWN PEAN FACTORIES WHICH ARE ABLE TO LAY DOWN THE GOODS AT A LOWER COST AND CONSEQUENTLY FOR CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK HAS NOT GET THE BUSINESS. EXCEPT FOR BRANDS WHICH DEEN UP TO EXPECTATIONS, THE ICE CHEAM TRAIARE WIDELY KNOWN THROUGH EXTENSIVE ADVER- ESPECIALLY HAS TAKEN FAR LESS QUANTITIES OF ISING, ELIGN DEMAND IS NOT ABSORS VERY LARGE QUANTITIES OF AMERICAN MADE GOODS IN THE VERY NEAR FUTURE, LATEST EXPORT FIGURES ARE FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE AND INDICATE A SLIGHT DECREASE UNDER MAY AND QUITE A HEAVY DECREASE UNDER JUNE 1921. SURPLUS MILK GOES INTO BUTTER AND CHEESE

MONTHS WHICH HAS HELPED CONSIDERABLY TO OFF- CARRIED ON CONSERVATIVELY AND THAT DUE CON SET THE DULL DEMAND FOR CANNED MILK. PRICES SIDERATION HAS BEEN GIVEN TO THE ANTICIPATE OF BOTH BUTTER AND CHEESE HAVE BEEN SUCH THAT IT HAS BEEN FOSSIBLE TO DIVERT SURPLUS CLASSES OF TRADE, WHILE TOTAL STOCKS ON JUL WILK INTO ONE OF THE OTHER OF THESE PRODUCTS, I AS INDICATED IN THE ACCOMPANYING TABLES AND AS RESULT THE PRODUCTION OF CONDENSED REVEAL A MODERATELY HEAVY INCREASE OVER JUN AND AS RESULT THE PRODUCTION OF CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED GOODS HAS BEEN HELD AS LOW AS WAS CONSISTENT WITH GOOD BUSINESS PRAC-TICE. THESE OUTLESS MAVE SEEN FORTUNATE NOT ONLY DECAUSE OF THE LIGHTER DEMAND WHICH HAS FEATURED DOTH CONDENSED AND EVAFORATED

WILK MARKETS, BUT BECAUSE OF THE UPWARD TEN-DENCY OF COSTS OF MANUFACTURING, SEASONAL ASSAUCES IN TRICES OF BOM MILK ARE PROSE

THE SUMMER DEMAND FROM THE DOMESTIC TRAD COND ENSING FIRMS THIS IS EXPLAINED PARTLY THROUGH THE FACT THAT POWDERED MILK IS BEING MORE WIDELY US? IN THE MANUFACTURE OF ICE CREAM, AND ALSO BE CAUSE OF THE RELATIVELY COOL SUMMER WHICH HAS FEATURED VARIOUS CONGUMING SECTIONS OF THE COUNTRY,

CONDENSERIES, HOWEVER, HAVE HAD AT LEAST SUMMARIZED FIGURES FROM MANUFACTURERS IN-ONE FAVORABLE CONDITION DURING THE PAST FEW DICATE THAT CONDENSING OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN AND ACTUAL DULL SUMMER DEMAND FROM ALL
