CONDENSED MILK PRODUCTION INFLUENCED BY HIGH FLUID MILK AND BUTTER PRICES

APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN MORE OR LESS DULL DUR- OF CANNED MILK, BUT A FURTHER INFLUENCE ING MAY, BUT ON THE WHOLE THE TONE WAS IS TO BE FOUND IN THE FACT THAT CONDEN-ING MAY, BUT ON THE WHOLE THE TONE WASTEADY TO FIRM WITH MARKETS GENERALLY BUT ON THE WHOLE THE TONE WAS HEALTHY CONDITION. ONE OF THE OUTSTANDING FACTS BEARING ON THE SITUATION WAS THE RELATIVELY SMALLER QUANTITY OF AVAILABLE STOCKS IN THE HANDS OF MANUFACTURERS AS COMPARED WITH A YEAR AGO. STOCKS REPORTED AS OF MAY | WERE APPROXIMATELY 124,000,000 LBS., ABOUT 13% LIGHTER THAN MAY 1, 1922, AND THE INCREASE OVER APRIL I WAS NOT SO GREAT AS A GOOD MANY OF THE TRADE HAD EX-PECTED THE TABULATION WOULD SHOW. THIS CONDITION WAS BROUGHT ACCUST THE PART BY LATE SEASON AND RESULTING LIGHT MILE FLOW.

DEMAND FOR CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK WHICH OF COURSE CUT DOWN THE PRODUCTION SERY OUTPUTS HAVE BEEN AFFECTED BY THE COMPETITION FOR RAW MILK ON THE PART OF BUTTER AND ICE CREAM MANUFACTURERS, AND OF FLUID MILK DEALERS. WHILE THESE CTHER MORE ATTRACTIVE OUTLETS FOR WILK MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR CONDENSERIES TO MORE NEARLY CONTROL PRODUCTION FOR WHICH REASON ALONE THEY AFFORDED A WELCOME RELIEF FROM THE SURPLUS MILK PROBLEM, NEVERTHELESS, A GOOD MANY WASSUFACTURERS WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN CONCERNED IN STOCKS HAD SHOWN A HEAVIER ACCUMULATION OF MAY I, AS BY THIS TIME STOURING UP FOR THE SEASONS OF LIGHT

PRODUCTION USUALLY HAS BEGUN AND STOCKS
NORMALEY SHOW MATERIAL INCREASES. UNLESS EXPORTS UP TO MAY I WERE APPROXIMATELY
MANUFACTURERS CHANGE THEIR POLICIES, IT 61,000,000 LBS. WHICH IS 26,500,000 LBS.
BEGINS TO LOOK AS THOUGH THE PACK MAY BE
LESS THAN THE SIMILAR PERIOD IN 1922. LIGHT, UNDER WHICH CONDITION IT COULD NOT BE SURFRISING TO SEE PRICES WORK TO HIGHER LEVELS. THE SUGAR SITUATION HAS HAD A LOT TO DO WITH INFLUENCING THE PRODUCTION OF SWEETENED CONDENSED, AND HIGH SUGAR COSTS HAVE CURTAILED THE DEMAND FOR THIS CLASS OF GOODS. THE TENDENCY OF MANUFACTURERS IS TO PROTECT THEMSELVES AGAINST BEING CAUGHT WITH HIGH COST STOCKS IN THE FACE OF A POSSIBLE DECLINE OF SUGAR PRICES.

LACK OF CREDIT CURTAILS EXPORTS

EXPORT DEMAND IS SOMEWHAT UNCERTAIN. APRIL SHIPMENTS TOTALLED AROUND 18,000,000 LBS. OF CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED COMBINED, AS COMPARED WITH SOME 24,000,000 LBS. IN

SOME FARRLY LARGE QUANTITIES OF EVAPORATED MILK MOVED TO EUROPEAN COUNTRIES DURING APRIL, AND WHILE GERMANY AND RUSSIA, AS WELL AS AUSTRIA WERE IN THE MARKET FOR FURTHER QUANTITIES DURING MAY, SELLERS WERE NOT INCLINED TO LISTEN TO ANY TERMS EXCEPT CASH, WHICH USUALLY RESULTED IN A TERMINATION OF NEGOTIATIONS.
