SLUGGISH DEMAND FEATURES CANNED MILK MARKETS

THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER APPEARS TO HAVE BROUGHT NO RELIEF WHATEVER TO THE SLUGGISH SITUATION WHICH HAS FEATURED CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS ALMOST CONTINUOUS-LY SINCE AUGUST. IF CONDITIONS CHANGED AT ALL, THE CHANGE WAS TO A STILL WEAKER POBI COMESTIC DEMAND WHICH WAS MENTIONED IN RESTRICT THE BUPPLY, SOME MANUFACTURERS

OCTOBER SEEMS TO HAVE ACTUALLY MATERIALIZED HAVE TURNED PART OF THEIR MILK INTO BUTTER,

TO A CERTAIN EXTENT WITH THE CONTINUE OF THE PROPERTY TION. THE POSSIBILITY OF A DECREAGE IN TO A CERTAIN EXTENT WITH THE OBVIOUS RESULT WHICH HAS ALREADY APPEARED ON THE MARKETS, OF A DEPRESSING EFFECT UPON THE MARKET, AND WHICH HAS FOUND READY OUTLETS AT THE OF A DEPRESSING EFFECT UPON THE MARKET, BINCE IT IS UPON DOMESTIC DEMAND THAT CANNED MILK MANUFACTURERS ARE STILL HAVING TO DEPEND VERY LARGELY AS AN OUTLET. CONDITIONS WHICH IN TURN AFFECTED THE DL-

MAND FOR THEIR PRODUCT.

IN THE FACE OF SUCH CONDITIONS MANUFAC-TURERS HAVE HAD TO OPERATE CAUTIOUSLY AS TO PRODUCTION AND AT THE SAME TIME, THEY HAVE MADE DESPERATE EFFORTS TO MOVE GOODS OUT OF THEIR OWN HANDS. IN ENDEAVORING TO RELATIVELY HIGH BUTTER PRICES WHICH HAVE PREVAILED. STILL OTHER MANUFACTURERS HAVE BILITIES OF BUTTER MANUFACTURE ALTHOUGH THEY WILL NOT TURN TO THIS UNLESS THEIR

STOCKS SHOW HEAVY ACCUMULATION

TOTAL STOCKS IN MANUFACTURERS HANDS ON NOVEMBER I OF SOME 210,000,000 LBS. REPRESENT A REDUCTION OF APPROXIMATELY 15,000,000 LBS. DURING OCTOBER. MOST OF THIS REDUCTION WAS CONDENSED GOODS, THE REDUCTION OF EVAPORATED AMOUNTING TO LESS THAN 6,000,000 LBS. A COMPARISON WITH THE OCTOBER REDUCTION LAST YEAR OF 36,000,000 LBS. WHICH LEFT NOVEMBER I, 1922, STOCKS OF BUT 86,000,000 LBS. SHOWS READILY WHAT THIS YEAR'S SITUATION IS. PUT IN ANOTHER WAY NOVEMBER I TOTAL STOCKS THIS YEAR WERE OVER 123,000,000 LBS. HEAVIER THAN NOV. I LAST YEAR, FOLLOWING AN OCTOBER PETUCTION OF LESS THAN HALF OF THE OCTOBER 1922 REDUCTION.

LIMITED EXPORT OUTLETS

While export figures for October indicate a relatively light movement, being around 17,538,000 lbs. of condensed and evaporated combined, and total exports for the ten months January to October inclusive of 142,313,000 lbs. are over 22,000,000 lb. lighter than during the same period in 1922, 17 is of interest to note that the October 1923 bhipments exceeded those of October 1922. This appears largely due to the fact that the United Kingdom has been taking increasing quantities of evaporated milk sinc angust, as compared with materially smaller amounts last year. France and Germany both took important amounts of evaporated the past October, which taken together with wat went to the United Kingdom, constituted ove 60% of the United Kingdom, constituted ove ept possibly for the shipments to the Philippine Islands, which alone amounted to over a million and a half pounds, the balance of the October exports appear to have been so called regular eusiness. The export outlook on the whole is still unfavorable.
