APRIL SEEMS TO HAVE BROUGHT NO ENERS DROP OF OVER EIGHT MILLION PO COURAGING DEVELOPMENTS IN THE CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS. CURRENT RE-PORTS FROM SOME QUARTERS INDICATE A SLIGHTLY BETTER FEELING ON THE PART OF LOCAL DISTRIBUTORS, BUT ON THE WHOLE THE MARKET HAS BEEN DULL AND DEPRESSED, AND THE MOVE OF GOODS SLUGGISH. BUYERS HAVE CONTINUED TO BE VERY CONSERVATIVE IN THEIR PURCHASES, NOT ONLY IN ANTICIPATION OF THE APPROACHING FLUSH SEASON WHICH THEY DOUBTLESS EXPECT MAY BRING LOWER PRICES, BUT ALSO BECAUSE THEY HAVE TAKEN ADVATAGE OF THE GENERAL UNEASINESS WHICH HAS FEATURED MARKETS MORE OR LESS FOR SEVERAL MONTHS.

FROM THE STANDPOINT OF THE MANUFACTU-RER A NUMBER OF UNFAVORABLE CONDITIONS HAVE DEVELOPED. IN THE FIRST PLACE, EX-PORT TRADE HAS BEEN DISCORAGING, AND RE-LIEF CUYING WHICH FROM TIME TO TIME HAS GIVEN SOME STIMULUS TO THE MARKET HAS A-GAIN BECOME RELATIVELY UNIMPORTANT. TOTAL EXPORTS DURING MARCH WERE STLIGHTLY IN EX-CESS OF TWELVE AND A HALF MILLION FOUNDS

CROP OF OVER EIGHT MILLION POUNDS UNDER FEBRUARY, AND APPROXIMATELY THE SAME AMOUNT LESS THAN MARCH A YEAR AGO. SINCE EARLY LAST FALL EXPORTS OF EVAPORATED HAVE BEEN RUNNING MUCH HEAVIER THAN CON-DENSED, BUT THESE LATEST FIGURES AVAILABLE (March SHOW MATERIAL CLASS OF GOODS. BUT LITTLE OF THE MARCH SHIPMENTS APPEARS TO HAVE INCLUDED WHAT MIGHT BE PROPERLY TERMED RELIEF ORDERS. LOWER BUTTER AND CHEESE MARKETS AN

INFLUENCE

THE OTHER DISCOURAGING CONDITION WHICH CONFRONTS MANUFACTURERS IS THAT THE FLUSH SEASON OF PRODUCTION IS NEAR AT HAND, AND THAT ALREADY REACTIONS IN THE BUTTER AND CHEESE MARKETS HAVE RESULTED IN SOME SHARP PRICE DECLINES. WHEN IT IS REALIZED THAT FIRM BUTTER AND CHEESE MAR-KETS HAVE FOR SOMETIME LENT CONSIDERABLE SUPPORT TO CANNED MILK THROUGH THE FACT THAT CONDENSERS HAVE DIVERTED MILK INTO THESE PRODUCTS, THE EFFECT OF THE WEAKNESS CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED COMBINED), A PRICES MAY ALSO WORK TO RETARD THE DEMAND
