CONDENSED AND EVAFORATED MILK MARKETS ON THE WHOLE FIRMED UP SOME DURING AUGUST, AND THE OUTLOOK AT THE CLOSE OF THE MONTH WAS MORE FAVORABLE THAN FOR SOME TIME, THIS SHOULD NOT, HOWEVER, BE TAKEN AS AN INDICATION OF THE MARKETS HAVING FULLY REGAINED A HEALTHY CONDITION, FOR STOCKS ARE STILL BURDENSOME AND CONTINUE TO BE THE CAUSE OF NO LITTLE CONCERN. BUT THE SITUATION HAS DEVELOPED INTO ONE WHICH APPEARS MORE FAVORABLE FROM THE MANUFACTURERS! STANDPOINT, IN THAT GOODS HAVE BEEN MOVING MORE FREELY.
