CANNED MILK STOCKS ALMOST AT RECORD LOW LEVEL

CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS CONTINUE IN A STEADY TO FIRM POSITION. STOCKS ARE AT A LOW POINT FOLLOWING A GRADUAL REDUCTION SINCE LAST JULY. WHILE DEMAND AT THE MOMENT IS SOMEWHAT SLOW AND EXPORTS HAVE SHRUNK TO A LOW FIGURE, THIS IS OFFSET BY LIGHT PRODUCTION AND THE FACT THAT FLUID MILK MARKETS ARE NOT THROWING SURPLUS MILK BACK ON CONDENSED MANUFACTURERS.

THE FACTOR WHICH IS OF OUTSTANDING INTEREST IS THE CONTINUED REDUCTION IN STOCKS HELD BY MANUFACTURERS. LATEST FIGURES AVAILABLE COVERING FEBRUARY 1, INDICATE THAT STOCKS ON THAT DATE WERE AT THE LOWEST POINT THEY HAVE BEEN SINCE MARCH 1, 1923. FEBRUARY 1 STOCKS OF 86,437,000 POUNDS REPRESENT A DECREASE OF OVER 200,000,000 POUNDS UNDER THOSE OF JULY 1 LAST YEAR. AS COMPARED WITH A YEAR AGO, THESE STOCKS ARE JUST A LITTLE MORE THAN HALF THOSE OF FEBRUARY 1, 1924. THE FIVE YEAR AVERAGE FOR FEBRUARY 1 IS 138,544,380 POUNDS. IT IS OBVIOUS, THEREFORE, THAT STATISTICALLY, CONCENTRATED MILK

MARKETS ARE IN A STRONG POSITION. LIGHTER PRODUCTION AND A FAIRLY GOOD DOMESTIC DEMAND APPEAR TO BE THE FACTORS WHICH HAVE BROUGHT ABOUT THIS CONDITION. A MONTH AGO IT WAS STATED THAT SOME FACTORIES WERE HAVING DIFFICULTY IN SECURING ADEQUATE MILK SUPPLIES TO TAKE CARE OF CURRENT ORDERS. THIS SITUATION STILL CONTINUES TO SOME EXTENT AND SOME MANUFACTURERS ARE NOT ONLY REPORTED TO BE OVERSOLD BUT ARE BUYING GOODS FROM OTHER MANUFACTURERS TO FILL ORDERS. TOGETHER WITH THESE CONDITIONS IS THE FACT THAT IN MANY CONDENSERY SECTIONS LOCAL DEMAND FROM FLUID MILK MARKETS IS SUFFICIENT TO ABSORB SUCH SURPLUS MILK AS MIGHT OTHERWISE BE DIVERTED INTO CONDENSED OR EVAPORATED, SO THAT EVEN IF THE MILK FLOW HAS INCREASED, PRODUCTION OF CONCENTRATED MILK HAS BEEN SLOW TO PICK UP.

**EXPORTS OF EVAPORATED CROP**

IN CONNECTION WITH VARIOUS INFLUENCES ON CANNED MILK MARKETS, ONE THING IS CERTAIN, EXPORT TRADE HAS NOT BEEN OFFERING MUCH SUPPORT. EXPORTS OF CONDENSED GOODS HAVE BEEN HOLDING AT AROUND 5,000,000 POUNDS FOR MANY MONTHS, THE BULK OF EXPORT TRADE BEING EVAPORATED, BUT DURING THE PAST TWO OR THREE

MONTHS EVAPORATED EXPORTS HAVE DROPPED OFF MATERIALLY. TOTAL EXPORTS DURING JANUARY AMOUNTED TO 10,652,000 POUNDS, OF WHICH 4,701,000 POUNDS WERE CONDENSED AND 5,951,000 POUNDS EVAPORATED. IN JANUARY 1924 TOTAL EXPORTS AMOUNTED TO 33,622,000 POUNDS. IN 1924 EXPORTS OF EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED AVERAGED ABOUT 2 TO 1.
