# CANNED WILK MARKETS FIRM-PRODUCTION LESS THAN LAST YEAR

CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS ARE REPORTED AS IN A FAIRLY FIRM POSITION. TRADE HAS BEEN GOOD, PARTLY AS A RESULT OF WARM WEATHER AND THE ATTENDING INCREASE IN ICE CREAM DEMAND, AND PRICES ARE WELL SUPPORTED. RECENT MODERATION OF TEMPERATURES HAS PROBA-BLY LESSENED DEMAND FROM THIS SOURCE BUT NO LESSENING OF MARKET CONFIDENCE HAS BEEN NOTED.

WE ARE NOW WELL ADVANCED IN THE SEASON OF HEAVIEST PRODUCTION AND IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE HOW THIS YEAR COMPARES WITH PREVIOUS YEARS. AVAILABLE PRODUCTION INFORMATION IS NOT ENTIRELY SATISFACTORY BUT MAY BE USED AS A GENERAL INDICATOR. MAY PRODUCTION APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN ABOUT 4% LESS THAN MAY 1924, A CONTINUATION OF THE SITUATION WHICH EXISTED IN APRIL. DUE TO A COMBINATION OF RATHER HEAVY MANUFACTURER'S STOCKS AND THE SLIGHTLY MORE FAVORABLE RELATIVE POSITION OF BUTTER

AND CHEESE MARKETS, THE PREVIOUSLY NOTED TENDENCY FOR SOME DIVERSION OF MILK TO BUTTER OR\_CHEESE MAKING IS STILL APPARENT. THE SAME WARM PERIOR THAT STIMULATED DEMAND EARLY IN JUNE ALSO CURTAILED MILK PRODUCTION AND WILL DOUBTLESS TEND TO DECREASE . CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK PRO-DUCTION DURING JUNE.

# · EXPORT TRADE OFFERS LITTLE SUPPORT

THE EXPORT SITUATION HAS BEEN OF LITTLE SUPPORT FOR SOME TIME AND MAY

EXPORTS DURING PROVED NO EXCEPTION. MAY WERE ONLY SLIGHTLY HEAVIER THAN IN APRIL AND SOMEWHAT MORE THAN IN MAY, 1924. SHIPMENTS TO GERMANY AGAIN INCREASED. THIS WAS ATTRIBUTED TO THE FACT THAT AN IMPORT DUTY HAS BEEN PLACED ON SHIPMENTS INTO GERMANY, EFFECTIVE JULY 1. EXPORTS TO ALL COUNTRIES DURING MAY TOTALED 14,250,909 POUNDS, BRINGING THE TOTAL THUS FAR THIS YEAR TO 39,290,498 POUNDS. IN MAY OF LAST YEAR EXPORTS AMOUNTED TO 13,918,902 POUNDS AND THE TOTAL FROM JANUARY TO MAY, INCLUSIVE, WAS 65,176,789 POUNDS.
