CANNED MILK MARKETS STEADY-STOCKS MODERATE

THE ADVANCEMENT OF THE SEASON NEARER TO THE FLUSH PRODUCTION PERIOD HAS NOT BROUGHT ANY OUTSTANDING CHANGES OR ANY NEW DEVELOPMENTS ON THE CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS. PRODUCTION HAS INCREASED, OF COURSE, AND AS LATE AS THE CLOSE OF APPIL HELD A MARGIN OF SOME 6 PER CENT OVER 1.925.

SINCE THEN IT IS THOUGHT THAT SEASONAL INCREASES MAY NOT HAVE BEEN AS GREAT AS LAST YEAR. THIS IS ATTRIBUTED TO THE GENERAL SITUATION REGARDING THE OUTPUT OF DAIRY PRODUCTS, WHICH INDICATE THAT PRODUCTION OF BUTTER AND CHEESE, WHILE INCREASING WITH THE SEASON, HAS NOT INCREASED AS RAPIDLY AS DURING MAY A YEAR AGO, WHICH CONDITION IS GENERALLY ASCRIBED TO A LATE SPRING AND SOME LACK OF RAIN-FALL. AT THE SAME TIME THE ENFORCEMENT OF LOCAL REGULATIONS REGARDING THE SALE OF FLUID MILK IN SOME CITIES HAS FORCED THE MILK DISTRIBUTORS

TO GO OUT INTO NEW AND WIDER TERFITORIES FOR SUPPLIES WHICH MAY HAVE LIMITED SOMEWHAT AMOUNTS AVAILABLE FOR THE CONDENSERIES.

THE MARKET POSITION AT THE CLOSE OF MAY CONTINUES STEADY. BUYING IS REPORTED AS ONLY MODERATELY ACTIVE, BUT PRICES HAVE IN MOST CASES HELD THEIR LEVEL. THE LACK OF SUFFICIENT WARM WEATHER TO STIMULATE ICE CREAM DEMANT, CONSERVATIVE BUYING FROM FOREIGN MARKETS, AND PRICES, WHICH, WHILE NOT OUT OF LINE, OFFER LITTLE INDUCEMENT FOR STOCKING FOR ADVANCE NEEDS, HAVE ALL COMBINED FOR A MONTH IN WHICH SELLING ACTIVITY, WHILE CONTINUING SATISFACTORILY STEADY, HAS NOT BEEN PROMINENT. CHANGES WHICH HAVE TAKEN PLACE IN THE MARKET

POSITION OF OTHER DAIRY PRODUCTS, EUCH AS A WORE FAVORABLE COMPARISON OF PRICE LEVELS WITH LAST YEAR, AND A MORE MODERATE RATE OF SEASONAL INCREASE IN PRODUCTION THAN OCCURRED A YEAR AGO, HAVE NOT HAD ANY PARTICULAR REFLECTION ON THE CANNED MILK MARKETS, AS THESE MARKETS HAVE FOR SOME TIME BEEN RATHER MORE FAVORABLY SITUATER THAN MARKETS FOR OTHER DAIRY PRODUCTS.

MANUFACTURERS! TOTAL STOCKS ON MAY 1, 1926 WERE REPORTED AS 128,268,139 POUNDS. THIS IS ONLY AN INCREASE OF SOMEWHAT MORE THAN 10,000,000 POUNDS

FROM APRIL AND 18 A MORE CONSERVATIVE INCREASE THAN THAT OF THE LAST THREE YEARS FROM APRIL TO MAY. INCIDENTALLY THE TOTAL STOCKS THIS MAY ARE LIGHTER THAN ON THE SAME PATE IN ANY YEAR SINCE 1920, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF 1921 AND 1923. EXPORTS DURING APRIL WERE LIGHT, BUT WERE ABOUT THE SAME AS FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR. SHIPMENTS TO FOREIGN COUNTRIES IN APRIL 1926 WERE 12,945,517 POUNDS, WHILE THOSE OF APRIL 1925 WERE 13,065,073 POUNDS. THE TOTAL EXPORTS, JANUARY TO APRIL, INC., THIS YEAR AMOUNT TO 42,817,750 LBS., COMPAPED WITH 42,651,418 LBS. FOR THE SAME PERIOD A YEAR AGO.
