DRY MILK MARKETS STEADY TO FIRM .

DRY MILK MARKETS HAVE HELD TO A FAIRLY STEADY COURSE AND NOW, AT THE CLOSE OF DECEMBER, THE SITUATION IS REGARDED AS STEADY TO FIRM. DEMAND IS CONSIDERED AS SHOWING SOME IMPROVEMENT SINCE NOVEMBER.

SUPPLIES OF DRY SKIM MILK CONTINUE HEAVY, FEING IN EXCESS OF A YEAR AGO BY NEARLY 90 PER CENT. This situation, however, is one that has been in existance for some months, althouthe surplus on December 1, was not as large as a month earlier, due to substantial decreases curing November. The production in the surplus is some confirmation of the felief that demand has been rather good.

PRODUCTION, OF DRY SKIM MILK, DURING NOVEMBER BEFMS TO HAVE BEEN LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME MONTH IN 1925, A CHARACTERISTIC OF PRACTICALLY ALL DAIRY PRODUCT MANUFACTURERS THIS FALL AND WINTER. CONSIDERABLE DECEFASE FROM OCTOBER IS ALSO INDICATED. SELLING PRICES HAVE BEEN REPOFFED AS SLIGHTLY LOWER IN NOVEMBER THAN IN OCTOBER, THE NOVEMBER AVERAGE BEING 9.81¢ AND THE OCTOBER PRICE 10.43¢.

THE SITUATION ON DRY BUTTERMILK IS A LITTLE DIFFERENT. STOCKS ARE MATERIALLY IN EXCESS OF A YEAR AGO, ALTHO SHOWING GOOD SIZED REPUGTIONS DURING NOVEMBER. PRODUCTION DURING NOVEMBER WAS INDICATED AS HEAVIER THAN A YEAR EARLIER BY SEVERAL HUNDRED THOUSANDS OF POUNDS. YET PRICES SHOWED AN ADVANCE INSTEAD OF A SLIGHT DECLINE AS NOTED ON DRY SKIM MILK. THE MARKET WAS CONSIDERED IN A MODERATE-LY STRONG POSITION AT THE CLOSE OF DECEMBER.

FOREIGN TRACE LIC NOT AMOUNT TO ANY GREAT QUANTITIES EUT WAS HEAVIER THAN IN OCTOBER OF IN NOVEMBER OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR. EXPORTS OF ERY MILK EURING NOVEMBER 1923, WERE 213,317 POUNES, WHILE A YEAR EARLIER THE AMOUNT WAS 375,640 POUNES. TOTAL EXPORTS FOR THE PERIOD OF JAN.-Nov., INc., WERE 2,399,927 POUNES, THIS YEAR, AND 3,312,593 POUNDS LAST YEAR. IMPORTS WERE HEAVIER, AMOUNTING TO 343,881 IN NOVEMBER 1923, AND 197,490 FOR NOVEMBER 1925. FOR THE PERIOD OF JAN.-Nov., INc., IMPORTS WERE 4,328,923 AND 4,867,058 FOR 1926 AND 1925 RESPECTIVELY.
