CONCENTRATED MILK MARKET REPORTS SLOW TRADE AT LOWER PRICES

STOCKS KEMAIN HEAVY

CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS DAIRY PRODUCTS. HAVE BEEN IN A RATHER EASY POSITION DUR-ING MARCH, ACCORDING TO LATE REPORTS
FROM MARKET CENTERS, AND TRADE HAS BEEN
QUITE SLOW. UNDER THESE CONDITIONS IT IS NOT SUPRISING THAT PRICES SHOULD SLIP TO SLIGHTLY LOWER LEVELS. EASTERN MARKETS REPORT GOOD SIZED SURPLUSES OF FLUID MILK AND THIS HAS HAD ITS EFFECT IN INCREASING THE PRODUCTION OF CONCEN-TRATED MILKS AND DETRACTING FROM THE STRENGTH OF THE MARKET. THE CONDITION OF THE MARKET IS IN CONSIDERABLE CON-TRAST TO THE BUTTER MARKET WHICH HAS BEEN RATHER FIRM SINCE THE FIRST OF THE

YEAR, BUT IS WELL IN LINE WITH OTHER.

TOTAL STOCKS OF CONDENSED AND EVAP-ORATED ON MARCH I, WERE 119,035,224 POUNDS, WHILE THESE STOCKS ARE RATHER HEAVY FOR THE SEASON, AND ARE CONSTDERABLY APOVE THE FIVE YEAR AVERAGE FOR MARCH!, THERE IS A MATERIAL REDUCTION FROM THE STOCKS OF FEBRUARY |. IN FACT THIS REDUCTION IS ONE OF THE LARGEST THAT HAS OCCURRED DUR-ING THIS PERIOD FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS DACK.

PRODUCTION, TOO, IS CONSIDERAFLY HEAVIER THAN A YEAR AGO. THE INCREASE FOR FEERWARY APPEARS TO BE ABOUT 11%.

THIS IS WELL IN LINF WITH THE OTHER DAIRY PRODUCTS, PRACTICALLY ALL OF WHICH ARE BEING PRODUCED THIS YEAR IN LARGER AMOUNTS THAN A YEAR AGO. SUCH INFORMATION AS IS AVAILABLE SERVES TO INDICATE THAT THIS RATE OF INCREASE CONTINUED TO BE SEEN THRUMOST OF MARCH.

FOREIGN TRADE CONTINUES RELATIVELY LIGHT. THE ONLY DEVELOPMENT OF INTEREST IN THIS CONNECTION IS THE MATERIALLY HEAVIER SHIPMENTS TO THE UNITED KINGDOM. THESE CONSISTED LARGELY OF EVAPORATED GOODS ANDWERE SUFFICIENT TO BRING THE TOTAL

EVAPORATED EXPORTS TO NEARLY DOUBLE THE VOLUME OF A YEAR AGO. EXPORTS OF CONDENSED AMOUNTED TO 2,645,400 POUNDS, AND EVAPORATED EQUALED 7,530,505 POUNDS, COMPARED WITH 2,853,406 AND 4,331,316 POUNDS IN FEBRUARY 1927. TOTAL SHIPMENTS SINCE THE FIRST OF THE YEAR ARE ALSO SOMEWHAT HEAVIER THAN FOR 1927.
