## CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS IRREGULAR

## PRODUCTION HEAVIER THAN LAST YEAR

THE CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS HAVE BEEN SOMEWHAT IRREGULAR DURING MAY. WHILE DEMAND IS REPORTED AS FAIRLY SATISFACTORY, JOBBERS ARE BUYING ON A HAND TO MOUTH BASIS, WITH THE SENERALLY COOL WEATHER TENDING TO LIMIT SALES. THE SITUATION WITH RESPECT TO PRICES HAS BEEN UNSETTLED DUE TO FURTHER EV'DENCES OF COMPETITIVE FORCES AT WORK. PRICES, GENERALLY, HAVE SHOWN SLIGHT REDUCTIONS, BUT IT IS WIDELY KNOWN THAT VARIOUS SELLING INDUCEMENTS HAVE BEEN CFFERED WHICH ARE NOT DIRECTLY REFLECTED II) PRICE QUOTATIONS. THIS HAS BEEN SEEN PARTICULARLY IN THE EAST, AND TO SOME EXTENT IN THE INTICLE WEST. TYPEVER, THE AS COMPARED (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)

SITUATION SEEMS TO BE ON A FAIRLY SUBSTANTIAL BASIS, WITH THE IRREGULARITY CAUSED BY THE COMPETITION BETWEEN THE INDEPENDENT AND THE NATIONALLY ORGANIZED MANUFACTURERS.

STOCKS IN THE HANDS OF MANUFACTURERS ON MAY I AMOUNTED TO 150,725,041 POUNDS. THIS AMOUNT IS ABOUT 16,000,000 POUNDS HEAVIER THAN A YEAR EARLIER, AND IS THE HEAVIEST PEGERVE STOCK REPORTED FOR MAY | SINCE 1920, WHEN THE EFFECTS OF THE WAR AND EUROPEAN RELIEF WAS STILL SEEN. THE INCREASE, HOWEVER, FROM APRIL I WAS ONLY ABOUT 23,000,000 POUNDS, AS COMPARED WITH AN AVERAGE INCREASE FOR

THE LAST FIVE YEARS, FOR APRIL, OF ABOUT 20,000,000 POUNDS. IN VIEW OF THE HEAVY PRODUCTION REPORTED FOR APRIL, THE INCREASE IN STOCKS MAY BE REGARDED AS MODERATE, AND AS INDICATING SATISFACTORY MOVEMENT INTO TRADE.

APRIL PRODUCTION WAS REPORTED AS . ABOUT 9% HEAVIER THAN A YEAR AGO, WITH NCREASES SHOWN ON ALL CLASSES OF GOODS, EXCEPT EVAPORATED BULK GOODS, WHICH REPRESENTS BUT A SMALL PERCENTAGE OF THE TUTAL REPORTED STOCKS. THE APRIL INCREASE WAS SUFFICIENT TO BRING THE TOTAL FOR THE YEAR TO DATE WEQUEL 29 ABOVE LAST YEAR.

THE INCREASE FALLS IN LINE WITH THE GENERAL INCREASE SEEN IN OTHER MANU-FACTURED DAIRY PRODUCTS, BUTTER, FOR EXAMPLE, SHOWING AN 8% INCREASE OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

EXPORTS OF EVAPORATED MILK IN APRIL WERE SOMEWHAT LESS THAN FOR LAST YEAR, WHILE CONDENSED EXCEEDED A YEAR THE COMBINED FIGURE WAS SLIGHTLY AGO. HEAVIER THIS YEAR, THAN LAST. FOR THE YEAR TO DATE TOTAL EXPORTS ARE ABOUT 2,000,000 POUNDS LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME PERIOD IN 1928, DUE TO A SUBSTANTIA! REDUCTION IN SHIPMENTS OF EVAPORATED MILE
