EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS STEADY TO FIRM - PRODUCTION LIGHTER THAN LAST YEAR

FVAPORATED MILK MARKETS, DURING REMAINED PRACTICALLY UNCHANGED FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH. THE TONE CONTINUED STEADY TO FIRM WITH DEALERS, GENERALLY, HOLDING GOODS CLOSELY TO ASKING PRICES.
ONLY IN ISOLATED INSTANCES WERE CONCESSIONS OBTAINABLE, AND THEN ONLY BECAUSE THE RESPECTIVE DEALER HAD HEAVY STOCKS IN HIS WAREHOUSE WHICH HE WAS ANXIOUS TO REDUCE BEFORE THE NEW SEASON WAS TOO FAR ADVANCED. DEMAND, ON THE WHOLE, WAS FAIR. BUYERS WERE INCLINED TO LIMIT PURCHASES MORE OR LESS TO ACTUAL REQUIREMENTS AND, AS A RE-SULT, STOCKS IN THE HANDS OF JOBBERS ARE SAID TO BE COMPARATIVELY LIGHT. FURTHER REDUCTIONS IN STOCKS, THE LIGHT SUPPLY IN THE HANDS OF JOBBERS, AND THE CONTINUED LIGHTER PRODUCTION IN COMPARISON WITH A YEAR AGO SHOULD BE FACTORS OF STRENGTH TO THE EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS.

PRODUCTION, DURING MARCH, WHILE 2.7 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME MONTH A (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)

YEAR AGO, WAS 24.2 PER CENT HEAVIER THE FOR FEBRUARY THIS INCREASE BEING LARGEI ACCOUNTED FOR BY THE DIFFERENCE IN THE LENGTH OF THE TWO MONTHS. LAST YEAR TH INCREASE IN PRODUCTION FROM FEBRUARY TO MARCH AMOUNTED TO 26.1 PER CENT. FOR MARCH AMOUNTED THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF THE CURRENT YEAR THE PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED MILK WAS 3.4 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME PERIOD LAST YEAR. THIS IS IN SAME PERIOD LAST YEAR. COMPARISON WITH A SIMILAR DECREASE OF 1.4 PER CENT IN THE MAKE OF BUTTER, ANI AN INCREASE OF 8.5 PER CENT IN THE PRODUCTION OF CHEESE. ACCORDING TO CURREI REPORTS FROM THE TRADE MUCH MILK WHICH HAD SEEN DIVERTED DURING THE LAST SEVERAL MONTHS FROM CONDENSERIES TO CHEESE AND BUTTER FACTORIES IS FINDING ITS WAY BACK IN THE REGULAR CHANNELS. THIS WILL NO DOUBT HAVE A TENDENCY TO BRING THE CURRENT PRODUCTION SITUATION CLOSER IN LINE WITH THAT OF LAST YEAR. STOCKS OF EVAPORATED MILK ON APRIL |

WERE APPROXIMATELY 4.0 PER CENT LIGHTER DEMAND WAS SOMEWHAT SLOW AND NOT SATI DEMAND WAS SOMEWHAT SLOW AND NOT SATI DEMAND WAS SOMEWHAT SLOW AND NOT SATI FACTORY. APRIL I STOCKS ONLY SHOWED AND OVER 76.0 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN THE FIVE-YEAR AVERAGE STOCKS. DURING MARCH HEAVIER THAN ON APRIL I A YEAR AGO AND THE REPUBLION AND ON APRIL I A YEAR AGO AND THE REPUBLION AND STOCKS AMOUNTED TO APPLIED. THE REDUCTION IN STOCKS AMOUNTED TO AROUND 6,500,000 POUNDS IN COMPARISON WITH 4,000,000 POUNDS A YEAR AGO, AND A FIVE-YEAR AVERAGE REDUCTION OF APPROXIMATELY 2,000,000 POUNDE.

CONDENSED MILK MARKETS SHOWED BUT LITTLE IMPROVEMENT DURING APRIL AND AT THE

DEMAND WAS SOMEWHAT SLOW AND NOT SATISH FACTORY. APRIL I STOCKS ONLY SHOWED A REDUCTION OF 3.0 PER CENT FROM THE MARCH HOLDINGS AND WERE STILL 148.0 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN ON APRIL 1 A YEAR AGO AND 84.0 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN THE FIVE-YEAR AMERICAN PROPERTY ON PURLING MARCH WAS 7.4 184.0 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN THE FIVE-YEAR AVERAGE. PRODUCTION DURING MARCH WAS 7.0 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME MONTH IN 1929 BUT WAS 11.0 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN FOR THE PREVIOUS MONTH. FOR THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF 1930 PRODUCTION WAAPPROXIMATELY 2.3 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN FOR THE SAME PERIOD IN 1929

APRIL 1930
