EVAPORATED, MILK MARKETS EASY AFTER PRICE DECLINE - TRADING IMPROVES.

EASY, ACCORDING TO THE U. S. BUREAU OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS, FOLLOWING A PRICE REDUCTION ON ADVERTISED BRANDS OF 20 CENTS PER CASE WHICH OCCURRED ON JULY 16. THE DECLINE CAME PRIMARILY BECAUSE THE SPREAD BETWEEN SELLING PRICES AND THE COST OF RAW MATERIAL HAD WIDENED, AND BECAUSE IT WAS FELT, ACCORDING TO SOME MANUFACTURERS, THAT A LOWER PRICE WOULD STIMULATE CONSUMPTION DEMAND TO THE EXTENT OF ELIMINATING SUCH ACCUMULATIONS OF STOCKS AS HAD OCCURRED. WHILE THE ABOVE PRICE REDUCTION WAS MORE OR LESS GENERAL, ALL MANUFACTURERS WERE NOT FULLY QUARTERS. CONSUMPTION DEMAND ALSO

IN ACCORD WITH IT, SOME FEELING THAT THE MARKET HAD SHOWN A STEADY IMPROVEMENT DURING THE MONTH, AND THAT, ACCORDINGLY, THERE WAS NO BASIC REASON FOR ANY PRICE REDUCTION AT THIS TIME. SINCE THE DECLINE, HOWEVER, TRADE SENTIMENT SEEMS TO CARRY DECIDEDLY MORE OPTIMISM THAN DURING ANY MONTH SINCE EARLY IN THE YEAR.

TRADING HAS IMPROVED DURING JULY. WHOLESALERS, ESPECIALLY, HAVE OPERATED RATHER FREELY AND KEPT MANY MANUFACTURERS FAIRLY WELL CLEARED OF STOCKS, ALTHOUGH FURTHER ACCUMULATIONS OCCURRED IN SOME

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APPEARED SOMEWHAT IMPROVED. PRODUCTION WAS CUT VERY SHARPLY AS A RESULT OF POOR PASTURAGE AND EXTREMELY HOT WEATHER AND NOW APPEARS TO BE WELL UNDER A YEAR AGO.

BACK IN FEBRUARY, EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCTION WAS OVER 19% HEAVIER THAN DURING THE SAME MONTH IN 1930. SINCE THEN SURPLUS PRODUCTION, THIS YEAR IN COMPARISON WITH CORRESPONDING MONTHS LAST YEAR, HAS DECREASED FROM MONTH TO MONTH UNTIL DURING JUNE THE MAKE WAS ACTUALLY NEARLY 5% LIGHTER THAN DURING JUNE, 1930. THIS PRODUCTION TREND LARGELY REFLECTS THE CONTINUED EFFORTS OF MANUFACTURERS TO CURTAIL PRODUCTION, ALTHOUGH MORE UNFAVORABLE PASTURE AND CLIMATIVE CONDITIONS DURING MAY AND JUNE THIS YEAR THAN LAST YEAR ALSO PLAYED AN IMPORTANT PART. DURING THE PERIOD JANUARY TO JUNE, INCLUSIVE, 1931 PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED MILK EXCEEDED THAT DURING THE SAME PERIOD IN 1930 BY ABOUT 5%.

STOCKS OF EVAPORATED MILK ON JULY! WERE 21% HEAVIER THAN ON EVEN DATE A YEAR AGO, REFLECTING A RATHER UNSATISFACTORY DEMAND UP TO THAT DATE, AND ALSO SHOWED A GAIN OF OVER 19% OVER JUNE! DURING JUNE, 1930, STOCKS ACCUMULATIONS AMOUNTED TO ONLY 14%, THIS DESPITE THE 6% HEAVIER PRODUCTION.

ALTHOUGH NOT PARTICULARLY ACTIVE, CONDENSED MILK MARKETS IMPROVED FURTHER DURING JULY. THE TONE WAS ABOUT STEADY, AND TRADING PROVED SOMEWHAT MORE ACTIVE AS A RESULT OF THE INCREASED DEMANDS FROM THE ICE CREAM TRADE. PRODUCTION DURING JUNE WAS 28% LIGHTER THAN DURING THE SAME MONTH IN 1930, AND ALSO SHOWED A DECREASE OF OVER 11% FROM MAY BOTH PERCENTAGES REFLECTING CONTINUED SENTIMENT AMONG MANUFACTURERS IN FAVOR OF A CURTAILED MAKE. CONDENSED MILK PRODUCTION FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY TO JUNE, INCLUSIVE, 1931 WAS 23% LIGHTER THAN DURING THE SAME BERIOD IN 1930. STOCKS, JULY 1, WERE 21% LIGHTER THAN JUNE 1 SUPPLIES.
