EVAPORATED ! ILK MARKETS STEADY TO FIRM - MAKE CONTINUES TO SHRINK

DECEMBER EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS. RULED STEADY TO FIRM FOLLOWING AN ADVANCE USUALLY LOW, FRACTIONAL ADVANCES WERE OF 35 CENTS PER CASE EARLY IN THE MONTH, ALSO REPORTED IN THESE DURING DECEMBER. ACCORDING TO THE U. S. BUREAU OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS. INASMUCH AS AN ADVANCE IN WHOLESALE PRICES HAD BEEN ANTICIPATED FOR SEVERAL MONTHS BUT HAD NOT MATERIALIZED, THE HIGHER QUOTATION CAME AS A SURPRISE TO MANY IN THE TRADE. AS A RESULT, AN UNSETTLED MARKET TREND DEVELOPED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING THE ADVANCE. LATER, HOWEVER, THE DECREASING PRODUCTION, AS WELL AS THE WELL MAINTAINED CONSUMPTION DEMAND MADE FOR AN INCREASING-LY STRONGER TONE IN NEARLY ALL MARKETS. AT THIS WRITING DEALERS VIEW THE EVAPO-RATED MILK MARKET SITUATION RATHER OPTIMISTICALLY.

WHILE RETAIL PRICES CONTINUE UN-IN THE EAST A COMMON RETAIL PRICE IS NOW THREE TALL CANS FOR 16 CENTS WITH THE PRICE PER INDIVIDUAL CAN RANGING FROM 5 TO 6 CENTS. THE AVERAGE PRICE PAID PRODUCERS IN THE UNITED STATES FOR 3.5 PER CENT MILK DELIVERED CONDENSERIES ALSO ADVANCED, FROM 86 CENTS PER CWT. IN NOVEMBER TO 92 CENTS IN DECEMBER, AND THE PRICE DIFFERENTIAL UNDER THE CORRE-SPONDING MONTH A YEAR AGO, WAS DECREASED FROM 37 CENTS PER CWT. IN NOVEMBER TO 27 CENTS IN DECEMBER. DESPITE THESE MORE FAVORABLE PRICES TO PRODUCERS OF MILK, THE MAKE OF EVAPORATED MILK HAS CONTINUED TO DECLINE AND, AT THIS TIME, IS SAID TO

TOTAL STOCKS INCLUDE ALL STOCKS HELD BY MANUFACTURERS REPORTING WHETHER THEIR OWN OR STOCKS OF OTHERS; WHETHER ON THEIR OWN PREMISES, IN STORAGE, OR IN TRANSIT (UNSOLD) FOR WAREHOUSE CONSIGNMENT; AND WHETHER SOLD OR CONTRACTED FOR AND NOT DELIVERED.

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BE BARELY EQUAL TO THAT OF LAST YEAR. CONDENSERY OPERATORS HAVE NOT BEEN AGGRESSIVE IN SECURING RAW MATERIAL, AND THE COLD WEATHER HAS ALSO REDUCED THE MILK FLOW IN SOME SECTIONS. SOME DIVERSIONS OF MILK FROM EVAPORATED MILK AND SOME OTHER DAIRY PRODUCTS TO CHEESE WERE ALSO NOTED IN WISCONSIN AND SOME OTHER MAJOR EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCING STATES.

EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCTION DURING . NOVEMBER, THE LATEST MONTH FOR WHICH DEFINITE COMPARATIVE FIGURES ARE AVAIL ABLE, WAS 4.7 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN DURING THE SAME MONTH IN 1931, BUT WAS 13.2 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN DURING THE PREVIOUS MONTH. THE MAKE IN COMPARISON WITH THE SAME MONTH A YEAR AGO WAS, THEREFORE, FURTHER DECREASED FROM 38.5 PER CENT HEAVIER IN AUGUST, TO 32.3 PER CENT HEAVIER IN SEPTEMBER, TO 4.9 PER CENT HEAVIER IN OCTOBER AND, FINALLY, TO BUT 4.7 PER CENT HEAVIER IN NOVEMBER. THE PROGRESSIVELY LIGHTER PRODUCTION DURING THE MONTHS MENTIONED ABOVE UNDER LAST YEAR WAS DUR TO SEVERAL CAUSES, BUT THE PRINCIPAL REASON WAS THE RATHER MARKED REDUCTION IN MILK DELIVERIES PER PRODUCER TO CONDENSERIES. THESE, IN AUGUST, AVERAGED 1.8 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN DURING THE SAME MONTH IN 1931, BUT IN NOVEMBER PROVED 5.5 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN DURING THE CORRESPONDING MONTH A YEAR EARLIER. THE LIGHTER MILK FLOW REFLECTED BY THESE FIGURES WAS DUE PRIMARILY TO LESS FAVORABLE FALL PASTURES IN THE MAJOR EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCING

AREAS, BUT THE LIGHTER FEEDING OF CONCENTRATES AND MORE UNFAVORABLE CLIMATIC CONDITIONS ALSO PLAYED A PART.

THE WOVEMENT, OF EVAPORATED MILK INTO TRADE CHANNELS DURING NOVEMBER WAS APPARENTLY DECIDEDLY BETTER THAN EARLIER ANTICIPATED AS STATISTICS SHOW THAT DESPITE THE 4.7 PER CENT HEAVIER PRODUCTION IN NOVEMBER THIS YEAR OVER LAST YEAR, THE STOCKS EXCESS OVER THE SAME DATE A YEAR AGO WAS DECREASED FROM 12.2 PER CENT ON NOVEMBER 1 TO 0.2 PER CENT ON DECEMBER 1. THE NOVEMBER REDUCTION IN STOCKS, HOWEVER, WAS SOMEWHAT LIGHTER THAN THE 5-YEAR AVERAGE, DECEMBER 1 SUPPLIES BEING BUT 23.1 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN AVERAGE WHILE ON NOVEMBER 1 THIS DEFICIT AMOUNTED TO 24.6 PER CENT.

CONDENSED MILK MARKETS IN DECEMBER CONTINUED ABOUT STEADY WITH THE GENERAL SITUATION SHOWING NO NEW DEVELOPMENTS. THE MOVEMENT'INTO CONSUMPTION WAS RATHER SLOW FOR THIS SEASON OF THE YEAR. PRODUCTION IN NOVEMBER WAS 34.6 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN DURING THE SAME MONTH A YEAR AGO, AND ALSO SHOWED A SEASONAL DECREASE OF 24 PER CENT FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH. THE STOCKS SITUATION REMAINED GENERALLY UNCHANGED WITH DECEMBER I SUPPLIES 8.1 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN ON THE SAME DATE A YEAR AGO, AND 42.4 PER CENT LIGHTER THAN 5-YEAR AVERAGE STOCKS.
