EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS FIRM AT LOWER PRICES

THE WN BRANDS OF EVAPORATED MILK LATE LAST MONTH, AND WHICH WAS FOLLOWED BY PRICE REDUCTIONS ON PRAC-TICALLY ALL BRANDS, EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS HAVE BEEN FIRM, ACCORDING TO REPORTS WHICH HAVE COME TO THE U. S. BUREAU OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS. THE REDUCTIONS WHICH WERE FIRST ANNOUNCED, AMOUNTING TO 50 CENTS PER CASE, BROUGHT ABOUT A GENERAL LOWERING OF PRICES, ALTHOUGH THE EXTENT OF THE CUTS VARIED WITH DIFFERENT MANUFACTUR-INFOR' ATION IS NOT YET AVAILABLE RE-GARDING AVERAGE WHOLESALE PRICES THIS MONTH (MARCH), BUT THE FEBRUARY AVERAGE WAS SOMEWHAT LOWER THAN JANUARY, DESPITE THE FACT THAT THE ABOVE MENTIONED PRICE

SINCE THE PRICE CUT WHICH WAS MADE ON | CHANGES DID NOT OCCUR UNTIL QUITE LITE IN THE REDUCTION WILL BE REVEALED BY THE MARCH AVERAGE WHICH WILL BE PUBLISHED NEXT month. In the meantime, wholesale prices on evaporated are reported as low as \$1.90-1.95 per case in some sections of the country, with about \$2.10 appar-ENTLY THE GOING PRICE FOR THE BULK OF SALES.

> THIS RECENT LOWERING OF WHOLESALE PRICES, WITH ITS PROBABLE EFFECT ON PRODUCER'S PRICES, WAS THE CAUSE OF MUCH DISCUSSION, AND LED TO ACTION ON THE PART OF STATE AUTHORITIES IN WISCONSIN WHERE THERE HAD ALREADY BEEN A MILK STRIKE.

IN THE EAST NORTH CENTRAL SECTION OF THE COUNTRY WHERE MOST OF THE CONDENSERIES ARE LOCATED.

THERE WAS A 5 PER CENT RET PER CENT. THERE WAS A D PER CENT REDUCTION OF STOCKS DURING FEBRUARY, COMPARED WITH AN 8 PER CENT REDUCTION LAST YEAR. IN JANUARY, HOWEVER, THERE HAD BEEN A 7 PER CENT INCREASE THIS YEAR, WHEREAS IN JANUARY, 1932, THE CHANGE IN STOCKS WAS A 3 PER CENT REDUCTION. EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCTION CONTINUES TO HOLD RATED MILK PRODUCTION CONTINUES TO HOLD UP, AND IN FEBRUARY, WAS 4 PER CENT HEAVIER THAN IN FEBRUARY, 1932. LITTLE CHANGE IS REPORTED ON CONDEN-SED MILK. TRADING IS SAID TO BE SLOW, AND PRICES ARE ABOUT THE SAME AS A MONTH AND PRICES ARE ABOUT THE SAME AS A MONTH AGO. STOCKS OF CONDENSED CASE, AMOUNT-ING TO 7,300,000 POUNDS ON MARCH I, BORE ABOUT THE SAME TELATION TO A YEAR EARLIER AS THEY DID ON FEBRUARY I. THE FEBRUARY REDUCTION OF STOCKS WAS ALSO ABOUT THE SAME AS IN FEBRUARY OF LAST YEAR. FEBRUARY PRODUCTION OF BOTH CASE AND BULK GOODS WAS ABOUT 26 PER CENT BELOW THAT OF FEBRUARY, 1932.
