STEADY TONE IN EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS

REGARDLESS OF SOME CHANGES IN THE STATISTICAL POSITION AFFECTING CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK, THE TONE OF MARKETS .
ON THESE PRODUCTS IS LITTLE DIFFERENT
FROM A MONTH AGO. REPORTS TO THE U.S.
BUREAU OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS INDICATE THAT SCHOOL IS F IA TO GOOD, THAT SHEPLIES HAVE BEEN AMPLE TO MAKE PROMPT DELIVERIES, AND THAT A GENERALLY STEADY MARKET HAS PREVAILED THIS MONTH.

THE MARKETING AGREEMENT COVERING , EVAPORATED MILK HAS BEEN SIGNED AND IN

EFFECT SINCE SEPTEMBER 9. THE PRICE RANGE NAMED ORIGINALLY IN THE AGREEMENT WAS \$2.45 TO \$2.60 PER CASE, BUT THIS WAS LATER MODIFIED WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN AREAS, IN WHICH AN INCREASE OF 15 CENTS PER CASE OVER THESE PRICES IS AUTHORIZED. THE PARTICULAR SECTIONS TO WHICH THIS INCREASE APPLIES ARE THE NEW ENGLAND STATES, NEW YORK, NEW JERSEY, DELAWARE, MARYLAND AND THE EASTERN HALF OF PENNSYLVANIA. REPORTS COVERING AUGUST SALES SHOW THAT THERE WAS NO CHANGE LAST

MONTH IN PRICES OF EITHER EVAPORATED OR CONDENSED FROM THOSE REPORTED FOR JULY, WITH AN AVERAGE FOR ALL SECTIONS OF \$2.54 PER CASE FOR THE FORMER, AND \$4.94 FOR THE LATTER. THESE PRICES ARE 42 CENTS AND 19 CENTS RESPECTIVELY, ABOVE THE AUGUST 1932 AVERAGES. AUGUST PRICES OF BULK CONDENSED WERE SLIGHTLY HIGHER THAN IN JULY.

PRICES TO PRODUCERS FOR SEPTEMBER MILK AVERAGE SLIGHTLY LESS THAN AUGUST, BEING \$1.07 PER CWT. COMPARED WITH \$1.10 LAST MONTH. EXCEPT FOR THE EAST NORTH CENTRAL SECTION WHICH INCLUDES OHIO, INDIANA, ILLINOIS, MICHIGAN AND WIGCONSIN, ALL SECTIONS SHOW CHANGES. THE LARGEST REDUCTIONS WERE IN THE FAR WESTERN STATES, AND RANGED FROM 7 TO 9 CENTS PER CWT.

STOCKS OF EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK HAVE INCREASED EACH MONTH SINCE MAY, WHEN THEY WERE AT RECORD LOW LEVELS. ON THAT DATE, STOCKS OF EVAPORATED CASE WERE REPORTED AT 36,975,000 POUNDS, A DEGREASE UNDER A YEAR EARLIER OF OVER 63 PER CENT. UP TO AND INCLUDING SEPTEMBER 1, THE INCREASE HAS BEEN STEADY. USUALLY THE PEAK OF STOCKS IS REACHED ON AUGUST 1, BUT IN VIEW OF THE CURRENT SEASON'S LOW INVENTORIES JUST REFERPED TO, AND ALSO OF STOCKS WHICH ARE CONSIDERABLY BELOW AVERAGE, AS WELL AS THE FACT THAT THERE

HAS BEEN A REMARKABLE MOVEMENT OF EVAPORATED MILK INTO CONSUMPTION THIS YEAR, THERE IS NO APPARENT WORRY OVER THE STOCKS SITUATION. SUPPLIES OF EVAPORATED CASE GOODS IN MANUFACTURERS! HANDS ON SEPTEMBER I TOTALED 177,536,000 POUNDS, AN INCREASE OF 34 PER CENT OVER AUGUST I, ALTHOUGH A DECREASE OF 7 PER CENT UNDER LAST YEAR. CONDENSED CASE STOCKS ON SEPTEMBER I OF 16,428,000 POUNDS WERE 20 PER CENT UNDER A YEAR AGO, AND ABOUT 3 PER CENT BELOW AUGUST I.

PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED CASE CONTINUES TO BHOW INCREASES, AUGUST BEING II PER CENT OVER AUGUST 1932, WHEN TOTAL PRODUCTION WAS 134,797,000 POUNDS, THE PREVIOUS HIGH RECORD FOR THAT MONTH. THE NEXT NEAREST APPROACH TO THIS RECORD WAS IN AUGUST 1929, WHEN PRODUCTION WAS 123,255,000 POUNDS. CONDENSED CASE PRODUCTION CONTINUES LOW, ONLY SLIGHTLY OVER 4 MILLION POUNDS IN AUGUST, AND A DECREASE OF APPROXIMATELY I! PER CENT BELOW LAST YEAR. CONDENSED BULK WAS ABOUT I PER CENT LESS THAN LAST YEAR IN AUGUST. FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR TO SEPTEMBER I, EVAPORATED CASE PRODUCTION IS ESTIMATED TO HAVE EXCEEDED THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD OF 1932 BY 14 PER CENT, AND CONDENSED TO HAVE DECLINED 19 PER CENT FIGURES ON PRODUCTION SINCE SEPTEMBER ARE NOT AVAILABLE, BUT IT IS REPORTED THAT CONSIDERABLE SURPLUS MILK IN CERTAIN FLUID MILK AREAS IS BEING EVAPORATED.
