#### INCREASED TRADE OUTPUT OF EVAPORATED MILK IN JANUARY

REPORTS COVERING EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS INDICATE THAT THE STEADY TO FIRM TONE OF A MONTH AGO STILL PREVAILS. THERE ARE OCCASIONAL UNVERIFIED REPORTS OF SALES AT PRICES LOWER THAN THOSE SET UP IN THE EVAPORATED MILK MARKETING AGREEMENT, BUT SUCH OF THIS AS MAY HAVE OCCURRED HAS NOT BEEN OF ANY GREAT INFLUENCE ON THE GENERAL MARKET. TRADERS

ON THE WHOLE WARE OBSERVING THE AGREEMENT PRICES, WITH THE RESULT THAT AVERAGE SELL-ING PRICES ARE UNCHANGED FROM THOSE OF THE PAST SEVERAL MONTHS. TRADING HAS NOT BEEN PARTICULARLY ACTIVE, AND ALTHOUGH SOME OPERATORS REFER TO CURRENT BUYING AS MORE OR LESS SPOTTED, TRADE OUTPUT IS SAID TO BE FAIR.

MANUFACTURERS STOCKS OF EVAPORATED CASE, AS REPORTED TO THE BUREAU OF AGRICULTURAL ECONOMICS, SHOW A GOOD SIZED DECREASE DURING JANUARY, TOTAL STOCKS ON FEBRUARY | BEING 167,000,000 POUNDS, COMPARED WITH 210,400,000 POUNDS ON JANUARY | THIS IS A REDUCTION OF OVER 43,000,000 POUNDS DURING THE MONTH.

THE DECEMBER REDUCTION WAS ONLY 15,000,000 POUNDS. COMPARED WITH LAST YEAR, FEBRUARY | STOCKS WERE ONLY 60,000,000 POUNDS HEAVIER, WHILE ON JANUARY |, STOCKS WERE 108,000,000 POUNDS IN EXCESS OF A YEAR EARLIER. INFORMATION REGARDING TOTAL TRADE OUTPUT FOR JANUARY IS NOT YET AVAILABLE, BECAUSE EXPORT AND IMPORT DATA FOR THAT MONTH HAVE NOT BEEN RELEASED, BUT THE JANUARY FIGURES WILL PROBABLY SHOW A MOVEMENT INTO TRADE CHANNELS OF AROUND 140 MILLION POUNDS. IN 1933, THE JANUARY TRADE OUTPUT OF EVAPORATED CASE WAS APPROXIMATELY 107 MILLION POUNDS. SUCH AN INCREASE WILL CHANGE THE PICTURE CONSIDERABLY FROM THAT OF PRECEDING MONTHS, FOR SINCE LAST JULY TRADE OUTPUT HAS BEEN RUNNING LESS EACH MONTH THAN DURING CORRESPONDING MONTHS OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR, SO MUCH SO IN FACT, THAT FOR THE FULL CALENDAR YEAR, 1933 TRADE OUTPUT FELL SLIGHTLY BELOW THAT OF 1932, REGARDLESS OF ALMOST A 28 PER CENT INCREASE DURING THE FIRST SIX MONTHS. THE QUARTERLY REPORT OF WHOLE—SALE GROCERS! STOCKS IN 38 SELECTED CITIES, AS OF DECEMBER 31, 1933, INDICATES THAT THESE STOCKS WERE ABOUT 20 PER CENT LESS THAN AT THE CLOSE OF

1932, and almost 60 per cent less than at the close of the previous quarter on September 30, 1933.

PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED CASE IN
JANUARY OF APPROXIMATELY 99 MILLION
POUNDS WAS 15.6 PER CENT BELOW JANUARY
1933, AND THIS DROP IN FACTORY OUTPUT
CAUSED RESERVE STOCKS TO BE DRAWN UPON
HEAVILY, AS JUST POINTED OUT. THE
JANUARY DROP IN PRODUCTION WAS IN LINE
WITH CHANGES IN THE SAME DIRECTION FOR
OTHER DAIRY PRODUCTS. OFFICIAL ESTIMATES
FOR JANUARY HAVE NOT YET BEEN MADE, BUT
CURRENT WEEKLY TRADE REPORTS HAVE
INDICATED THAT THERE WAS A RATHER HEAVY
DECREASE IN BUTTER PRODUCTION DURING
JANUARY. REPORTS COVERING SEVERAL
FLUID MILK AREAS SHOW REDUCTIONS IN
AVERAGE DAILY DELIVERIES PER PRODUCER
IN JANUARY, AND WAREHOUSE RECEIPTS OF
CHEESE IN WISCONSIN POINT TO A
CONTINUED FALLING OFF IN CHEESE
PRODUCTION.

PRODUCTION OF CONDENSED CASE
IN JANUARY WAS APPROXIMATELY 3 PER CENT
BELOW JANUARY 1933. TOTAL JANUARY
PRODUCTION WAS APPROXIMATELY 4,800,000
POUNDS. MANUFACTURERS STOCKS ON
FEBRUARY I TOTALED 3,394,000 POUNDS,
A REDUCTION OF 32.0 PER CENT BELOW
LAST YEAR. THE JANUARY REDUCTION
WAS 2,700,000 POUNDS.

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## STOCKS OF CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK IN THE HANDS OF WHOLESALE GROCERS IN 38 CITIES

Of the original 1,106 firms addressed when this report was inaugurated, 275 do not carry stocks and 198 are known to be out of business. No replies have ever been received from an additional 210 firms. The information for December 31 which is shown below is based upon reports of 293 firms.
