EVAPORATED MILK STEADY - MARKETING AGREEMENT TERMINATED

EVAPORATED MILK MARKETS ARE WITHOUT ANY UNUSUAL FEATURES IN MAY. SEASONAL
CHANGES ARE OCCURRING, THE SHORTAGE OF
STOCKS IS LESS MARKED THAN A MONTH AGO,
TRADE OUTPUT HAS APPARENTLY INCREASED
SOME, AND ON THE WHOLE THE NEW PRODUCTION
SEASON IS BEING ENTERED WITH A STEADY
MARKET ON THIS CLASS OF GOODS. IN THE
FIELD OF CONTROL, IT IS OF INTEREST TO
MOTE THAT THE EVAPORATED MILK MARKETING
AGREEMENT HAS BEEN TERMINATED EFFECTIVE
MAY 31, THIS ACTION HAVING BEEN TAKEN BY
THE AGRICULTUPAL ADJUSTMENT ADMINISTRAT1011 BECAUSE OF FAILURE OF SOME MANUFACTURERS TO SIGN A PROPOSED AMENDED AGREE-

MENT EXCEPT AFTER ADDING CERTAIN CLAUSES WHICH MODIFIED THE AGREEMENT FROM WHAT HAD BEEN TENTATIVELY APPROVED BY THE SCCRETARY OF AGRICULTURE. SEVERAL EXTENSIONS HAD PREVIOUSLY BEEN GRANTED PENDING PROPER ENDORSEMENT OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS. IT IS REPORTED THAT CONSIDERATION IS TO BE GIVEN TO A NEW AGREEMENT BY MANUFACTURERS.

PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED MILK IN APRIL IS ESTIMATED AT 181,000,000 POUNDS, A NEW HIGH RECORD FOR THE MONTH. THIS IS A 5,000,000 POUND INCREASE OVER APRIL 1933, THE PREVIOUS APRIL HIGH. SOME

IDEA OF THE INCREASED PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED MILK DURING RECENT YEARS IS GAINED BY COMPARING THE AVERAGE APRIL PACK DURING THE LAST FIVE YEARS WITH THAT OF THE AVERAGE PACK TEN YEARS AGO. THE INCREASE IS OVER 50 PERCENT. THE CURRENT YEARS APRIL PRODUCTION WAS 21 PERCENT GREATER THAN IN 1934, AND THERE WAS AN INCREASE DURING JANUARY TO APRIL, INCLUSIVE OF 88,500,000 POUNDS, OR 18.6 PERCENT, OVER THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD OF LAST YEAR.

CONDENSED MILK (CASE GOODS) PRODUCTION IN APRIL OF APPROXIMATELY 62 MILLION POUNDS WAS 6.4 PERCENT GREATER THAN A YEAR EARLIER, BUT IN CONTRAST TO THE EVAPORATED MILK INCREASE DURING THE PAST TEN YEARS IS A DECREASE OF AROUND 90 PERCENT IN THE AVERAGE APRIL PRODUCTION OF CONDENSED. TEN YEARS AGO THE AVERAGE FOR APRIL APPROXIMATED 20 MILLION POUNDS, AND 15 YEARS AGO IT WAS DOUBLE THAT AMOUNT.

STOCKS OF EVAPORATED MILK IN MANU-FACTURERS! HANDS ARE STILL RELATIVELY LOW, AMOUNTING ON MAY I TO 74,000,000 POUNDS. ON MAY I, 1934 STOCKS WERE REPORTED AS 116,000,000 POUNDS. THIS REPRESENTS A REDUCTION UNDER A YEAR AGO OF 42 MILLION POUNDS, OR 37 PERCENT. ON APRIL | THE PREVIOUS YEAR COMPARISON SHOWED A REDUCTION OF 59 MILLION POUNDS, OR 60 PERCENT. THUS, THE SHORTAGE HAS BEEN CUT DOWN, DESPITE WHAT APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN A FAIRLY GOOD SIZED INCREASE IN TRADE OUTPUT. INCREASED PRODUCTION ACCOUNTS FOR THIS. STOCKS OF CONDENSED CASE ON MAY I WERE APPROXIMATELY 52 MILLION POUNDS, A DECREASE OF 6 PERCENT UNDER LAST YEAR.

THE QUARTERLY SURVEY OF STOCKS OF CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK HELD BY WHOLESALE GROCERS SHOWS THAT THE SITU-ATION AT THE CLOSE OF THE QUARTER WHICH ENDED MARCH 31 BORE ABOUT THE USUAL RELATIONSHIP TO THE FIRST OF THE YEAR.

PRICES PAID FOR MILK BY CONDENSERIES DURING APRIL AVERAGE \$1.46 PER CWT. (3.5 PERCENT MILK), A SLIGHT INCREASE ONLY OVER MARCH, BUT 44 CENTS HIGHER THAN IN APRIL 1934. THE LATTER CHANGE REFLECTS THE DIFFERENCE IN BUTTER PRICES THIS YEAR AND LAST. WHOLESALE SELLING PRICES OF BOTH CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK WERE ABOUT THE SAME IN APRIL AS IN MARCH, AND EXCEPT ON CONDENSED CASE WERE ABOUT 10 PERCENT HIGHER THAN IN APRIL 1934. CONDENSED CASE PRICES IN APRIL AVERAGED SLIGHTLY LESS THAN LAST YEAR.
