## EVAPORATED MILK PRODUCTION AND STOCKS LIGHTER

Stocks of eyaporated milk in manufacturers' hands on March 1, reported at 45,368,000 pounds, were almost double those of last year on the same date, but, with the exception of last year, this was the lowest March 1 inventory of record. The significant comparison, therefore, is not with last year, but with average conditions. This stocks situation is contributing strength to the evaporated milk market, which continues to be very firm. The reduction of stocks during February further evidences the relatively strong market position, for regardless of the light amounts held by

manufacturers, the February production of stocks was 20,700,000 pounds, compared with an average February reduction the past five years of 24,700,000 pounds. This average figure includes the very heavy movement in February, 1934, at the time manufacturers' holdings were so heavy.

A further element of support is found in the production situation. Estimated production of evaporated case in February of 112,700,000 pounds was a 6.4 percent reduction under last year, and was also a reduction under January. The latter decrease is only 2.7 percent, but

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the average change in February, from 1931-1935 inclusive, was a 1.1 percent increase. Combined production in January and February was 2.9 percent less than in the same months of 1935. One condition which may have held back production in February this year was the exceptionally severe weather. Average daily deliveries per producer in February were 10.3 percent below February 1935, whereas in January the relationship to a year earlier was a 1.5 percent increase.

The last report on prices paid producers shows an average of \$1.63 per cwt. for February milk, compared with \$1.58 in January, and \$1.57 in February, 1935. In connection with prices, it may be of interest to note that prices of Class I fluid milk to producers supplying Chicago, which had been 50 cents per cwt. over the condensery price in that area, were changed to 30 cents over beginning March 1. Selling prices of evaporated case have been well maintained this month. These prices in February averaged \$2.93 per case, the same as in January, but 10 cents higher than in February 1935.
