EVAPORATED MILK STEADY - APRIL PACK HEAVIEST ON RECORD FOR MONTH

Evaporated milk markets are full steady this month. Production in April showed a slightly heavier-than-usual seasonal increase, but stocks in manufacturers' hands continue relatively light under an active movement. Wholesale selling prices of better known brands remain unchanged and well sustained.

Total estimated production of evaporated case goods in April of 181,552,000 pounds was an increase of 1.2 percent over April 1935, and represents the largest April production of

record. For the calendar year to May 1, total estimated production of this class of goods amounting to 556,779,000 pounds was substantially the same as during the corresponding period of 1935. This year's increase in April production over March was 24.3 percent, compared with March to April increase during the previous five years of but 19.3 percent. The pack in April of this year was the largest of record for that month.

Manufacturers' stocks on May 1, according

Bureau of Agricultural Economics, were 61,775,000 pounds. This represented a decrease of 16.6 percent under May 1 of last year, and was considerably below the 1931-35 average for that date, of 104,735,000 pounds. Manufacturers stocks increased 19,200,000 pounds during the month of April, compared with an average increase during the above mentioned five year period of 16,300,000 pounds. The 1936 increase loses much of its signifance when this years relatively light total stocks are taken into consideration. In April 1935, the increase in stocks was 24,200,000 pounds. It is of interest in this connection to note that according to the last quarterly survey of stocks in hands of a sample group of wholesale grocers, that class of distributors were holding 20 percent less evaporated milk on March 31 this year than last, and 35 percent less than at the close of the provious quarter on December 31, 1935.

to reports received from manufacturers by the | Prices paid for milk by condenseries in April were slightly less than in March, and in April of last year. Minimum prices to be paid for such milk are defined in the evaporated milk marketing agreement, but this price, which is based on butter and cheese prices, has been exceeded in many cases. Wholesale selling prices of evaporated case are reported generally unchanged this month, as compared with April.

Estimated production of condensed case goods in April was 4,830,000 pounds, a decrease of about 25 percent under last year. Stocks on May 1, as reported by manufacturers, amounted to but 3,741,000 pounds, a decrease of 32.6 percent under a year earlier. Each preceding month during the current year, stocks of condensed case have been at new record lows for the period, and this is also true of May 1.

Of the original 1,106 firms addressed when this report was inaugurated, 276 do not carry stocks and 220 are known to be out of eusiness. No replies have ever been received from an additional 210 firms. The information for March 31 which is shown below is based upon reports of 278 firms.
