RECORD SEPTEMBER PACK OF EVAPORATED MILK - MARKET REMAINS FIRM

The strong demand for evaporated milk this fall is reflected in the production trend since mid-summer. September production not only reached an all time record for that month, but was an increase over August, reversing the usual seasonal trend, which had always been a decrease. Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated milk on October 1 were heavier than a month earlier, but were so far below usual inventories on that date, that this particular situation lent con-

siderable support to the market. Selling prices are generally unchanged this month.

Sales of evaporated milk by manufacturers have been heavy throughout this season. Data for September are not yet available, but for the first eight months of the year, the increase in 1936 trade output over the corresponding period of 1935, was 18.0 percent. The increase above amounted to more than 200,000,000 pounds. Not

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all of the past few months' sales have as yet moved into actual consumption, for preliminary tabulations of stocks in hands of wholesale grocers on September 30 reveal that this class of distributors was carrying more than double the stocks of a year earlier, but active buying and the firm asking prices of manufacturers are definite indications of the healthy tone of the market.

Manufacturers' stocks on October 1 are reported as 160,578,000 pounds, compared with 343,132,000 pounds on October 1 of last year, and a 1931-35 average for that date of 207,872,000 pounds. Except for 1931, this year's October 1 stocks were the lowest for that date since 1926. In 1931, the quantities on hand October 1 wars only 136,000,000 pounds, but it is to be noted that in 1931, production of evaporated wilk was lower than in either of the two preceding years, and trade movement was sluggish, particularly during the latter part of the year.

September production of evaporated case goods, estimated at approximately 186,000,000

pounds, was a 38.0 percent increase over September 1935, and was 39,000,000 pounds heavi than the previous September high, which occurre in 1934. The seasonal change from August to September this year was an increase of 1.5 per cent. In 1935, the comparison was a 16.0 percent decrease, and during the past five years the average August-September change was a 15.5 per cent decrease. Production this year was apparently stimulated by the strong market tone and the relatively light supplies of this class of goods.

Average wholesale selling prices of evaporated case in September of \$3.19 per case represented no material change from August, although prices in some areas averaged slightly higher, due principally to different manufacturers selling in these areas. The above average price for September was 60 cents per case above the September 1935 average. Prices to producers supplying condenseries averaged the same as in August, \$1.74 per cwt. for 3.5 percent milk, but were 52 cents per cwt. above August 1935.
