RECORD PRODUCTION OF EVAPORATED MILK IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY

Production of evaporated milk in February was the largest of record for that month, according to reports received from manufacturers by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. The estimated pack of 127,627,000 pounds was an increase of 2.8 percent over that of February 1937, when the previous high record for the month had occurred. Average February production during the past five years was only 113,300,000 pounds. It is significant to note that 1933 has started off with new high monthly records of production having been established in both January and February. The combined pack during the two months, amounting to 251,726,000 pounds, represents a 4 percent increase over the first two months of 1937, the increase in terms of volume being 10 million pounds. It is of further interest to note that while February was a short month, production was 2.7 greater than in January, compared with an average change in the

other direction of approximately 1 percent during the past five years.

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated milk on March 1 amounted to 132,660,000 pounds. While this figure is sone 44 million pounds less than the stocks reported for the corresponding date in 1937, it is about 40 million pounds above the 1933-37 average for March 1. In two of the past five years, however, March 1 stocks were unusually low, being only 29 million pounds on March 1, 1935, and 45 million pounds a year later. Current year stocks were reduced only 24 million pounds during February, compared with a February reduction of 32 million pounds in 1937. The January reduction was also light compared with a year earlier. These lighter reductions this year are accounted for in part by the heavier pack since January 1, and reduced trade output The amount of evaporated milk which cleared through manufacturers' hands during February was approximately 5 million pounds less than a year earlier, trade output for the month totaling only 149 million pounds. For the first two months of the year, trade output was approximately 24 million pounds, or 7.5 percent less than the corresponding period of 1937.

Wholesale selling prices of evaporated nilk averaged the same in February as the previous month. Prices were reduced slightly during the month on certain brands in the Pacific Coast and Mountain States territory, but this change was not general. March opened with the tone of the market more or less unsettled, and this finally lead to a general reduction of 10¢ per case about March 19. Relatively heavy supplies and continued difficulty in moving goods at prevailing prices were conditions which contributed to the unsettled feeling.
