# EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT (SEPTEMBER 1938)

# MANUFACTURERS STOCKS OF EVAPORATED MILK REACH ANOTHER NEW ALL TIME HIGH RECORD. PRODUCTION STILL HEAVY.

Continued heavy production of evaporated milk in August and a further substantial increase in stocks are reported by the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. Reports from manufacturers of evaporated milk show that on September 1 their total stocks were the largest ever reported for any date in the history of the industry. Although production of evaporated milk in August reflected the seasonal decline in milk production, which started in July, it still was next to the highest output ever recorded for any August.

Stocks of evaporated milk, case goods, reported by manufacturers on September 1 amounted to 419,142,000 pounds compared with 263,324,000 on the same date last year and 213,905,000 pounds for the 5-year (1933-37) September 1 average. On a percentage basis, this year's stocks were 58 percent larger than those of September 1 last year and 96 percent larger than the September 1 average for the years of 1933-37 During August this year stocks held by manufacturers increased around 26 million pounds. This increase was smaller than the August increase of 36 million pounds last year, but was more than double the average increase for August of 12 million pounds for the 5 years of 1933-37.

Stocks of condensed milk, case goods, on September 1 totaled 9,932,000 pounds, which were approximately 7 percent less than the stocks reported on the same date last year and 33 percent below the 1933-37 September 1 average. Stocks of condensed milk declined about 3 percent during August compared with a decline of 5 percent a year earlier and 1 percent for the 5-year (1933-37) average.

Production of evaporated milk, case goods, in August is estimated at about 180 million pounds, an August production that has been exceeded only in one other year - 1936 - in the twenty years for which records are available. The current August production was about 16 percent larger than that of August last year and 12 percent larger than the average for the 5 years of 1932-36. Production of evaporated milk, case goods, for the first 8 months of 1938 is estimated at 1,563,500,000 pounds, an increase of about 153 million pounds, or 11 percent, over the production of the corresponding eight months last year. It is also the largest production for the months of January to August, inclusive, ever reported.

Wholesale markets continue to show the influence of the heavy output of evaporated milk and the record accumulation of supplies. The average wholesale quotations on evaporated milk per case of 48-14½ ounce cans for August was \$2.71, a decrease of 6 cents per case from the July average. This decrease is the largest reported for any August since 1931 and contrasts to an increase of 5 cents in August last year. Quotations on condensed milk, case goods, however, averaged about 1 cent per case of 48 - 14 ounce cans higher than in July. Stocks of condensed milk on September 1 were less than those of a year earlier, while the August production was also less.

Prices paid producers for 3.5 percent nilk delivered condenseries averaged \$1.15 per cwt. during August, a decrease of 1 cent per cwt. from July. This is the first time in the 17 years for which records are available that the August price averaged lower than that of July. In August last year the average price increased cents. The 5-year (1933-37) average from July to August shows a gain of 7 cents.
