EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT

OCTOBER 1939

The most outstanding feature of the various developments in the evaporated milk industry during September was an unprecedented decrease in manufacturers stocks of evaporated milk.

On September 1 stocks of evaporated milk held by manufacturers totaled 355,071,000 pounds. These were the second largest stocks of record for September 1 and exceeded by 66 percent the 5-year (1933-37) average for that date. On October 1, however, manufacturers reported stocks of only 135,135,000 pounds. These stocks were just one-third as large as those of a year earlier, and 39 percent less than the 5-year (1933-37) October 1 average. This is the first time since October 1936 that the stocks of evaporated milk reported currently for any month have been less than those of the preceding corresponding 5-year average. Stocks of evaporated milk on October 1 were also the lowest for that date since 1922 and the third lowest for any October 1 since records became available in 1920.

The sharp drop in manufacturers reserves during September was brought about primarily by the war in Europe. The suggestion that the war might bring a sharp increase in the price of both domestic raw material and finished products stimulated a rush of buying in early September that did not subside until toward the close of the month. Many distributors who had allowed inventories to remain at low levels all through the year made haste to replenish them. That this is what happened in the evaporated milk industry is indicated by the Agricultural Marketing Service in its quarterly survey of evaporated milk held by wholesale grocers. At the end of the third quarter this year (September 30) this inquiry showed that on that date stocks of evaporated milk held by wholesale distributors equalled 45 days supply based on current trade requirements. This was an increase of 21 days supply over stocks reported by the same houses three months earlier.

To replace some of their stocks depleted by the September buying, manufacturers increased their output of evaporated milk over that of September last year by 9 percent. In August, the increase over the production of a year earlier was only 3 percent. To some extent, however, manufacturers were hampered in their September output by the sharpest seasonal decrease in milk production for any September in the 15 years of record. The decrease was particularly severe in many of the Central States where a large number of evaporated milk plants are located.

Wholesale selling prices of evaporated milk showed the effects of the increased demand. The average of all prices reported for September was \$2.79 per case of $48-14\frac{1}{2}$ oz. cans. This was an increase of 11 cents per case over the average price for August and was also the highest average for any month since June 1938.

Prices paid by condenseries for milk bought from producers during September also advanced. The average price of \$1.35 per cwt. for 3.5 percent milk delivered F.C.B. the plant was the highest average for any month since March 1938. The increase of 1.7¢ per cwt. over the August average was the largest increase over any August average in the 20 years of record.




