EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT

December 1939

Stocks of evaporated milk (case goods) as reported by manufacturers on December 1, 1939 showed a contra-seasonal gain over those of a month earlier, reports the Agricultural Marketing Service. At 183,290,000 pounds these stocks were about 13,000,000 pounds higher than those of November 1. This compares with a decrease of 60,000,000 pounds from November 1 to December 1 last year, and a 5 year (1933-37) average decrease for the same period of 32,000,000 pounds.

Following the sharp drop in stocks that took place during September, there has since been a steady increase in the monthly stocks reported by manufacturers. On December 1 stocks were only 7 percent less than the 5 year (1933-37) average for that date compared to a decrease of 39 percent on October 1. Apparently, wholesale distributors and large users of evaporated milk who bought heavily during the September rush of buying are now drawing on the reserves accumulated at that time. Others are buying more cautiously and at the moment are not anticipating their future requirements to any great extent. Manufactured stocks of evaporated milk are still less than those of a year earlier, but the decrease on December 1 was only 96,000,000 pounds compared to a decrease of 263,000,000 pounds on October 1.

Estimated production of evaporated milk during November was 125,529,000 pounds. This is the second largest November production of record, being exceeded only by that of November 1936. It is also 23 million pounds, or 23 percent, larger than the production of November last year, and 29 million pounds, or 30 percent, larger than the 5 year (1933-37) average November production. Manufacturers have gradually stepped up their output in relation to a year earlier during the last few months, in an effort to build up supplies depleted by the abnormally heavy buying in September.

Production of condensed milk (case goods) which in both Sectember and October rose above corresponding levels of last year is again less than that of a year earlier. The November output is estimated at 2,354,000 pounds, a decrease of 1,109,000 pounds, or 32 percent, under the production of November last year, and 1,486,000 pounds, or 39 percent, under the 5 year (1973-37) average November production. Stocks of condensed milk on November 1 totaled 5,990,000 pounds. These stocks are smaller than those of a month earlier but the seasonal decline during November was smaller than usual.

The average wholesale price of evaporated milk in November was \$2.93 per case of 48-14\frac{1}{2} oz. cans. This is the highest average price for any month since March 1938 when it was \$2.99 per case. Since September, this year, wholesale prices have made a net gain of 14 cents per case compared with a loss of 2 cents per case during the same period last year, and a gain of 2 cents per case for the corresponding 5 year (1933-37) average. The current November average was 25 cents higher than the average of November last year, and 12 cents per case higher than the (1933-37) November average.

Prices paid condenseries to producers for milk delivered f.o.b. plants during November averaged \$1.48 per cwt. for 3.5 milk. This is the highest average price paid producers since February 1938 and exceeds the October average by 5 cents per cwt. This year's increase from October to November is the same as that of the same period last year, but is somewhat smaller than the average increase of 7 cents per cwt. reported for the 5 years (1933-37)




