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EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT

April 1940

Manufacturers' stocks of evaporated milk (case goods) continue to show a contra-seasonal month-to-month increase, as well as a sharp gain over stocks of a year earlier, the Agricultural Marketing Scrvice reports. Stocks on hand April 1 were the second largest for that date since records became available in 1920. The quarterly survey of stocks of evaporated milk held by wholesale grocers at the end of the first quarter of 1940 show that wholesalers are still drawing on supplies purchased during the closing months of 1939, and this may be largely responsible for the current increase in manufacturers' stocks.

Stocks reported by manufacturers for April 1 total 173,378,000 pounds. This is an increase of 63,496,000, or 58 percent, over stocks of April 1 last year, and 81,749,000 pounds, or 89 percent, over the 5-year (1934-38) April 1 average. With the exception of 1920, these stocks were the largest ever reported for any April 1 of record, and failed to reach the previous record by only 1 million pounds. The March increase of stocks was 23 million pounds. This was in contrast to the decrease of $10\frac{1}{2}$ million pounds reported for March last year, and the average March decrease of 7,600,000 pounds for the 5-years (1934-38).

The estimated production of 203,619,000 pounds of evaporated milk (case goods) set a new peak output for March. Compared with a year earlier, it represented a gain of 11 percent, and with the 5-year (1934-38) March average, a gain of 36 percent. Total production for the first three months of 1940 is estimated at 532,672,000 pounds, a gain of 78,440,000 pounds, or 17 percent, over the production of the corresponding three months of last year, and a gain of 150,159,000 pounds, or 39 percent, over the 5-year (1934-38) average for the same three months.

The heavy production and the sharp increase in supplies have had little effect on wholesale prices. The March average wholesale price of \$2.90 per case of $48 - 14\frac{1}{2}$ oz. cans, was only 1 cent per case less than the February average. Last year the drop between the February and March averages was only 1 cent per case, but for the 5-year (1934-38) average, the decrease was 4 cents per case.

The seasonal decline in prices paid producers for milk delivered to condenseries during March was slightly larger than usual. The average of all prices reported for March was \$1.36 per hundredweight for milk testing 3.5 percent butterfat, delivered at plants. This was a decrease of 9 cents per hundredweight from the February average. Last year the decrease between the two months was 7 cents per hundredweight, while in 1938 it was only 6 cents per hundredweight.

The regular quarterly inquiry of wholesale grocers on stocks of evaporated milk (case goods) currently held indicated that at the end of March 1940 wholesalers senerally were drawing on supplies accumulated before the turn of the year, but that they were approaching the point where new buying might be expected to develop. Wholesale grocers estimated that on March 31, 1940, their supplies were sufficient to last for an average of 25 days. This is a sharp decrease from the estimate of 45 days' supply reported at the end of September 1939, but is slightly larger than the 22 days reported at the end of March 1939.




