EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT

June 1940

Monthly production of evaporated milk (case goods) continues to exceed that of the same month last year and the 1934-38 average, but by a considerably smaller margin, the Agricultural Marketing Service reports. Stocks also continue to exceed those of the corresponding period last year and likewise the 5-year average, but by the smallest margin for any month since February of this year.

Estimated production of 281,960,000 pounds of evaporated milk (case goods) in May exceeded the May production of last year by about 5 percent, and the 6-year (1934-38) May average by 19 percent. That production was not only the second largest for any May of record, but was also the second largest for any month in the 23 years of record, as the previous peak of 285,673,000 pounds was also made in May. Production for the months of January to May this year was estimated at 1,039,709,000 pounds. That exceeds the production of the same month last year by 118,000,000 pounds, or 13 percent, and the 5-year (1934-38) average by 242,000,000 pounds, or 30 percent. It is the largest production ever reported for those months in any year.

Production of condensed milk (case goods) took a sudden jump in May. Estimated at 4,906,000 pounds, it was 69 percent larger than that of May last year, but unchanged from the May 1934-38 average. It was the largest production for any May since 1934, and the largest for any month since April 1935. Production of condensed milk (case goods) for the first 5 months - January through May - 1940, was estimated at 17,765,000 pounds, an increase of 13 percent over the production of the same months last year, but a decrease of 23 percent under the corresponding 5-year (1934-38) average.

Stocks of 287,778,000 pounds of evaporated milk (case goods) on June 1 was the largest ever reported for that period, exceeding those of the same date last year by 79,000,000 pounds, of 38 percent, and the 5-year (1934-38) average by approximately 92 million pounds, or 47 percent. The increase in stocks of around 80 million pounds during May was slightly larger than that of a year earlier, but was somewhat smaller than the 5-year (1934-38) average increase of approximately 92 million pounds. Stocks of condensed milk (case goods) on June 1 totaled 6,815,000 pounds, an increase of 378,000 pounds, or 6 percent, over the stocks of June 1 last year, but a decrease of 28 percent from the 5-year (1934-38) June 1 average. Stocks of condensed milk (case goods) increased 2,801,000 pounds during May compared with an increase of 1,829,000 pounds in May last year and a 5-year (1934-38) average May increase of 4,455,000 pounds.

Wholesale selling prices of evaporated milk (case goods) during May averaged \$2.77 per case of $48 - 14\frac{1}{2}$ oz. cans. That average is a decrease of 5 cents per case from the April average, but is an increase of 11 cents per case over the May average of last year. May marks the fifth consecutive month in which the average wholesale selling price of evaporated milk has been less than that of the preceding month. The average wholesale price of condensed milk of \$4.80 per case of 48 - 14 oz. cans during May was the same as that of April and also the same as that of May last year.

The average price paid by condenseries for milk delivered f.o.b. plant during May was \$1.26 per hundredweight for milk averaging 3.5 percent butterfat. That average was a seasonal decrease of 3 cents per hundredweight from the April average. Compared with May last year, however, it was 16 cents per hundredweight larger.




