## EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT

#### DECEMBER 1940

The output of evaporated milk (case goods) continues at record high levels for November, the Agricultural Marketing Service reports. Production in November, estimated at 133,590,000 pounds, was the largest November output ever reported—8 percent larger than last year, and 31 percent above the 1934-38 November average. Production of condensed milk (case goods) also continues to be unusually large for this time of the year. The estimated output of 6,166,000 pounds for November is the largest November production since 1931, 166 percent larger than the November production of last year, and 66 percent larger than the November 5-year (1934-38) average.

Production of evaporated milk (case goods) for the first 11 months of 1940 is estimated by the Service at 2,324,916,000 pounds, an increase of 14 percent over the production of the corresponding 11 months of last year, and 28 percent over the corresponding 5-year (1934-38) average. Production of condensed milk (case goods) during the same period is estimated at 57,244,000 pounds, an increase of 68 percent over the corresponding 11 months of last year, and 19 percent over the 5-year (1934-38) average. Production during the first 5 months of 1940 averaged considerably less than that of the 5-year (1934-38) average, but beginning with June it has been much larger. In only two months-January and April-has the monthly production of condensed milk been less than that of the same months last year.

Both the foreign and domestic demand for evaporated milk continues to be strong. In addition to the largest November production of record, net reduction in manufacturers' previously accumulated reserve supplies of case goods totaled around 132,000,000 pounds. In November last year manufacturers stocks were increased around 13 million pounds, but during the 5 years (1934-38) they averaged a November decrease of around 42 million pounds annually. On December 1, however, stocks held by manufacturers were still large, totaling 226,266,000 pounds, an increase of 20 percent over the stocks of a year earlier and 5 percent over the December 1 (1934-38) average.

The price paid condenseries for milk delivered F.O.B. plant rose sharply in November. The average for the month was \$1.52 per cwt. for milk testing 3.5 percent butterfat, an increase of 12 cents per cwt. over the October average. This is the largest seasonal increase from the October average since 1935, when it was 18 cents per cwt. The average for November last year was \$1.48 per cwt. and the 1934-38 November average, \$1.47 per cwt.

The wholesale price of evaporated milk also showed an increase during November, The average for the month was \$2.91 per case of  $48-14\frac{1}{13}$  oz. cans. This is an increase of 6 cents per case over the October average, but is 2 cents per case less than the Movember average of last year. The wholesale price of condensed milk, however, remained unchanged at \$4.80 per case of 48-14 oz. cans.




