EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK REPORT (May 1941)

In spite of record production of evaporated milk (case goods) during April, manufacturers' stocks were the lowest for May 1 since 1936, the U. S. Department of Agriculture reports. An estimated April output of 258,014,000 pounds was 12 percent higher than the same month last year and 36 percent greater than the April (1935-39) average. Considerable milk is being diverted from other dairy products to evaporated milk and this has been partially responsible for causing the greatest seasonal increase in production on a percentage basis from March to April that has been shown since 1929. Evaporated milk produced during the first four months of the year showed a gain of 5 percent over that of the corresponding period last year.

Contrary to the usual seasonal increase in manufacturers' stocks of evaporated milk (case goods) from April 1 to May 1, stocks declined nearly 10 million pounds this year to 126,160,000 pounds for May 1. Present stocks represent a decrease of 39 percent from the same date a year ago but a gain of 8 percent from the average May 1 stocks during 1935-39. Exports of evaporated nilk remain high, with 8,743,033 pounds being exported during March, compared with 2,284,040 pounds for the same month a year earlier. Data on April exports are not yet available.

Wholesale prices of evaporated milk per case of 48 14½-oz. cans were \$3.04 for April compared with \$2.95 for March this year and \$2.82 for April last year. Present prices are the highest for April since 1931. The average price paid producers for 3.5 percent milk f.o.b. condenseries was \$1.56 per hundredweight, an increase of 8 cents per hundredweight from the preceding month and a rise of 27 cents from April 1940. April prices paid producers are the highest shown for the month since 1930.

The output of condensed milk (case goods) at 9,433,000 pounds for April was the highest production for any nonth since March 1931. The increase from the same month last year was 197 percent and from the April 1935-39 average 105 percent. Manufacturers' stocks on May 1 were 7,228,000 pounds or very nearly the same as on April 1. Stocks are 80 percent higher than the 4,014,000 pounds held on May 1 last year and 51 percent above the April 1 average during the years 1935-39. March exports were 5,019,892 pounds compared with 494,300 pounds during the same month last year. Average wholesale selling price delivered at manufacturers' distributing points was \$4.80 per case of 48 14-oz. cans or the same price which has prevailed every month since May 1939:


The Surplus Marketing Administration accepted offers for the sale of 15,790,500 pounds of evaporated milk during the period from May 1 to May 24. Total purchases by the Federal Surplus Commodities Corporation have been 67,836,945 pounds during the period from March 15 through May 24 of this year.


