STOCKS OF EVAPORATED AND CONDENSED MILK HELD BY WHOLESALE GROCERS

(June 30, 1946)

Wholesale grocers' stocks of both canned evaporated and condensed milk were sharply higher on June 30, 1946 than on March 31, the Bureau of Agricultural Economics reports. Despite this sharp increase wholesale stocks of evaporated milk on June 30 were still smaller than those reported on the corresponding date in 1945. June 30 stocks of canned condensed milk, in wholesale grocers' warehouses, however, rose to levels somewhat higher than on the same date in 1945. While fewer wholesalers reported no stocks of evaporated or condensed milk on hand June 30 than on March 31, many of the firms who reported no stocks three months earlier failed to report on June 30 and probably continued to have no stocks on hand.

Stocks of canned evaporated nilk hold by 589 wholesale grocers on June 30 were 27,883,000 pounds compared with 35,302,000 pounds a year earlier reported by 621 firms. Canned condensed nilk stocks held on June 30 by the same 589 firms were 437,000 pounds while stocks a year earlier were 419,000 pounds. Combined stocks of condensed and evaporated nilk held by these firms totaled 28,320,000 pounds compared with 35,721,000 pounds on the corresponding date of 1945. A 19 percent decline from a year earlier in canned evaporated milk stocks was shown by 576 firms who reported for both dates. Those same firms showed a 10 percent increase in canned condensed milk stocks from a year earlier.

Much more than the usual seasonal increase in stocks of both condensed and evaporated milk was shown from March 31 to June 30 this year. Stocks of evaporated milk held by firms reporting on both dates rose 63 percent during the quarter this year compared with a gain of 45 percent during the same period last year and an average gain of 42 percent during the 5 years 1940-44. The seasonal gain in canned condensed milk was even more marked. An increase of 170 percent was shown during the (Comments continued on page 2)

quarter this year whereas a 19 percent decline was shown during 1945. An average seasonal decline of 9 percent was shown from 1940-44.

Wholesale grocers estimated that the supply of evaporated milk on their shelves June 30 would last 22 days at current rates of consumption. In spite of the increase in number of days supply on hand for June 30 from March 31, the number of days supply is the lowest of record for the date during the eight years for which data are available. The number of days supply on hand June 30, 1945 was estimated at 32.
