LAMB CROP

The 1972 United States lamb crop is estimated at 12,442,000 head, down 4 percent from the 1971 crop of 12,929,000 head, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

The January 1, 1972 number of breeding ewes 1 year old and older totaled 12,854,000, a decrease of 6 percent from a year earlier, while ewe lambs under 1 year were down 14 percent.

The lambing percentage for 1972 (number of lambs saved per 100 ewes 1 year old and older on hand January 1), at 97, is 2 points above 1971.

The lamb crop was larger than a year earlier in New Mexico, Nebraska, Texas, South Dakota, Ohio and Utah. All remaining States for which estimates are available showed declines from last year. The number of early lambs (dropped before March 15) in 12 Western States (11 Western excluding Washington, plus South Dakota, and Texas) was down 12 percent from 1971.

SHORN WOOL

Wool shorn and to be shorn in the United States during 1972 is estimated at 152,513,000 pounds, grease basis. This is a decrease of 4 percent from the 1971 production of 159,084,000 pounds. The 1972 production is equivalent to 72,749,000 pounds, clean basis, compared with 75,883,000 in 1971 based on a conversion factor of 47.7 percent.

The number of sheep shorn and to be shorn, estimated at 18,135,000, declined 4 percent from the 18,944,000 shorn in 1971. The 1972 average fleece weight is 8.41 pounds, compared with 8.40 pounds last year.

The following change in sheep and lamb estimates announced October 1971 is effective with this report. Individual State estimates for the lamb crop and wool production have been discontinued for 24 minor sheep States. Combined estimates for these 24 States, individual estimates for 25 major States and estimates for the U.S. are provided. Hawaii is not included in the estimating program for sheep and lambs. Individual State estimates for all States will be available in the annual reports issued in early 1973. The Lamb Crop and Wool reports previously issued separately have been combined into a single issue effective with this report.

Texas, the leading wool producing State, expects a wool clip of 29,765,000 pounds compared with 30,397,000 pounds in 1971. Wyoming, the second ranking wool producing State, expects to have 15,842,000 pounds of wool produced in 1972, a decrease of 2 percent from 1971.
