The intended number of sows for farrowing in the spring of 1957 (December through May) for 9 of the Corn Belt States is estimated at 5, 375,000 head according to the Crop Reporting Board. The number of sows farrowing this spring is about the same as last year's total of 5, 362,000 head for the 9 States (Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, and Kansas). The March survey indicates an increase of 1 percent or 63,000 head from the farrowing intentions reported for these States in December of 1956. Farmers in two of the States, Ohio and Kansas, report smaller sow numbers for 1957 spring farrow than a year earlier, while those in the other 7 States report no change or small increases running up to a maximum of 3 percent in Wisconsin and South Dakota. The 9 States included in this report accounted for 71 percent of the United States spring pig crop in 1956.

Sows farrowed during December, January, and February totaled 1,586,000 head, slightly less than the 1,594,000 head farrowed during the same 3 months a year earlier. The intentions to farrow reported for these 9 States in December 1956 totaled 1,595,000 sows. Farmers' reports indicate that the number of sows farrowed in December was up from a year earlier, while January and February farrowings were down. This year's December through February sows farrowed represent about 30 percent of the total expected spring sow numbers (December through May) which is the same percentage as last year, but is nearly double the 10-year average of 16 percent.

Sows bred and intended for farrow in March, April, and May this year totaled 3, 789, 000 head, about 1 percent above the 3, 768, 000 head farrowed in 1956, but 72,000 head or 2 percent above the intentions reported in December. Reported breeding intentions indicate 1, 912, 000 sows to farrow during the 1957 summer quarter (June, July, and August) in the 9 States covered by this survey. This is 3 percent or 61,000 head above 1956. Three States -- Ohio, Iowa, and Missouri -- show no change from 1956. The other 6 States show increases over last year, ranging up to a high of 8 percent in Wisconsin and Kansas.

The number of all hogs and pigs on farms March 1, 1957, in the 9 States totaled 34.4 million head, slightly higher than the 34.3 million head a year earlier. Hogs and pigs 6 months old or over, at 11.6 million head, were 2 percent below the 11.9 million head on March 1, 1956. The current number of hogs and pigs under 6 months of age was 2 percent more than for last March 1, with the increase shared by both the under-3-month and the 3-to-6 months age groups. was up 2 percent from the 11.1 million head for 1956. This compares with 1 percent decrease in the number of sows farrowed during December through February and reflects an increase in the number of pigs saved per litter.

March 1, 1957, inventories of hogs and pigs 3 to 6 months old for the 9 States were placed at 11.5 million head or 1 percent above the 11.4 million for March 1, 1956. The number of hogs and pigs under 6 months of age on March 1, 1957, was 66 percent of the total for all hogs and pigs compared with 65 percent for the preceding year.
