The number of sows farrowed and intended to farrow in the spring of 1958 (December through May) for 10 of the Corn Belt States is 6 percent larger than in the spring of 1957, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The 5, 702, 000 sows farrowing for the 10 States (Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Nebraska, and Kansas) compares with the revised estimate of 5, 404, 000 sows farrowed during the same period in 1957. The March 1 survey indicates about the same percentage increase for the spring season as reported in December. Farmers in Ohio report 2 percent less sows for 1958 spring farrow than a year earlier, while the other States show increases ranging from 3 percent in Indiana to 14 percent in Nebraska. An increase of 6 percent is indicated in Illinois, 8 percent in Wisconsin, 6 percent in Minnesota, 4 percent in Iowa, 6 percent in Missouri, 12 percent in South Dakota, and 11 percent in Kansas.

For the 10 States included in this report, the estimate of 1957 spring sows was revised at this time on the basis of marketings and other check data which have become available since December. The revised 10 State totals are, 5,404,000 sows farrowed and 38,993,000 pigs saved. The 1957 spring crop for the U. S. is now estimated at 7,283,000 sows farrowed and 51,849,000 pigs saved, down 5 percent and 3 percent respectively from the 1956 spring crop.

Sows farrowed during December, January, and February totaled 1, 809,000 head, 15 percent more than the 1,568,000 head farrowed during the same 3 months a year earlier, and 68 percent more than the 10-year average of 1,079,000 head. Farmers' reports indicate that the number of sows farrowed in each of the 3 months was up from a year earlier, with the greatest increases shown in the relatively light farrowing months of December and January. This year's December through February sows represent 32 percent of the total expected spring sows (December through May) which compares with 29 percent of the total in 1957 and with 17 percent for the 10-year average. This continues the trend in recent years to earlier farrowings. Sows bred and intended for farrow in March, April, and May this year total 3,893,000 head, 1 percent more than the 3,836,000 head farrowed in 1957, but 24 percent less than the average for this period.

Reported breeding intentions indicate 2, 268, 000 sows to farrow during the 1958 summer quarter (June through August). This would be an increase of 13 percent or 255, 000 head from the 2, 013, 000 that farrowed during the Continued on page 4

same period a year earlier. All States show increases, ranging from 4 percent in Missouri to 39 percent in Kansas. Iowa, Illinois, and Indiana, the major producing States for this period, show increases of 15 percent, 18 percent, and 10 percent respectively.

The number of all hogs and pigs on farms March 1, 1958, in the 9 States for which comparable data are available (Nebraska excluded) totaled 35, 516, 000 head, 6 percent more than a year earlier and 4 percent more than the 34, 310, 000 head on farms on March 1, 1956. All States, except Chio, show more hogs and pigs on farms this March than a year earlier. Hogs six months old and over totaled 11, 844, 000 head, 5 percent more than the 11,325,000 head a year earlier. The number under 6 months of age was 6 percent more than last March, with an increase of 1 percent in the 3-6 months age group and 12 percent in the number of pigs under 3 months old. The increase in number of pigs under 3 months of age was less than the percentage increase in sows farrowed during December through February, indicating a litter sizeless than a year earlier particularly in Iowa and the Eastern Corn Belt. The 12,090,000 pigs under 3 months of age on farms March 1 accounted for 34 percent of all hogs, compared with 10,840,000 head a year earlier or 32 percent of the total hogs. Pigs 3-6 months of age totaled 11,582,000 head, compared with 11,446,000 head a year earlier.

The report for these 10 States is made possible by matching funds provided jointly by State agencies and the United States Department of Agriculture under provision of the Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946.

Note: Revised estimates of the number of sows farrowed during the 1957 spring season for the 10 States in the quarterly program are shown in this report. Revised estimates of the number of pigs saved for these States will be included in the report entitled "Meat Animals - Farm Production, Disposition and Income 1956-57" scheduled for release on April 29, 1958. Estimates for the remaining 38 States will be reviewed and revised if necessary, in connection with the Pig Crop Report scheduled for release June 20, 1958.
