

PIG CROP REPORT

DECEMBER 1961

JAN - 1962

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The 1961 pig crop totaled 93.2 million head, an increase of 5 percent from last year, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The spring pig crop of 50.5 million head was 7 percent larger than the 1960 spring crop of 47.3 million head. The fall pig crop of 42.7 million head was 4 percent larger than the 1960 crop of 41.1 million head. The increased number of spring pigs resulted from a 4 percent increase in the number of sows farrowing combined with a 3 percent increase in pigs saved per litter. The average of 7.18 pigs per litter was the highest of record. The increased number of fall pigs saved resulted from 2 percent more sows farrowing and 2 percent larger litters.

For the spring of 1962, reports based on farmers' intentions indicate 7.3 million sows to farrow, or 3 percent more than the 7.0 million sows farrowed in the spring of 1961. If these intentions materialize, and the number of pigs per litter equals the 10-year average plus an allowance for trend, the 1962 spring pig crop would be 51.5 million head--2 percent above the 1961 crop.

This report is based on a survey of 184,000 farm and ranch operators. These returns were obtained largely in cooperation with the Post Office Department through rural mail carriers.

1961 FALL PIG CROP UP 4 PERCENT: The number of pigs saved during the fall of 1961 (June through November) is estimated at 42,709,000 head. This is 4 percent more than the 1960 fall crop and 15 percent above the 1950-59 fall average. Regionally, the North Central States accounted for all of the increase from last year. The East North Central States were up 5 percent and the West North Central States were up 6 percent. Decreases from 1960 were: North Atlantic States, 6 percent; South Central States, 1 percent; Western States, 3 percent. The number of pigs saved in the South Atlantic States was unchanged from 1960.

The number of sows farrowing in the fall of 1961 is estimated at 5,968,000 head, 2 percent more than farrowed in the fall of 1960, and 10 percent above average. Fall farrowings were 1 percentage point less than indicated by farmers' intentions reported last June. Regional fall farrowings in 1961 as a percent of 1960 and intentions reported last June are as follows: North Atlantic, 93 now and 98 percent last June; East North Central, 103, and 99; West North Central, 103 and 98; South Atlantic, 98 and 105; South Central, 98 and 101; West, 96 and 97.

Pigs saved per litter averaged 7.15 in the fall of 1961, compared with 7.02 in the fall of 1960. Litter size showed an increase over the previous year in all regions.

Compared with a year earlier, farrowings during August and September declined slightly while June, July, October and November showed small increases. Percentages of sows farrowing by months during the fall of 1961, compared with 1960 are as follows: June, 15.9 and 15.0; July, 15.1 and 14.9; August, 21.1 and 22.0; September, 24.9 and 25.7; October, 15.2 and 14.8; and November, 7.8 and 7.6.

1961 SPRING PIG CROP--UP 7 PERCENT: The 1961 spring pig crop is estimated at 50,464,000 pigs, 7 percent above 1960. A total of 7,032,000 sows farrowed in the spring of 1961, compared with 6,790,000 during the same period a year earlier. This was an increase of 4 percent. Pigs saved per litter averaged 7.18, compared with 6.96 in the spring of 1960.

ANNUAL PIG CROP UP 5 PERCENT: The 1961 spring and fall pig crops combined totaled 93,173,000 head, 5 percent more than the 88,387,000 head in 1960. For the ten-year period (1950-1959) the average pig crop totaled 91,698,000 head.

1962 SPRING INTENTIONS UP 3 PERCENT: Farmers' reports on breeding intentions for the spring of 1962 indicate 7,268,000 sows to farrow (December 1961 through May 1962). This would be 3 percent more than a year earlier and 7 percent above farrowings of the spring of 1960. The North Central and South Atlantic States indicate increases, while the North Atlantic, South Central and Western regions plan decreases in spring farrowings. By regions, changes from 1961 are as follows: increases are West North Central, 5 percent; South Atlantic, 4 percent; and the East North Central, 2 percent. Decreases are South Central, 2 percent; West, 5 percent; and the North Atlantic, 6 percent.

If intentions for spring farrowings materialize and the number of pigs saved per litter equals the average with an allowance for trend, the 1962 spring pig crop would be 2 percent larger than a year earlier.

SELECTED CORN BELT STATES INCREASE FARROWINGS FOR BOTH FALL AND SPRING:

In 10 selected Corn Belt States, 1961 fall litters and expected 1962 spring farrowings both showed small percentage gains from a year earlier. In these States -- Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Nebraska, and Kansas-- the number of sows that farrowed during the June - November, 1961 period totaled 4,474,000, an increase of 3 percent over 1960. Farmers' intentions point to 5,667,000 spring litters during the December 1961 - May 1962 period, a gain of 4 percent over 1961. The gains in farrowings were well distributed among the several Corn Belt States, with fall farrowings increased in 8 of the 10 States, and spring farrowings expected to be up in 9 States.

Quarterly farrowing data for the Corn Belt States indicate that the percentage increases in sow farrowings from a year earlier were rather uniform throughout the year. The 2,308,000 farrowings during the June-August period were up 3 percent from a year earlier, and the 2,166,000 farrowings during the September-November quarter were up 4 percent. Expected farrowings for the December-February period at 1,878,000 are up 6 percent, and the 3,789,000 forecast for the March-May quarter is up 3 percent.

HOGS ON FARMS IN 10 STATES UP 5 PERCENT:

The number of all hogs and pigs on farms in the 10 selected Corn Belt States on December 1, 1961 totaled 47,630,000, up 5 percent from a year earlier but 2 percent less than 2 years ago. For individual States, gains from a year earlier ranged from as little as 2 percent in Minnesota and Missouri to as much as 13 percent in Kansas.

Age classification of hogs on hand showed 15,448,000 pigs under 3 months, 15,407,000 hogs and pigs 3 to 6 months of age, and 16,775,000 hogs over 6 months. Increases in numbers from a year earlier were 4 percent for pigs under 3 months, 5 percent for those 3 to 6 months, and 7 percent for hogs 6 months old and over.
