Section Two: HERZL DURING HIS LIFETIME

First Hebrew edition of Herzl's Der Judenstaat and published in the same year as the first German edition. Translated into Hebrew by Michal Berkovitch. Wrapps worn at spine. The first German edition is listed in Printing and the Mind of Man, (No. 381) Carter and Muir's book charting the impact of print on the development of Western intellectual history. £2,250

Volume 4 Index and Analysis to Minutes of Evidence. viii + 52, + viii + 865, viii + 98, 142 pp. Massive tome of 1000+ pages. There is extensive evidence given by members of the Jewish community during this intense period of Eastern European Jews fleeing the pogroms and privations of their native countries. Amongst this evidence is a very lengthy piece of evidence submitted by Theodor Herzl (in July 1902). This evidence runs to over ten full pages of double columns where Herzl quotes from Der Judenstaat. It starts with a statement provided by Dr Herzl and is then followed by guestions and answers. It opens "I am an Austrian subject", and seven years ago, when I was living in Paris, I was so impressed with the state of Jewry throughout Europe and published a pamphlet which I called "A Jewish State"......The first Zionist Congress was held in Basle, Switzerland, in 1897, and I was elected president". Afterwards there is an extensive interrogation of Theodor Herzl on anti-Semitism, the situation of the Jews in Eastern Europe, Baron Hirsch's scheme and other issues.

This volume contains the full year from January to December, 1897. - 4. **Die Welt.** Koln (Cologne). Die Welt was a weekly newspaper established by Theodor Herzl in 1897. It became the official organ of the World Zionist Organisation after the 5th Zionist Congress in 1903 and was published till 1914, first in Vienna, then in Cologne from 1905 and then in Berlin from 1911. The language is German. Herzl devoted much of his energy and his personal assets in the creation of Die Welt.

- 5. Trans Jordanian Frontier Force. Oblong photographic album approx.13 **by 9.5 inches.** ND but circa 1930s/1940s. Contains 84 original photographs of varied sizes, some are approx 4 x 3 inches, others are 2.5 by 3 inches. There are a couple of instances where 2 pictures have been cropped and stuck together to provide a full scene. The pictures feature aircraft, and aircraft displays, parades, building blown up by sabotage or fighting, groups of the TJFF riding horses, patrolling etc. There are also some photos of wildlife animals and excavations. Pictures are not annotated and the photographer is unknown. The TJFF was created on the 1st April 1926, to replace the disbanded Palestine Gendarmerie. It was a creation of the British High Commission for Palestine whose intention was that the Force should defend Trans-Jordan's northern and southern borders. Its commander was a British lieutenant Colonel, and the second in command was a British Major. Initially, it consisted of 3 cavalry squadrons (of 120 men each), one camel company and six reserve troops (190 men). There were a number of Jews in the force and the Jewish Agency encouraged recruitment from the Jewish Community. The TJFF was disbanded on 9th February, 1948 when many members of the unit were absorbed into the Arab Legion.
- **6.** Palestine Disturbances. Oblong photographic album, approx.10.5 by 8 inches. Contains 51 original photographs approx 3.5 by 2.5 inches. Each group of photographs comes with a photograph of a sheet with captions (Possibly they were official photos of some sort). Personal photos have been removed from the album. The groups of photos are as follows:
 - i. Palestine 1936. 7 photos of a derailed train with a caption describing each of the photographs.
 - ii. Scenes and experiences of "Delhi" POM-POM Crew at Jerusalem. August to September 1936. (11 photographs) Captions for these include: train wreck near Bas El Ain; searching Arabs for arms; armed cars waiting to escort convoy to Nablus and 8 others.

 - iv. Third Cruiser Squadron at Haifa, September 1935 September 1936. (14 photographs) Captions include: The Jewish Suburb built quite recently; Soldiers searching the hills for Arab bandits; In action with a machine gun; taking prisoners to Acre prison and ten others. These photographs were taken by E Coleman A B, HMS "Delhi"
 - v. Funeral of a young rating (soldier) Haifa, 1936. 7 photographs, slightly larger, not captioned.
 - vi. Souvenir of Haifa with HMS Delhi Badge (looks like a photograph of a postcard) £450

- 7. Mini album. Published by Dr Wilhelm Freyhan. Tel Aviv. 18 photographs 6 each of Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and Haifa. Some pages loose. Pictures are numbered by hand and there is a printed key on the first page. Photos measure 1.75 x 1inch.
- 8. Palestine Middle East Album Aviation. Oblong album, approx 13 by 9.5 inches. 211 original photographs (plus 2 photographs) circa 1943. Mostly annotated, photographer unknown. Photographs taken in Africa Sudan, Cairo and Palestine including Jerusalem, Tel Aviv and Bethlehem. There are a number of photographs of aeroplanes.
- 9. Palestine Emergency 1938-1939. Oblong album.

Album containing one hundred and thirty-eight original photographs, various formats $3\frac{1}{2}$ in x $2\frac{1}{2}$ in to 7 in x 5in, all captioned in detail in white ink on black album pages. Very good in a contemporary black limp rexine album with cord ties at the spine, a little rubbed, titled as above in white on the upper board. The acceleration of immigration into Palestine resulting from the persecution of Jews in Germany and Italy fanned the flames of Arab feeling against Britain, the Mandatory Power. With German collusion and financial support, the Mufti of Jerusalem consolidated rebel Arab groups into a 15,000 strong army and engaged in a widespread campaign of terrorism, targetting not just Jews but also dissenting Arabs. In response to this, in October 1938 the British bolstered their garrison with of troops from a number of Regiments including the Coldstream Guards and the Royal Northumberland Fusiliers. The eventual strength of British forces in the area was close to 20,000.

The first task was to recapture the Old City which was to be achieved by driving a wedge between the Arab City and the Temple area primarily to assist the Police in searching the homes of the 45,000 inhabitants. Taken by surprise, the rebels offered little resistance, sporadic sniping occured and one Guardsman was killed, but large numbers of prisoners were taken. In the months that followed, similar operations were undertaken in Gaza, Jericho, Haifa, Acre and a number of other cities. This scaling up of the military presence, together with political initiatives obtaining the intervention of friendly Arab states in Palestine brought the issue, temporarily at least, to a close.

The images in this album closely follow the chronology of the intervention, beginning with the departure of the 3rd Bn Coldstream Guards, a battery of the Royal Horse Artillery, and 67 Coy. Royal Army Service Corps on SS *Vasna* from Alexandria for Haifa. A series of ten very high quality 7" x 5" plates follow, detailing the operations in Jerusalem. All are excellently captioned beneath and most have more detailed inked notes verso. The proximity of the cameraman to the action would suggest that these are at least semi-official and the quality of the pictures themselves is certainly professional. Also, the detail of the captioning points to the direct involvment of the album's compiler in events. In fact one of the images, titled "A Sniper's Post in the Old City," is accompanied by a lengthy explanation which tells of how the compiler spotted blood dripping from a window-way which led the patrol to discover a carefully secured vantage-point, the occupant of which had been "shot by a lucky bullet through his neck."

A quantity of less professional, but nonetheless interesting, snap-shot images follow which give a good idea of the type of operation undertaken; search parties; the securing of prisoners; a Lewis Gun post covering the Dome of the Rock; the lifting of the curfew etc. Inevitably, there are some more "touristic" images, but also some rather good views of the camp at Sarafand, the Motor Vehicle compound at Jericho, and camp life in general. The searches at Jericho and Acre

are also covered by the same mixture of high-quality and amateur images, and the captioning is very detailed and revealing. There are a few images of the operations in Bethlehem and Jaffa, and a number of scenes in Tel Aviv and Ramla. It would appear from internal evidence that the unidentified compiler was serving with the RASC. A fascinating insight into this under-recorded incident, which is of importance both in terms of the outbreak of WWII and the development of tensions in the Middle East.

- Bomber Command. Large Oblong Olive Wood Album. The Olive Wood is inlaid with coloured illustrations. The word Jerusalem is inlaid on the back cover. Leather spine. (Circa 1936- 39 there is photograph captioned "Coronation" Day" and a squadron menu from October 39) About 90 items, mostly photographs with a few pieces of ephemera. An important album of pictures taken by J W T Pybus No. 613688 Bomber Command. Palestine was under the control of the RAF until the latter part of the Arab Rebellion (1936-1939) when the army was brought in to help restore law and order. Most of the photographs are snapshots, however there are some larger ones. There is a photograph of Squadron 6 (Bomber Command) approx 11 x 4 inches. There are photographs of the aftermath of terrorist attacks such as train derailments, some are briefly captioned, some are without captions but they feature headings, "Searching an Arab village for arms," "Blowing up an Arab house for firing on troops." There are some pictures of buildings "German Hospice" "Coronation Day, King David Hotel." There are some street and rural scenes - "A Bedouin Mother and Baby," "David Street, Jerusalem" and some larger photographs of a funeral. There are also some interesting aerial shots of Palestine and a few larger ones relating to a funeral of an Officer and two airmen killed by an Arab mine. There is an aerial photograph of the pyramids and a squadron menu dated 18th October 1939 signed by members of the squadron.
- 11. Eretz Yisrael. Card boards, oblong album. Mostly one snapshot per page sometimes two. circa 1920 25. 44 photographs. 4.5 x 3.25. There is a picture of Achad Ha'am and pictures of the High Commissioner (Herbert Samuel) visiting Tel Aviv. Photographs are briefly annotated in Hebrew. Other photos include the Western Wall, market in Jerusalem etc 11.5 x 8
- 12. La Palestine La Juif. Jerusalem, Bethlehem, La Mer Morte 1921-1922. 145 small photographs. 2.25 x 1.5 inches. Brief annotations about the photographs in French. There are a number of pictures of individuals illustrating the dress and lifestyle of the times. There are several pictures featuring Orthodox Jewish men wearing the traditional Jerusalem dress, some of them wearing Shtriemels the traditional hat worn on Jewish festivals. This particular group of photos is captioned There are various street scenes, buildings, scenic views "Au Ghetto de Jerusalem" There are photos of Jewish women as well as men. There are hill scenes and street scenes in Arab areas also depicting men and woman. £550

<u>B. Press Photos</u> See how the images of the emerging State of Israel were used by newspapers. The written commentary is taken from the back of the photo. These notes were presumably for the picture editor who would have relied on the information to create a subheading for the photo. Where available, the name of the photo agency and the photo reference number is included.

- 21. Nov 16th, 1936. Arab Refusal to Palestine Commission, The Royal Commission which is inquiring into the situation in Palestine in now sitting in Jerusalem. The Arab Higher Committee has decided to boycott the Commission and expressed by letter regrets at inability to give traditional Arab hospitality to guests in the Holy Arab Land. It is understood the decision is a protest against the failure to suspend imagination. The photo shows Arabs meeting in the streets and cafes to dismiss the Arab Higher Committee's decision to boycott the Royal Commission. This picture just received in London shows a typical street scene with Arabs in foreground discussing the situation. 12 x 10 in
- 22. 18th November, 1936. Kilts in the Streets of Nazareth The 1st Battalion Kings Own Scottish Borderers, in Palestine ready for duty during the recent trouble, are now at Nazareth. This photo shows two kinds of mortars Arabs building a wall look on as one of the Kings Own Scottish Borderers practice with a trench mortar.
- 23. No Date La Fin Della Greve Generale En Palestine. Apres six mois de greve generale, les arabes out repris le travail en Palestine: L'ere des troubles senglants semble close. Webb of Signals Intelligence, RAF who was an eyewitness to the bombing of the King David Hotel in Jerusalem. Marked 'Restricted' typed on two pages, 4to, signed by Webb to end, with an important statement signed by Wing Commander E M Sopwith regarding Webb's illegal relationship with a Jewish woman who had connections with the terrorists. This is Sgt. Webb's personal copy of his statement. The Hotel, one of the major luxury hotels in Europe, housed the Military Headquarters of the British Army as well as the offices and secretariat of the civil administration. The British, not surprisingly, knew that this was the prime target for the three Jewish underground armies who had been formed out of the bitter remnants of those Jews who had suffered (and survived) from the Holocaust. The hotel was also the target for Arab militants. As a result, the Hotel was heavily cordoned off with tight security. Despite this, it still functioned as a hotel and was the main social meeting point in the country, not only for the British civilian and military personnel and their social contacts, but also for all the other nationalities and religions. It was also a hive of activity for espionage and intelligence gathering. On June 29th 1946, the British High Commissioner put into effect 'Operation Agatha' which was nothing other than a declaration of war against the Irgun and Hagana. and as a result 23,000 soldiers were used to round up the leading Jewish political figures, to search settlements and kibbutzim and to raid for illegal arms. 2,700 were arrested, 80 wounded and 4 killed. In direct retaliation, the leaders of the official Jewish underground army the Haggana and the Irgun - the National Military Organisation – plotted to blow up the hotel. The Haggana pulled out of the plan for fear of civilian casualties. but the Irgun (led by Menachim Begin) went ahead, planning to give a 30 minute warning. An extraordinary daring operation by 12 or so members of the Irgun resulted in 300 kilos of explosive – unbelievably bought from an Arab chemist – being placed in a basement of the hotel. The Irgun disguised themselves as Arab porters. They were discovered and a gun battle ensued resulting in the death of a British officer, but the Irgun members escaped. A few hours later, the bomb was detonated resulting in 91 dead and 50 wounded of all nationalities. This was one of the most important elements in the decision by the British Government to guit the area. The most remarkable aspect of Webb's statement is that he was in the Hotel with a Jewish girl who came from a professional background and was distantly related to one of the Jewish political families. She is identified in the attending statement of Wing Commander Sopwith as having links with Haggana. Considering that in 1946 there were few telephones and hardly any radio, Webb's statement bears out a theory for the Irgun's claim that an early warning was given as he clearly states that: '...just after 12.15pm the first explosion took place just down the road at the antique bazaar near the far end of the YMCA. I was surprised that my girlfriend had become worried and we agreed that she should leave which she did.' It would seem that the reaction from Webb's girlfriend would suggest that she knew more than Webb was prepared to accept about the affair. Webb's reluctance to identify his girlfriend could be a most significant factor. In Sopwith's statement it adds '...covert investigations by Army Special Branch indicate an emotional attachment to Haggana but nothing further. Like many Jews her loyalties are more idealistic than realistic...in view of the family connection no action is to be taken against the young lady for knowingly fraternising with a member of the British Armed Forces knowing this to be illegal. Sqt. Webb is to be reprimanded." £950

Section Six-BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY PAPERS

Parliamentary papers is a broad term referring to those official documents considered to be so important for Parliamentary business that they are distributed free to Members of Parliament. These papers reflect the issues, debates and decisions affecting the Zionist endeavor and the eventual establishment of the State of Israel. This section also includes all the White papers that stated Government Policy in relation to the Mandate Period and the eventual establishment of the State of Israel.

These documents provide an invaluable source of political, economic and cultural information about the evolution and establishment of the State of Israel. Most of them are Command Papers - a special group of papers that originated as a distinct group during the 19th century. They are documents that the Government, as opposed to Parliament, feels that members of Parliament should have copies of, in order to carry out their parliamentary business; hence the term *Command*, that is, at the Command of Her Majesty. Note that each Command Paper has a unique number: papers are numbered consecutively and continuously until roughly 9999. The abbreviated prefix for "Command" has changed over the years with the start of a new sequence: **C, Cd, Cmd, Cmnd**, and most recently **Cm**.

What follows below is a very extensive collection of official documents and a few books. They provide detailed information on all aspects of the Palestine Mandate period from the political issues, statements of Government policy, agricultural issues, population statistics, details of terrorist activity etc. Taken together, they provide an enormously detailed official view of all aspects of Palestine during the Mandate period. These papers have been grouped for convenience under relevant headings. Of special interest are the small number of British Government papers simultaneously published in Hebrew. Also of note are a full set of "British Government White Papers" and a full set of the drafts and final version of the Palestine Mandate.

A. The White Papers - British Government Statements of Policy Relating to the Palestine Mandate.

The Balfour Declaration was a pivotal movement in modern Zionist history. In effect, it was a letter from Arthur James Balfour to Lord Walter Rothschild which declared that the British government "view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavours to facilitate the achievement of this object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine, or the rights and political status enjoyed by Jews in any other country." It then led to a series of White Papers between 1922 and 1939 that chart the British Government's policy changes during the Mandate period. The last of these was the infamous White Paper of 1939 which severely restricted Jewish immigration to Palestine.

Correspondence with the Palestine Arab delegation and the **Zionist Organisation.** 31 pp. 1922. **Command Paper 1700.** This was known as "The Churchill White Paper," because Winston Churchill was the Colonial Secretary at the time. It contained the first important statement of British government policy relating to Palestine after the Balfour Declaration. While reaffirming the declaration, it stated that there was no question of Palestine becoming "as Jewish as England is English" and that the Arabs need have no fear of "the disappearance or the subordination of the Arabic population, language or culture in Palestine ...The development of the Jewish National Home meant not the imposition of a Jewish nationality upon the inhabitants of Palestine as a whole, but the further development of the existing Jewish community [which, in another passage, was said to have "national" characteristics] with the assistance of Jews in other parts of the world, in order that it may become a centre in which the Jewish people as a whole may take, on grounds of religion and race, an interest and a pride." To enable this community to develop, however, "it is essential that it should know that it is in Palestine as of right and not on sufferance," the statement declared. That was why international guarantees were necessary. The statement went on to say that Jewish immigration must continue, but must not exceed "whatever may be the economic capacity of the country at the time to absorb new arrivals," that the government intended "to foster the establishment of a full measure of self-government" and that as the next step, it proposed to set up a Legislative Council consisting of 12 elected and ten appointed members, headed by the high commissioner. The Zionist Executive reluctantly accepted the policy set out in the statement, while the Palestinian Arabs did not.

Wrapps 23 pp. This was issued by the colonial secretary, Lord Passfield (Sidney Webb), in the wake of the riots of 1929. The causes of the riots and the situation in Palestine had been investigated by the Shaw Commission. An inquiry into land settlement, immigration, and development had been carried out by Sir John Hope Simpson, (see: Cmd. 3687 Hope-Simpson **report)** who was pessimistic as to the possibilities of further Jewish immigration and settlement without displacing Arabs. It rejected the view that the passages regarding the Jewish National Home were the principal feature of the Mandate. Passfield called for a renewed attempt at establishing the Legislative Council, and supported the Hope-Simpson findings on land availability and cultivation. On the critical question of immigration, the sentiments of the paper were against a generous policy towards the Zionists. The Zionist movement mounted a major campaign against the White Paper and in a letter made public, during February 1931, British Prime Minister, Ramsay MacDonald, promised Chaim Weizmann what amounted to its abrogation.

During the next five years Jewish immigration would be limited to 75,000, bringing the Jewish population up to approximately one-third of the total population of Palestine. After the end of the five-year period no further Jewish immigration would be permitted "unless the Arabs of Palestine are prepared to acquiesce in it," and the government "will not be under any obligation to facilitate the further development of the Jewish National Home by immigration regardless of the wishes of the Arab population." This White Paper was regarded by the Zionist movement and many outside it as a final betrayal of Britain's obligations to the Jewish people under the Balfour Declaration and the

Mandate. The announcement of this policy at the outset of the Jewish mass flight from Europe became the starting point for the active struggle of the Yishuv against the Mandatory regime in Palestine.

B. The Palestine Mandate.

The mandate system was created by Article 22 of the Covenant of the League of Nations which formed part of the Treaty of Versailles of 1919. It declared that to territories inhabited "by peoples not yet able to stand by themselves under the strenuous conditions of the modern world there should be applied the principle that the well-being and development of such peoples form a sacred trust of civilization." The mandate system was applied to non-European territories ceded by Germany and Turkey after World War 1. Palestine was assigned to Britain as an "A" mandate. The Palestine Mandate was a culmination of many drafts as listed below. Eventually, it was ratified by the League of Nations in 1922 (see item 210 below).
