SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection contains fieldwork records and papers produced by the staff of the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks, as well as Thomas Whittemore and Paul Underwood, between the 1920s and 2000s. It is comprised of correspondence, minutes, financial records, logbooks, fieldwork notebooks, research notes, ground plans, maps, oversize drawings, tracings, paintings, photographs, films, newspaper clippings, and publication materials. The collection is organized by method of creation and medium in chronological or fieldwork order. It is divided into 2 major subgroups: Administrative Records and Fieldwork Papers.

The bulk of the collection spans the decades between the 1930s and 1980s, with the largest portion of materials relating to projects conducted at Hagia Sophia and Kariye Camii in Istanbul, as well as later projects in Turkey, Cyprus, and present-day Macedonia. The arrangement of this collection illustrates the early operations and development of the Byzantine Institute until Thomas Whittemore's death in 1950, the Institute's dissolution in 1962, and the fieldwork operations supported by Dumbarton Oaks from the 1960s to 2000s. The materials also record administrative affairs and day-to-day fieldwork activities, which centered on the conservation and restoration techniques employed by the fieldworkers.

HISTORICAL NOTE

The Byzantine Institute (also commonly known as the Byzantine Institute of America)¹ was founded by Thomas Whittemore in 1930. (Thomas Whittemore had already participated extensively in excavations in the 1910s to early 1930s in Bulgaria—for example, the Basilica in Nesebar/Mesembria, the Red Church in Peruštica, and the Basilica in Bělovo—and in Egypt—namely, Abydos, Sawama, Balabish, and Amarna—for the Egypt Exploration Society.²) On May 23, 1934, the Byzantine Institute officially became The Byzantine Institute, Inc. when it was issued a charter from the State of Massachusetts. The organization's mission was to conserve, restore, study, and document the Byzantine monuments, sites, architecture, and arts in the former Byzantine Empire. The first official project undertaken by the Byzantine Institute was the examination and documentation of wall paintings in the Red Sea Monasteries in Egypt, which

occurred between 1929 and 1932. By capturing select Byzantine iconography from the frescoes at the monasteries of St. Anthony and St. Paul, Vladimir Netchetailov produced watercolor paintings of saints (e.g., Saints George and Theodore Strateletes) and religious scenes (e.g., The Resurrection and Deësis).

In June 1931, Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the first President of the Republic of Turkey, permitted Whittemore and the Byzantine Institute to uncover and restore the original mosaics in Hagia Sophia. The mosaics had been covered with plaster decorated with Islamic motifs when the church was converted into a mosque in 1453 by the Ottoman Turks. With approval from the Turkish government, the Institute began a conservation and restoration campaign in December 1931. Eventually, this initiative led to the conversion of Hagia Sophia into a museum on November 24, 1934.³

The Institute operated from several headquarters, located in Boston, Paris, and Istanbul. Administrative activities primarily centered in Boston, where Institute personnel communicated with fieldworkers in Istanbul and staff members at the Byzantine Institute Library in Paris. The Byzantine Institute Library in Paris was managed by the staff librarian, Boris Ermoloff, a longtime friend of Whittemore. The library collected publications related to Byzantine studies and provided research services in support of the Institute's fieldwork projects. By contrast, the office in Istanbul was used as storage for fieldwork equipment and as a temporary residence for Institute and Dumbarton Oaks staff and fieldworkers.

In the late 1940s, the Byzantine Institute continued its restoration and conservation work at Hagia Sophia and also initiated a similar campaign at Kariye Camii in 1947, which lasted until 1959.⁴ In June 1950, Whittemore died while en route to the office of John Foster Dulles at the Department of State in Washington, D.C. After Whittemore's death, Paul Atkins Underwood was appointed as the Fieldwork Director of the Byzantine Institute, a position he held until his death in September 1968. In 1963, Ernest Hawkins was appointed Assistant Field Director and Research Associate at Dumbarton Oaks. During this transition period, Underwood assumed the oversight of the ongoing projects at Hagia Sophia (until 1964)⁵ and Kariye Camii. Other endeavors included: the uncovering of the 7th century pavement in the Church of the Pantocrator⁶ (Molla Zeyrek Camii) that was carried out from 1954 to 1962;⁷ the restoration of mosaics in the Fethiye Camii (Church of Theotokos Pammakaristos) from 1949 to 1963;⁸ the conservation of a fresco discovered at the church of St. Euphemia in 1958;⁹ and the repair work in the Fenari Isa Camii (Lips Monastery) from 1960¹⁰ to 1964.¹¹ Also during this period, the Byzantine Institute's conservators worked on the mosaic of the Transfiguration at the monastery of St. Catherine on Mt. Sinai in Egypt in 1959.¹² All of these fieldwork projects led to extensive publications.

Because of insufficient funding, the Byzantine Institute officially terminated its administrative and fieldwork operations in 1962 and transferred its assets to Dumbarton Oaks. In January 1963, Dumbarton Oaks and the Trustees of Harvard University assumed all fieldwork activities previously initiated by the Institute. Dumbarton Oaks also directed and sponsored new fieldwork projects in Turkey, such as: the excavation of the Church of St. Polyeuktos at Saraçhane from 1964 to 1969;¹³ the excavations at Kalenderhane Camii from 1966 to 1978;¹⁴ the study of the monastery of St. Abercius at Kurşunlu (Elegmi) in Bithynia from 1962¹⁵ to 1972;¹⁶ and the restoration of the Church of St. Nicholas of Myra in 1968.¹⁷ Other fieldwork projects were

carried out in Cyprus, including: the church of the Holy Apostles at Perachorio from 1954 to 1960;¹⁸ the north church of St. John Chrysostomos monastery at Koutsovendis from 1963 to 1969;¹⁹ the monastery of Hagios Neophytos near Paphos from 1963 to 1970;²⁰ the castle of Saranda Kolonnes, also in Paphos, from 1970 to 1983;²¹ the Church of the Panagia Phorviotissa²² at Asinou from 1965 to 1968;²³ the Church of the Panagia tou Arakas near Lagoudera from 1968 to 1973;²⁴ the Church of the Panagia Amasgou at Monagri from 1969 to 1972;²⁵ the church of the Panagia Kanakaria at Lythrankomi from 1952 to 1970;²⁶ the church Panagia Angeloktistos in Kiti in ca. 1970;²⁷ and the Episcopal Basilica of Kourion from 1974 to 1979.²⁸ During this period, two additional fieldwork projects were undertaken: excavations at Bargala in Macedonia from 1970 to 1971²⁹ and the survey project at Dibsi Faraj in Syria from 1972 to 1974.³⁰

The Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks staff members also documented many Byzantine sites outside of the official fieldwork and excavation projects between the 1940s and 1980s.

ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION

Acquisition Information: The fieldwork records and papers of the Byzantine Institute were transferred to Dumbarton Oaks in two shipments in the 1950s and were initially stored in various locations, including Paul Underwood's office, the Dumbarton Oaks Archives, and the Research Library. The first shipment in May 1952 came from the Byzantine Institute Library in Paris and included archaeological papers, notebooks, photographs, negatives, diagrams, and drawings. In January 1957, the second shipment, also from the Byzantine Institute Library in Paris, contained plans and drawings from the Red Sea Monasteries, cramp charts from Hagia Sophia, films, negatives, Coptic textiles, and specimens of mosaic cubes. In December 1995, Dumbarton Oaks staff discovered that 14 fieldwork notebooks were stored at the American Research Institute in Turkey (ARIT-Istanbul). In January 1997, the transfer of the notebooks from ARIT to Dumbarton Oaks was approved by the Board of Directors and Anthony Greenwood, Director of ARIT-Istanbul.

In the mid-1990s, Professor Bentley Layton³¹ returned watercolor copies of the frescoes at the Monastery of St. Anthony in Egypt, which he had requested in order to conduct a photographic survey of Coptic paintings in churches with Fr. Leroy and Professor Paul van Moorsel in Egypt. Between 1993 and 2012, ICFA received portions of the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks fieldwork files from the Dumbarton Oaks Archives and Research Library. At the time of receipt, items were arranged in folders in alphabetical order by the name of the individual, institution, or project. Overall, because there is little documentation, it is difficult to determine the collection's overall acquisition history.

Processing Information: Inventory, collection arrangement, and processing were initially undertaken by Jeff Schlosberg, former intern, between 1981 and 1982. The collection was organized in chronological order and then by site. Between 1990s and 2000s, the collection was re-organized and re-processed by former staff members and interns of ICFA, including Natalia Teteriatnikov, Gerrianne Schaad, and Rebecca Bruner. The collection was re-ordered by the author's last name and then by location.

In the summer of 2010, ICFA Archivist Rona Razon, Anna McWilliams, and Sharon Ke (former ICFA interns) completed digitization of the Kariye Camii black-and- white photographic prints to provide better access to the images. They have been cataloged in ICFA's legacy cataloging software called OLIVIA.

In September 2010, Razon and former Archivist Assistant Laurian Douthett evaluated the existing finding aid and collection arrangement. ICFA staff decided to re-organize the collection, once again, in chronological order and then by site, based on Schlossberg's inventory and the original transfer lists from the Byzantine Institute Library in Paris. ICFA staff believed that the collection should be organized chronologically or by the order of fieldwork projects in order to reassemble the original arrangement and to fully document the Institute's administrative and fieldwork history. Furthermore, folder titles now reflect the original titles generated by the Byzantine Institute fieldworkers and supplied titles created by the ICFA staff. In February 2011, Douthett identified the "North Africa boxes" within this collection, as well as the Underwood files in the summer of 2011. Because both groups of materials do not relate to the fieldwork history of the Byzantine Institute and/or Dumbarton Oaks, ICFA removed these materials from this collection. The "North Africa boxes" are now incorporated in the Dumbarton Oaks Research Archive, ca. 1940s (MS.BZ.018), and the Underwood documents are now part of a separate collection entitled Paul Underwood Research Papers and Project Materials on the Reconstruction of the church of the Holy Apostles in Constantinople, ca. 1936-1950s (MS.BZ.019).

Collection assessment, arrangement, inventory, and a draft finding aid were completed in September 2012 by Razon and Douthett. Archival processing was completed by former Archivist Assistant Elizabeth Bayley in February 2013. The finding aid was edited by Rona Razon, ICFA Manager Shalimar White, former Byzantine Assistant Curator Günder Varinlioğlu, and Byzantine Research Associate Fani Gargova, and was finalized in April 2013.

In February 2014, Gargova, and Megan Cook, ICFA Research Associate, completed digitization of the Red Sea Monasteries photographs from the Site Books nos. 18-20 to provide better access to the images.

Conditions on Access and Use: Access to the collection is unrestricted. It is available for research purposes. Duplication of the collection may be governed by copyright and other restrictions.

COLLECTION ARRANGEMENT

Based on the method of creation, medium, and fieldwork order, the collection is divided into two (2) main subgroups: Administrative Records and Fieldwork Papers. These subgroups are split into multiple series and the contents are arranged in chronological order and alphabetical order, if the author's name exists. The dates listed in the finding aid are inclusive of the dates indicated on the archival items. Some dates, however, are based on Jeff Schlosberg's 1981-1982 inventory and marked on the versos of individual items, especially if the item has no original date. For the technical dates of each fieldwork project, see ICFA's "History of the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks Projects." There is an Addendum, which contains photographs created by the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks staff that were found in ICFA's Backlog, as well as related research materials compiled by ICFA staff.

SUBGROUP 01: ADMINISTRATIVE RECORDS

Focuses on the administrative and financial activities of the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks between the 1930s and 1980s. Letters, bank statements, and logbooks document the organizations' administrative and fieldwork history, from the formation of the Byzantine Institute to its dissolution and to its transfer to Dumbarton Oaks. Subgroup I is divided into four (4) series and arranged by medium (or type of item) in chronological order.

SERIES 01: CORRESPONDENCE, ca. 1920s-2000s

Contains correspondence and administrative records created and compiled by the organizations' fieldwork directors and staff members. This series documents day-to-day administrative operations, as well as matters related to staffing, grant proposals, and publication of fieldwork projects from the 1920s to 2000s. Series I is arranged in chronological order. Folders may contain additional correspondents than the ones named in the folder titles.

SERIES 02: FINANCIAL RECORDS, ca. 1930s-1960s

Contains financial reports, logbooks, bank statements, vouchers, and checks. This series documents the financial history of the fieldwork projects executed by the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks between the 1930s and 1960s. Series II is arranged by the method of creation in

chronological order (for instance, the vouchers from the Paris Office are grouped together in sequential order).

SERIES 03: LOGBOOKS, ca. 1930s-1960s

Contains logbooks of purchases for the Byzantine Institute Library in Paris between the 1930s and 1950s, which record the resources used by Institute staff and researchers. This series also contains records of visitors to Kariye Camii, Istanbul, during the 1950s and 1960s. Series III is arranged by the method of creation in sequential order.

SERIES 04: PUBLICATION MATERIALS, ca. 1930s-1960s

Contains published articles by Thomas Whittemore and other authors about the art and architecture of Hagia Sophia. Series IV is roughly organized in chronological order.

SUBGROUP 02: FIELDWORK PAPERS

Highlights the research conducted by the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks fieldwork directors and staff on Byzantine art and architecture and their fieldwork projects at Byzantine sites, such as Hagia Sophia, Kariye Camii, Kalenderhane Camii, Bargala, and others, between the 1930s and 1980s. The materials also record the fieldworkers' day-to-day work and techniques employed on site. Subgroup II is divided into five (5) series and organized by medium (or type of item) in chronological order.

SERIES 01: FIELDWORK NOTEBOOKS AND RESEARCH NOTES, ca. 1920s-1970s

Documents the conservation, restoration, survey, and research conducted by the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks fieldwork directors and staff, including Thomas Whittemore, Paul Underwood, Nicholas Kluge, Richard A. Gregory, Ernest Hawkins, and others. The contents include fieldwork notebooks, research and bibliographic notes, drawings, sketches, charts, and ground plans from the fieldwork projects conducted in the locations listed below. Series I is divided into four (4) subseries and arranged by site, order of fieldwork project, and alphabetical order, if the author's name exists.

SERIES 02: FIELDWORK REPORTS AND DRAFTS FOR PUBLICATIONS

Contains fieldwork reports, notes, and drafts for publications on Hagia Sophia, Kariye Camii, and Kalenderhane, written between the 1930s and 2000s. Series II is organized in chronological order.

SERIES 03: FIELDWORK DRAWINGS AND TRACINGS

Contains drawings, sketches of inscriptions, and rubbings (mason's marks), which were created between the 1930s and 1950s in Hagia Sophia and Kariye Camii. Series III is arranged by medium and site in sequential order.

SERIES 04: OVERSIZE DRAWINGS AND RESEARCH MATERIALS

Contains original and color reproductions of watercolor paintings from the Red Sea Monasteries, which document the Byzantine Institute's campaign to study and record the wall paintings in the monasteries of St. Anthony and St. Paul. It also includes architectural drawings, tracings, drawings, charts, ground plans, and inscriptions from Hagia Sophia, Kariye Camii, and Fethiye Camii. SUBGROUP 03: FIELDWORK PHOTOGRAPHY

Contains photographs, photo albums, and 16mm motion picture films. The photographs and films were produced during the fieldwork campaigns at Hagia Sophia, Kariye Camii, and other sites in Istanbul, Cyprus, Macedonia and Syria, from the 1930s to 1980s. They document the fieldworkers' conservation and restoration techniques and highlight various examples of Byzantine art and architecture.

SERIES 01: PHOTOGRAPHIC DOCUMENTATION

SUBSERIES 01: Monasteries of Saint Anthony and Saint Paul, Egypt

Photographs depict the Byzantine Institute's inaugural fieldwork project, an expedition led by Thomas Whittemore to Egypt in 1930, to conduct studies of wall paintings at the Coptic Monasteries of Saint Anthony and Saint Paul near the Red Sea. The team included the architect Oliver Barker, the painter Vladimir Netchetailov, the photographer Kazazian, and the epigrapher Alexandre Piankoff. This inaugural project lasted through early 1931. The photographs document the architecture, wall paintings, watercolor reproductions of the wall paintings, manuscripts, the local environment, and the monastery inhabitants.

SUBSERIES 02: Hagia Sophia, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs comprehensively document the conservation and restoration of the original mosaics of Hagia Sophia in Istanbul, Turkey, from 1931-1960. Images document the architecture, sculpture, decorative motifs, uncovering of the mosaics, conservation techniques, conserved mosaics, detail views of iconography, architectural light studies, and fieldworkers.

SUBSERIES 03: Kariye Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs comprehensively document the conservation and restoration of the original mosaics and frescoes of Kariye Camii, or the Church of Our Saviour of the Monastery of the Chora, in Istanbul, Turkey, from 1947-1963. Fieldwork was overseen by Thomas Whittemore and later by Paul Underwood. Ernest Hawkins was assistant field director and worked on mosaic conservation, repairing the roof, bricks, and earthquake damage, with the assistance of Lawrence Majewski. Carroll Wales was in charge of fresco conservation, mostly assisted by Constantine Tsaousis and Charles Tauss. Images depict the architecture, before and after the uncovering of the mosaics and frescoes, conservation techniques, excavation, structural repairs, and fieldworkers.

SUBSERIES 04: Fethiye Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the architecture, and mosaic and structural restoration work at the Fethiye Camii, formerly the Church of St. Mary Pammakaristos, in Istanbul, Turkey, 1949-1963. Cyril Mango and Ernest J.W. Hawkins reported on the field work findings.

SUBSERIES 05: "Etyemez Fresco", Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the transfer and conservation of the "Etyemez fresco" (also described as the "Samatya fresco") in 1957-1958, near Yedikule in Istanbul. The fresco, depicting the Virgin and Child, was discovered in a small apse on a property slated for demolition in the Samatya neighborhood at the corner of Samatya Caddesi and Etyemez Tekke Sokaği, and was quickly surveyed, transferred to a new armature, and moved to the Hagia Sophia Museum. The work was executed by Byzantine Institute staff Lawrence Majewski, Carroll Wales and Constantine Tsaousis.

SUBSERIES 06: "Ramazanoğlu excavation", İstanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the conservation of frescoes near Hagia Eirene (also known as the "Ramazanoğlu" excavations), initially found during excavations overseen by Hagia Sophia Museum director Muzaffer Ramazanoğlu in 1946-1947, and later conserved under the supervision of the next museum director

Feridun Dirimtekin from 1958-1961. The work was executed by Byzantine Institute staff Carroll Wales and Constantine Tsaousis.

SUBSERIES 07: Hagia Euphemia, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the cleaning and consolidation of the frescoes of the Martyrium of St. Euphemia, which had deteriorated since their discovery during excavations in 1941-42 by Alfons Maria Schneider. The Byzantine Institute assisted the conservation during their 1958 field season.

SUBSERIES 08: Kilise Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs depict the architecture and remaining mosaics of the former church. The level of the Byzantine Institute's involvement in this project conducted in collaboration with other institutions is currently not known.

SUBSERIES 09: Zeyrek Kilise Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the architecture and restoration work at Zeyrek Camii, formerly the Church of Christ Pantocrator, in Istanbul, Turkey, 1953-1962. The Byzantine Institute, under the direction of Paul Underwood, conducted an architectural survey, analysis, and complete cleaning and restoration of the floor pavement.

SUBSERIES 10: Fenari Isa Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document the architectural sculpture and restoration work at Fenari Isa Camii, also known as the Monastery of Lips, in Istanbul, Turkey, 1959-1964. The work mostly involved structural improvements to the church buildings. By arrangement with the Turkish authorities, Ernest Hawkins, Cyril Mango and Arthur H.S. Megaw closely examined the frescoes, sculpture, funerary inscriptions, and excavated the foundation of the church.

SUBSERIES 11: Holy Apostles, Perachorio, Cyprus

Photographs document the treatment of frescoes in the summer of 1959, when the Byzantine Institute agreed to lend the services of their Istanbul staff to the Department of Antiquities, under Arthur H.S. Megaw. The work was completed by Lawrence Majewski, Ernest Hawkins and Constantine Tsaousis.

SUBSERIES 12: Enkleistra of Neophytos Enkleistos, Paphos, Cyprus

Photographs document restoration work carried out at the rock-cut Monastery of Hagios Neophytos near the town of Paphos (in the district of Paphos), Cyprus, 1962-1966, 1968-1971. The restoration project was directed by Dumbarton Oaks

staff Ernest Hawkins, and Cyril Mango, with the Cyprus Department of Antiquities. Much of the restoration work and photography was done by Yani Makridis. Kostas Zaferiades also assisted with the painting conservation.

SUBSERIES 13: Monastery of Hagios Chrysostomos, Koutsovendis, Cyprus

Photographs document the restoration work at the Church of St. John Chrysostom in the town of Koutsovendis (in the district of Kyrenia), Cyprus, under the supervision of Dumbarton Oaks and the Cyprus Department of Antiquities, 1963-1964, 1967-1969. Painting conservation was largely done in 1968, followed by a photography campaign in 1969, along with measurements and studies. Supervision of the work was carried out by Ernest Hawkins, and most of the cleaning, conservation and photography was done by Yani Makridis; photographs were also taken by Hawkins and Cyril Mango. Descriptive notes on the paintings were taken in 1969 by Susan Boyd. Architectural drawings were done by Richard Anderson. Arthur H.S. Megaw is credited for initiating the project.

SUBSERIES 14: Church of Panagia Phorbiotissa, Asinou, Cyprus

Photographs document the restoration work of the frescoes at the Church of the Panagia Phorbiotissa in the town of Asinou (in the district of Nicosia), Cyprus, 1965-1967, 1971. With the permission of the Bishop of Kyrenia and the Department of Antiquities, a Dumbarton Oaks expedition began in March 1965, to clean and preserve the wall paintings in the church. Work was under the alternate direction of Ernest Hawkins and David Winfield, aided by June Winfield, Kostas Zaferiades, and Yani Makridis.

SUBSERIES 15: Church of Panagia tou Arakos, Lagoudera, Cyprus

Photographs document the restoration work of the frescoes at the Church of the Panagia tou Arakos near the town of Lagoudera (in the district of Nicosia), Cyprus. In April, 1968, a Dumbarton Oaks expedition began to clean and conserve the paintings in the church. Work was carried out with the permission of the Bishop of Kyrenia and the Department of Antiquities of Cyprus until 1973. David C. Winfield was field director and the foreman throughout the work was Kostas Zaferiades. Haralambos Haralambides and June C. Winfield also assisted the project.

SUBSERIES 16: Church of Panagia Amasgou, Monagri, Cyprus

Photographs document the restoration work of the frescoes at the Church of the Panagia Amasgou in the town of Monagri (in the district of Limassol), Cyprus. In 1969, with the permission of the Bishop of Kition and the cooperation of the Department of Antiquities of Cyprus, Dumbarton Oaks was granted a permit for the cleaning, preservation, and survey of the paintings in the monastery church. Work was carried out under the supervision of David Winfield with the assistance

of Yani Makrides and local employees. Richard Anderson joined the work at the end of 1969 and in 1970 to draw a plan and elevation, and to photograph the project.

SUBSERIES 17: Church of Panagia Angeloktistos, Kiti, Cyprus

Photographs depict mosaics that were cleaned and conserved by Ernest J.W. Hawkins in collaboration with the Department of Antiquities in Cyprus and with the support of Dumbarton Oaks, ca. 1974.

SUBSERIES 18: Church of Saint Polyeuktos, Saraçhane, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs depict site finds from excavations, as well as views of the church ruins when they were first discovered. Dumbarton Oaks and the Istanbul Archaeological Museum collaborated in a limited excavation in 1964, and later campaigns in 1965-1968, reported on by R. Martin and Elizabeth Harrison. Most of the excavation documentation has been deposited at the University of Oxford School of Archaeology archives.

SUBSERIES 19: Kalenderhane Camii, Istanbul, Turkey

Photographs document some of the building conservation of the former Monastery of Christ Akataleptos. The project involved Cecil L. Striker and Y. Dogan Kuban, representing Dumbarton Oaks, and the Department of the History of Architecture of the Istanbul Technical University, respectively.

SUBSERIES 20: Church of Panagia Kanakaria, Lythrangomi, Cyprus

Photographs depict the apse conch mosaics of the church. Dumbarton Oaks sponsored fieldwork took place here around 1969-1970 but the project was terminated, and the nature of the fieldwork is not known.

SUBSERIES 21: Bargala, Macedonia

Photographs document archaeological excavation work at the Byzantine site of Bargala, Macedonia, also known as Goren Kozjak. From 1966-1969 the Archaeological Museum of Skopje in cooperation with the National Museum of Štip carried out excavations and investigations in the valley of the Bregalnica river. This work was continued in the summer of 1970 by a joint Yugoslav-American expedition funded by the Smithsonian's Foreign Currency Program. The American team comprised of Dumbarton Oaks professors Cyril Mango and Ihor Ševčenko, as well as Arthur Megaw, Richard Anderson, Susan Boyd, David Chodoff, Louis Drewer, and John Rosser. Blaga Aleksova was one of the Yugoslav team members. Images include various site plans, and some general views of the site and exterior views of St. George church, and the excavation trenches.

SUBSERIES 22: Saranda Kolonnes near Paphos, Cyprus

Photographs document various views of the remains of the castle site. Saranda Kolonnes was initially investigated by Arthur Megaw under the Cyprus Department of Antiquities in 1957-1959. Subsequent excavations followed in 1966-1967 sponsored by the British School at Athens, and additionally by Dumbarton Oaks in 1970-1971. Work resumed in 1981 by the same sponsors, and was joined by Boston College and Earthwatch in 1982-1983.

SUBSERIES 23: Dibsi Faraj, and other sites, Syria

Photographs depict various sites in Syria by a survey team from the Dumbarton Oaks Center for Byzantine Studies and the Kelsey Museum of Archeology, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, who were invited by the Syrian Department of Antiquities to examine the region of the Euphrates valley which would inevitably be flooded by the construction of the Tabqa Dam, and to select a site most suitable for three years of archaeological investigation. The survey was led by Cyril Mango of Dumbarton Oaks, and George Mendenhall of the Kelsey Museum, and the site of Dibsi Faraj was selected for fieldwork between 1971-1974. This subseries documents 45 different sites, including Dibsi Faraj, but the majority of the Dibsi Faraj documentation has been deposited at the Department of Archaeology at Durham University. Aerial photography and site plans of Dibsi Faraj were executed by Richard Anderson.

SUBSERIES 24: Episcopal Basilica of Kourion, Episkopi, Cyprus

Photographs document the last stage of excavations led by Arthur H.S. Megaw of Dumbarton Oaks with the full cooperation from the Cyprus Department of Antiquities from 1973-1975. Megaw was formerly the Director of Antiquities for the Government of Cyprus and worked on two earlier campaigns at Kourion in 1956 and 1959; the 1959 campaign ended due to the establishment of the Republic of Cyprus in 1960. Megaw was urged to continue his work by the successive Antiquities directors Dr. P. Dikaios and Dr. V. Karageorghis, and in 1973 Dumbarton Oaks started sponsorship. In addition, there are many images documenting the marble and champlevé (enamel inlay) revetment fragments housed at the nearby Sarayia Chapel, photographed by Richard Anderson.

SUBSERIES 25: Comparative Documentation

Photographs document various Byzantine monuments, examples of material culture, and scenery, throughout Turkey and the surrounding region. The Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks fieldwork staff continuously photographed subject matter during their travels and in between fieldwork projects for documentary, comparative, and research purposes.

SUBSERIES 26: Duplicate Photographs

Contains backlog materials of duplicate photographs that were created by the Byzantine Institute and Dumbarton Oaks staff during fieldwork in Turkey, Cyprus, Macedonia, and other sites.
