RELATING TO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

Establishes an excise tax on basalt cinder and trap rock sold by wholesalers or dealers. Provides that the excise tax is paid into the Pacific international space center for exploration systems special fund. Requires moneys in excess of \$1,000,000 in the Pacific international space center for exploration systems special fund to lapse to the

general fund.

HB 521 Status	RELATING TO BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT. Establishes the high-growth grant program and special fund to provide grants to qualified businesses for certain business development activities. Appropriations.	EDB, FIN
HB 1327 Status	RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION. Appropriates funds for the Manufacturing Development Program.	EDB, FIN
HB 593 Status	RELATING TO RESEARCH ACTIVITIES. Provides that, notwithstanding provisions of the Internal Revenue Code to the contrary, the amount of the state tax credit for research activities shall be calculated based on all qualified research expenses for the taxable year. Appropriates funds for a compliance specialist position within DOTAX to assist with administration of the tax credit.	EDB, FIN
HB 594 Status	RELATING TO THE MARITIME INDUSTRY GRANT PROGRAM. Establishes within the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism the Maritime Industry Grant Program to enhance maritime productivity and workforce development.	EDB, FIN
HB 960 Status	RELATING TO THE MULTINATIONAL LUNAR ARCHITECTURE ALLIANCE. Establishes the Multinational Lunar Architecture Alliance to hold an International Lunar Development Summit to, among other things, identify the major goals and challenges associated with prototype lunar architecture.	EDB, FIN
HB 1326 Status	RELATING TO WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. Appropriates funds for a basalt rebar market study.	EDB, FIN
HB 1449 Status	RELATING TO INNOVATION BUSINESS INTERACTION. Establishes the impact loan fund for Hawaii (HI-impact loan program) in the High Technology Development Corporation to support dual-use technology small businesses. Establishes the HI-impact special fund. Appropriates funds.	EDB, FIN
HB 591 Status	RELATING TO THE CAPITAL INFRASTRUCTURE TAX CREDIT. Includes structures, machinery, equipment, and capital assets in the definition of capital infrastructure costs for the Capital Infrastructure Tax Credit. Sets cap on credit per taxable year per qualified infrastructure tenant. Specifies that excess tax credits may be carried forward. Recaptures credit if qualified infrastructure tenant fails to relocate within a certain period of time after executing a lease with the Department of Transportation. Specifies taxpayer reporting requirements.	EDB, FIN

HB 1036 Status

RELATING TO THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

EDB, FIN

Changes the name of the High Technology Development Corporation to Hawaii Technology Development Corporation and repeals the Hawaii Software Service Center that is established within the High Technology Development Corporation. Effective 7/01/2017.
