<u>HB 810</u> Status	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Allows EUTF to resolve impasse contribution disputes through binding arbitration.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 310</u> Status	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Authorizes a nonvoting county representative to participate in collective bargaining negotiations for county employees. Reduces the number of votes the governor has from 4 to 1 for negotiations involving police officers and firefighters. Requires the respective Mayor to provide timely collective bargaining negotiation updates to the applicable county council.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 332</u> Status	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING. Establishes the right for a representative of each county council to be present as a non-voting participant in negotiations with bargaining units if the relevant county has employees in the particular bargaining unit. Requires the mayor or mayor's representative to provide timely updates relating to bargaining unit negotiations to the county councils. Amends the number of votes allotted to the Governor for collective bargaining negotiations with units (11) and (12).	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 811</u> Status	RELATING TO SALARIES. Repeals payroll day for public officers and employees by requiring them to be paid pursuant to a predicted payroll schedule, rather than an after-the-fact payroll schedule.	LAB, FIN
<u>HB 110</u> Status	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS. Makes appropriation for the public employment cost items of and cost adjustments for employees of the various legislative agencies. Appropriates funds.	LAB, FIN
