«An enchanting sexagenarian»



In a few weeks, February 10th to be precise, the date of the first match of its great history between Egypt and Sudan, in Khartoum, the Africa Cup of Nations will be celebrating its 60th anniversary.

Just how much time has elapsed since the debut of a folly adventure initiated by a handful of visionaries. It required a good dose of audacity for Africa to brave the reluctances and finally form a Confederation. The continent only had a few free and independent countries, amongst which were South Africa, Egypt, Ethiopia and Sudan. And yet, they stood firm and eventually won. At this time in history, we should recall, almost all of Africa was still under the grip of colonial powers. Since then, it has been nothing but challenges and difficulties as well. But today, our collective pride is that through our resilience, determination, willingness, and unity, and the support of diverse partners, we have become the third major football event worldwide.

The spectacle that our players offer is appreciated; the images of the Africa Cup of Nations are broadcast on the five continents; and the premiums distributed to

participating national teams are growing exponentially. Since 1996, with 16 teams at the final phase, we have contributed in developing infrastructure, though not just sporting infrastructure, in host countries. It is still the same this year. And we know that other countries eagerly desire to one day host our most prestigious competition.

The 31st edition of the AFCON will be marked by the great comeback of Uganda, which has been absent for nearly 40 years; Egypt, record seven time winners, which after the unprecedented triple win, 2006-2008-2010, never qualified for the final phase of the tournament.

In our view however, the most symbolic aspect of what is the Confederation Africaine de Football, is the presence of Guinea Bissau, the newest-comer on the continental stage. A small country of 36,000 km², a population of about 1.7 million inhabitants, it made waves by eliminating Zambia, 2012 champions, and Congo.

Like the famous Ivorian proverb, "little by little, one becomes less small". He who can wait, will reap the benefits of patience. Guinea Bissau is the 39th member of the 54 National Associations to participate at the final tournament of the AFCON. They join Botswana, Cape Verde, Equatorial Guinea and Niger, who made similar headlines in recent past. It is one of the successes of African football. Each one has its place among the elite and to us it is a good reason for contentment.

And now to the competition, Total AFCON Gabon 2017, all our experts agree it promises to be quite open, without any real favourites, because our football is much more balanced now than it appeared.

Happy AFCON to everyone!

CAF is the governing body of African Football and was founded in 1957. The founding members are Egypt, Sudan, Ethiopia and South Africa. CAF 54-member organization is based Egypt. The wheels that led to the birth of CAF were actually set in motion outside Africa, in Lisbon Portugal in June 1956.

The Portuguese capital was playing host to the FIFA Congress, and it was the four African nations in attendance (Egypt, Sudan, Ethiopia and South Africa) who carried the African confederation to the baptismal front by taking advantage of that gathering to discuss matters of common interest.

Following the Congress, the four nations resolved to convene again in Khartoum in February 1957 to draft statutes and to discuss staging the first Africa Cup of Nations.

Meanwhile, the 1954 FIFA Congress in Berne, Switzerland had already voted to recognize Africa as a confederation. This gave the continent the right to appoint its first representative to the FIFA Executive Committee and the member was Engineer Abdelaziz Abdallah Salem of Egypt.

CAF's constitutional act was signed in Khartoum, Sudan on 8 June 1957 and Abdallah Salem was named the Confederation's first president.

On 10 February, after CAF's constitutive assembly, the Sudanese capital witnessed the birth of the first Africa Cup of Nations which was won by Egypt. It would prove to be the start of an exhilarating adventure and one that is still continuing today with countless unforgettable moments along the way to help define the characteristics and traits associated with African football.



Official Logo

The logo of the competition represents African football surrounded by a dome, stylistically inspired by African culture to convey enthusiasm, celebration and fervor.

This dome seems to rise, thus symbolizing the scope and grandeur of African football.

Official Mascot

Samba is a name that evokes the celebration, sport, and in particular football. Samba is the panther that sleeps in every Gabonese. It's everyone at once, the wife, the son, the daughter, the father... Because it is unifying, Samba represents the very spirit of the Gabonese family



Official Trophy

Throughout the history of the Nations Cup, three different trophies have been awarded to the winners of the competition. The original trophy was made of silver and named Abdelaziz Abdallah Salem Trophy, after the first CAF president.

Official Ball



Taking inspiration from the history of the tournament and its famously passionate fans. The distinctive Orange and Green colouring on the ball represents the contrasting landscapes of the continent. The ball will be officially presented during the tournament in Gabon.

After the spectacular success of the first ever official ball for CAF, the “Wawa Aba” in Ghana 2008, followed by “Jabulani- Angola” in Angola 2010, “Comoequa” in 2012, “KATLEGO” in South Africa 2013 and finally “MARHABA” in Equatorial Guinea 2015, we are proud to present to you the CAF New official ball for African football starting from January 2017.

The CAF Official Match Ball, like its counterparts in regional and international tournaments, has gone through a thorough testing process to make sure that it is suited to the playing conditions during the tournament.

- Zero water uptake and consistency in wet and dry conditions
- Foam and rubber inter lining increases power and control
- Textured surface combined with a 12 panel construction for optimum aerodynamic control.

The CAF Official Match Ball bears the FIFA Quality Pro mark, the highest possible FIFA accreditation.

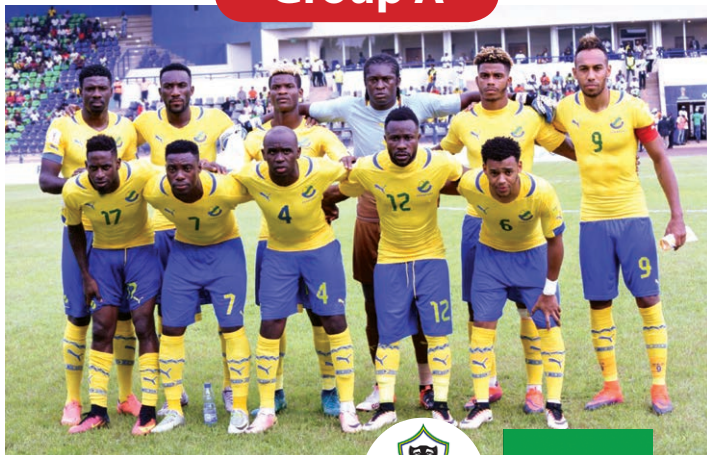

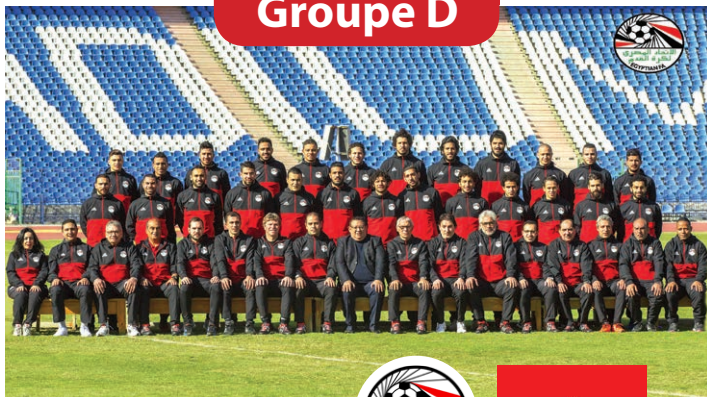

HISTORY OF THE AFRICA CUP OF NATIONS

AFCON, a symbol



It is now the 3rd world football competition in terms of its cumulative TV audience, after the FIFA World Cup and the European Championship (Euro).

The qualification phase was played following a system of direct elimination, with away and return leg matches.

The Africa Cup of Nations is held every two years. The number of participants at the final phase, which is ever increasing, is 16 since 1996.

In 1992, the qualification phase became a mixed phase following an addition of a pool system to the direct elimination system. The number of participants, which was eight (8) in 1986, rose to twelve (12).

The first edition was played in 1957 with competing countries: Egypt, Sudan, Ethiopia and South Africa. The latter was later disqualified due to the politics of racial segregation – known as apartheid that was going on in the country. In fact, South Africa refused to send a multi-racial team to the competition, and was excluded. This directly qualified Ethiopia for the final where they were beaten by Egypt, which won over Sudan at the semi-finals. This first final of the Africa Cup of Nations, which ended in 4-0 for Egypt was played on Saturday, 16 February 1957 in Khartoum, Sudan.

In 1996, the number of participants at the finals went from 12 to 16 with the return of South Africa into the African football family, and they were also the host.

The 16 finalists are divided into 4 pools of 4 teams each. The first two from each pool qualify for the quarter finals. The four victorious teams at the quarter finals will play the semi-finals, from where the two finalists will emerge, who will confront each other for the champion to stand out.

In 1962, the tournament was divided into two phases: the qualification phase and the final phase.

The winner of the Africa Cup of Nations represents the Continent at the FIFA Confederations Cup.

Nigeria – unusual champions

Nigeria won three titles (1980, 1994, 2013); played in four finals (1984, 1988, 1990, 2000); finished seven times in 3rd place (1976, 1978, 1992, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2010); was eliminated after the first round (1982) and once in the quarterfinals (2008).

The semi-final clash against Ghana in 2010 in Luanda was their 12th at the last four.

Before 1976, Nigeria had played one final phase of the Africa Cup of Nations in 1963 in Ghana.

No other country can boast of such permanence at the summit of African football.

Three winners to have won all matches

Ghana in 1965 (3 matches), Algeria in 1990 (5 matches) and Egypt in 2010 (6 matches) are the only teams to have won the title by winning all their matches.

Longest match

DR Congo (Zaire) vs. Zambia (Egypt 1974). The final was replayed after a 2-2 draw after extra time in the first meeting. DR Congo won 2-0 in the replay after a total of 210 minutes of play, thus three and half hours.

Biggest attendance

Appearances

Thirty-eight (38) countries have participated in at least one edition of the Africa Cup of Nations since its inception in 1957. Egypt holds the record with 22 appearances followed by Cote d'Ivoire (20), Ghana (19), Nigeria (17), Cameroon, DR Congo and Zambia (16), Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia (15), Senegal (12), Ethiopia and Guinea (10), Burkina Faso (9), South Africa, Mali, Sudan and Togo (8), Angola (7) Congo (6), Kenya and Uganda (5), Gabon and Mozambique (4), Benin (3), Liberia, Libya, Malawi, Namibia, Niger, Sierra Leone and Zimbabwe (2), Botswana, Cape Verde, Equatorial Guinea, Mauritius, Rwanda and Tanzania (1).

Most consecutive appearances

Egypt played in Angola 2010, making it 15 consecutive appearances since 1984. In 2004, Cote d'Ivoire made 10 successive appearances (1984 to 2002). South Africa failed to qualify for 2010 edition in Angola, the first they missed out since winning the title in 1996.

Victorious host countries

On 11 occasions, the host country have emerged winners; Egypt (1959, 1986, 2006), Ethiopia (1962), Ghana (1963 and 1978), Sudan (1970), Nigeria (1980), Algeria (1990), South Africa (1996) and Tunisia (2004).

Champions have defended titles on five occasions

Egypt defended the title in 1959 after winning in it 1957, and replicated the record in 2006-2008. Ghana won it 1963 and 1965 and Cameroon in 2000 and 2002.

Ghana also played four finals in a row from 1963 to 1970, winning the first two and losing the last two. Cameroon have played in three consecutive finals (1984, 1986, 1988) and Egypt (1957, 1959 and 1962; and 2006, 2008 and 2010).

Cameroon and Nigeria have clashed three times in the final

Cameroon always won; 3-1 in 1984 in Abidjan, 1-0 1988 in Casablanca and on penalties (4-3) in 2000 in Lagos.

Finals decided by penalties

Eight finals have been decided via penalties with the most memorable being the 1992 final in Dakar between Côte d'Ivoire and Ghana which saw the Ivorians emerging winners (11-10) after a total of twenty-four attempts. In 2015, the two teams faced off in the final again, with the Ivorians again winning 9-8 on penalties.

Four finals, no goals for Cote d'Ivoire

Côte d'Ivoire has played in four finals, winning two and losing the other two. On all four occasions, the match had to be decided via penalties after a barren draw in regulation time. The victories were against Ghana in 1992 (11-10) and 2015 (9-8), whilst the losses were in 2006 against Egypt (2-4) and 2012 against Zambia (7-8).

1,000th goal

The 1,000th goal of the AFCON was scored by Nigerian Augustine 'Jay-Jay' Okocha during group phase match against South Africa in Tunisia (2004) at the Mustapha Ben Janet Stadium in Monastir.

1,500th goal

Ghana midfielder Mubarak Wakaso's goal in their semi-final against Equatorial Guinea during the 30th edition of the Africa Cup of Nations in 2015 went into history as goal number 1,500 since the creation of the tournament in 1957, and it came in the 603rd match.

Total Number of Goals

1501 goals have been scored in 606 matches since the inception of the competition, an average of 2.60 goals per game. The most goals since 1996 and the presence of 16 teams was that of 2008 in Ghana with a total of 99 goals. Only twice has the average exceeded 4 goals per game (1962 and 1963). From 1965 to 1974, the average was always greater than 3 goals per game.

Hossam Hassan (Egypt): 39 years, 5 months, and 24 days (2006)

Defender Rigobert Song still holds this record in the history of the Africa Cup of Nations. He made his debut on 13 January 1996 in Johannesburg in a defeat to South Africa (0-3). The Cameroonian played every game in its entirety, without being replaced until 17 January 2010 in Benguela. For his 36th game, he did not come into play until the 69th minute to replace his colleague, Gilles Binya.

In the jersey of the Indomitable Lions at the final tournament, he won 20 times, 8 draws and 8 losses. His team has scored 62 goals and let in 34 (2 goals conceded in their last game against Tunisia is exclusive since he was not on the field when the goals were scored).

He spent 3,201 minutes on the field including three penalty shoot-out in 2000 (Final) 2002 (final) and 2006 (quarter-final); nearly 55 hours.

In the center of the country, in Lambaréné, visitors will be able to discover the famous Dr. Albert Schweitzer hospital, Nobel Price of peace in 1952.

They will also enjoy the wonders of beauty of all different lakes around the city.





In the province of Ngounié, in the South-East of Gabon, the visitors will quiver when they will see the mythical Blue Lake, which is the real attraction of the region. A well-known legend makes this lake a very mysterious place to stand due to the disappearance of seven pygmies who all died as they wanted to take their axes which accidentally fell deep in the lake water.

Since then, the lake has become a real tourist attraction.

In Mayumba, in the extreme south of the country, the guests of Gabon will go at the discovery of this little seaside city to discover the whales and other exotic curiosities.

For the host cities of the competition, they will not be forgotten. In Oyem, the visitors will discover the wonders and beauty of MekokMekwa caverns, Nkoum mounts and the architectural constructions of Saint Therese Catholic Mission of Angone.

Near Libreville, Akanda and WongaWongue national parks, and also Pointe Denis Island will make the pleasure of our hosts. Haut-Ogooué Province, with its canyons, trays and its bridge in liana will be some of the tourist attractions.



Stadiums



Amitié Stadium (38 000 seats)

Amitié Stadium, located at Angondjé, in the North of Libreville, is the biggest stadium of the country with 38000 seats. It has been built at the occasion of the 28th edition of Africa Cup of Nations that Gabon organized in 2012 together with Equatorial Guinea. This stadium, built by the Chinese company Shangai Construction Group, has been inaugurated on November 27, 2011, at the occasion of the friendly match Gabon vs China (U20).

Amitié Stadium has been chosen to host the matches of Group A (Gabon, Cameroun, Burkina Faso, Guinea-Bissau), the opening match, one quarter final, one semi-final and the final of the 31st edition of Total Africa Cup of Nations GABON 2017.





Renovation Stadium (20.000 seats)

Franceville Rénovation Stadium, with a capacity of 20 000 seats, has been restored and enlarged between 2009 and 2011 in order to host the matches 2012 edition of Africa Cup of Nations. It has been inaugurated on January 16, 2012 during the friendly match Gabon vs Sudan (0-0).

The stadium has been chosen to host the matches of Group B (Algeria, Tunisia, Senegal, and Zimbabwe), one quarter final, on Saturday January 28, 2017, between the first of Group B and the second of Group A. the stadium will also host one semi-final during this competition.



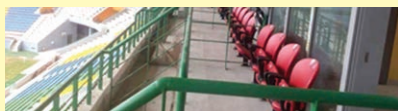


Port-Gentil Stadium (20 000 seats)

The construction of Port-Gentil Stadium, located on the road to Ntchengué, at 4km in the South of Port-Gentil city, has started on July 18, 2015.

Built by the Chinese company China State Construction Engineering Corp, this stadium, with a capacity of 20 000 seats, is a real architectural jewel by the “shapes” of its golden metallic structure.

It will host the matches of Group D (Ghana, Mali, Egypt and Uganda), one quarter final on Sunday January 29, 2017 between the first of Group D and the second of Group C. It will also host the 3rd Place match on Saturday February 04, 2017.





Oyem Stadium (20 000 seats)

The Chinese company Shanghai Construction Group started the construction of Oyem Stadium in August 2015. This stadium, with a capacity of 20 000 seats, built on a surface of 20 hectares, is located at 17km from Oyem city, on the road leading to Oyem city. It will host the matches of Group C (Ivory Coast, DRC, Morocco and Togo) and the quarter final, on Sunday January 29, 2017, between the first of Group C and the second of Group D.



The Organizing Committee



The Organizing Committee of Africa Cup of Nations GABON 2017 (COCAN GABON 2017), is the structure in charge to organize the 31st edition of Total Africa Cup of Nations GABON 2017.

Besides the Volunteers Program, this entity consists in ten commissions:

(Welcome and Protocol, Communication, Competition, Customs, Accommodation and Catering, Immigration/Airport, Marketing, Health, Safety, Transports and Logistics), each of them ruled by one President, one Vice-President and several Heads of Projects.

COCAN is ruled by an Executive Committee headed by a High-Commissioner, with two assistants and one General Coordinator.

The Communication Commission

1. Structure

Communication Commission, as the COCAN strategic organ, is ruled by a President, Pablo Mousodji Ngoma, and a Vice-President, Snella Ange PAMBO.

The Commission covers three major pools, each of them headed by a Head of Project :

- Communication
- Entertainment
- Media Operations

2. Missions

Before and during the event, the main mission of the Commission is to ensure the institutional Communication and the promotion of the event.

Its objective is to promote a domestic and international media coverage of the competition, and to favor the success of tickets sales.

The Communication Commission makes also proposals for the development of projects aiming at strengthening the image of the event.

Lastly, for the guarantee of a good coverage of the competition by the media, the Media Operations Pool of the Commission is in charge to identify the technical needs of the press, photographers, radios and televisions.

It is also in charge to plan the whole media operations and, during the competition, manage all the operational areas dedicated to media (media centers, media tribunes, press conference rooms, etc.).

Accreditation Center

Accreditations give access to the sites of the competition which will be split in different areas. The accreditation team is in charge to grant the access titles which will allow given populations to accede to useful areas in order to complete their mission. The concerned populations may include especially the players, the referees, the media, officials, staff, volunteers, providers and sponsors.

Accreditation Center of Amitié Stadium at Angondjé :

Temporary structure set up in the North-West of Amitié Stadium at Angondjé, on the outside parking. On match days, it is open from 8am until 3 hours before the Kick Off. On non-match days, it is open from 9am to 6pm. Opening date will be from January 02 to February 06, 2017.

Accreditation Center Franceville Stadium :

Temporary office located in the South of Franceville Stadium, on the parking of the train station. On match days, it is open from 8am until 3 hours before the Kick Off. On non-match days, it is open from 9am to 6pm. Opening date will be from January 06 to February 03, 2017.

Accreditation Center Oyem Stadium :

Temporary site set up in the East of Oyem Stadium. On match days, it is open from 8am until 3 hours before the Kick Off. On non-match days, it is open from 9am to 6pm. Opening date will be from January 06 to February 03, 2017.

Accreditation Center Port-Gentil Stadium :

Temporary structure set up in the North-East of Port-Gentil Stadium.

On match days, it is open from 8am until 3 hours before the Kick Off. On non-match days, it is open from 9am to 6pm. Opening date will be from January 06 to February 03, 2017.

Venues and Stadiums

LIBREVILLE

Libreville is the capital and largest city of Gabon, in west central Africa. The city is a port on the Komo River, near the Gulf of Guinea, and a trade centre for a timber region. As of 2012 its population was estimated at 797,003.

STADE DE L'AMITIÉ

- Located in Libreville, Gabon
- Hosted the AFCON final in 2012
- The stadium has a capacity of 38,000
- Built by Chinese company, Shanghai Construction Group

FRANCEVILLE

Franceville is one of the four largest cities in Gabon, with a population of around 56,000 (2010, approx.) people. It lies on the River Mpassa and at the end of the Trans-Gabon Railway and the N3 road. It grew from a village named Masuku when Pierre Savorgnan de Brazza chose it to resettle former slaves and renamed it "Francheville" (meaning "city of the freed" in French) in 1880. The city later came to be called Franceville.

STADE DE FRANCEVILLE

- Located in Franceville, Gabon
- The stadium has a capacity of 20,000 seats
- The stadium was opened in January, 2012 in time for AFCON 2012
- First game was a friendly between Gabon and Sudan

PORT GENTIL

Port-Gentil is the second-largest city of Gabon, and its leading seaport. It is the centre of Gabon's petroleum and timber industries. Although it lies inshore, the nearby mainland is a remote forest area and it is not connected by road to the rest of the nation. The city lies close to Cape Lopez, the westernmost point in Gabon

PORT GENTIL STADIUM

- Located in Port Gentil, Gabon
- The stadium has a capacity of 20,000 seats
- Has a 26-room hotel, athletics track, 2 basketball courts, 3 tennis courts, a handball court and a volleyball court

OYEM

Oyem is a town in northern Gabon.

OYEM STADIUM

- Located in Assok Ngomo, Gabon (15 km from Oyem)
- The stadium has a capacity of 20,000 seats
- Has a 28-room hotel, Athletics track, 3 tennis courts and 3 basketball courts





MEDIA OPERATIONS

CAF MEDIA CHANNEL

The CAF Media Channel will give you the latest background information, news updates on AFCON activities, the Local Organising Committee, the Host Cities, Sponsors and the Orange Africa Cup of Nations Equatorial Guinea 2015 participating teams. This is in addition to the extensive public information available on www.cafonline.com and other CAF online platforms @CAF_Online @CAF_Media and on Facebook Africa Cup of Nations Official.

Accredited media must request match tickets to gain access to the media tribune or photo areas, as well as mixed zone and press conference passes through the AFCON Media Channel, the Local Organising Committee Accreditation Office or CAF Media Officers in respective venues.

Media representatives may only access the media tribune with a valid ticket for a specific seat. Tickets will only be distributed on a match-by-match basis.

Media representative holding a confirmed allocation for a particular match but who are subsequently unable to attend, should cancel their reservation via the CAF Media Channel or the Local Organising Committee, thus allowing colleagues on the waiting list to take up spare tickets.

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation guarantees access to stadiums as well as those areas relevant to the media. Zoning of each stadium will be activated on match days and deactivated two hours after the final whistle. Please note that a media accreditation does not automatically grant access to the media tribune or the pitch, nor the press conference room or the mixed zone.

For each match, media have to apply on the AFCON Media Channel for a match ticket. For over-booked matches, there will be priority lists for media from participating teams and news agencies. However, a waiting list will be kept.

Supplementary Access Devices (SADs)

Journalists whose accreditation has been confirmed need a Supplementary Access Device (SAD) for specified areas during the Competition.

MEDIA TRIBUNE

Access to the Media Tribune is restricted to accredited journalists holding valid match ticket. Members of the media who do not collect tickets will receive a warning on the first occasion. In case of further infringement, the journalist will no longer be entitled to further match tickets. Tickets will be passed on to colleagues who have entered their names in the waiting list.

Media representative have to have to request a Match Ticket in advance on the AFCON Media Channel to receive permission to enter the Media Tribune. This has to be done for each match of the Orange Africa Cup of Nations Equatorial Guinea 2015.

Those tickets will be distributed on a match-by-match basis. For media that missed this deadline, there will be a waiting list. Media Match Tickets are distributed in the Stadium Media Centre (SMC). Radio and Television Match Tickets are distributed through SPORTFIVE Broadcast Services Team. No exception will be permitted.

A set number of photographer seats will be allocated on the stands. Non-pitch-side photo-

graphers must show a valid media match ticket to gain access to the media tribune. All match tickets and SADs have to be requested on the AFCON Media Channel and must be collected from the Stadium Media Centre (SMC).

For details please go to the accreditation section. The media tribune will have TV screens, power, Internet access and telephony.

CAPACITY

- Up to 45 Commentary Positions
- 150 - 250 written press seats with desks
- 150 - 200 written press seats without desks
- 10 - 30 photographer positions
- 20 - 30 pitch photographer positions
- All written press with desk positions and tribune photography positions will have a socket for power.
- All written press with desk positions and tribune photography positions will have free of charge Internet access and there will also be limited wireless Internet access.

PRESS CONFERENCE ROOM

A press conference will be held after each match at Orange Africa Cup of Nations Equatorial Guinea 2015. The coaches and the captain are required to attend the press conference. Members of the media will only be granted access to the press conference room if they are in possession of an accreditation and a valid SAD. Photographers are not allowed in the Press Conference Room.

In addition, there will be a daily media briefing by AFCON and the Local Organising Committee each at stadium. Please find further information including special topics and guests) on the CAF Media Channel.

For the press conference after each match, SADs will be handed out to the media (except photographers who do NOT have access to the press conference).

A decision is made between AFCON Media Officers (CMO) and Venue Media Officers (VMO) for each match. Those SADs will be distributed in the SMC for the print media (only on Match Day). SADs for TV and Radio RH should be collected from SPORTFIVE Broadcast Information Office at the Venue. NRH will not be able to attend Press Conference and Mixed Zone on Match Day.

- Limited free of charge wireless Internet access will be available.

In this area, media representatives may conduct brief interviews with individual players as they leave the stadium. One part will be reserved for print and radio journalists, another for TV. Photographers are not permitted in the mixed zone. Access to the mixed Zone will only be granted on presentation of a valid SAD.

Print Media, Radio and Television, get access to this area with a SAD (except photographers) who do NOT access the press conference). Print Media will receive tickets (only on Match Day) in the SMC. SADs for TV and Radio RH should be collected from SPORTFIVE Broadcast Information Office at the Venue. NRH will not be able to attend Press Conference and Mixed Zone on Match Day.

- Limited free of charge wireless Internet access will be available.

Only photographers and some TV crews are allowed to enter the pitch area with a special SAD. Photo Bibs will be allocated prior to the tournament. SADs for the pitch will be distributed in the SMC on match day.

The photographers will receive a photo bib in any SMC after they have received their tournament pass in the Accreditation Centre. They must wear their bib once they enter the stadiums.

Photographers working on the pitch will require for each match a field ticket with a seat number to be inserted in the bib. Only the bib together with the field ticket will provide photographers with access to the dedicated pitch area. This ticket will be distributed on match day at a specific desk of the SMC. Photographers can swap their ticket with a colleague only before the game or at half time. Pitch-side access is available two hours before kick-off. It is strictly forbidden to walk on the field of play.

Accredited photographers are only permitted to work with still cameras. There will be no exception.

Not respecting these regulations breaks the Orange Africa Cup of Nations Terms and Conditions signed by each accredited media.

Photographers have to enter the pitch through a specific entrance, which is clearly marked. For the team pictures before the match photographers have to follow the advice of AFCON Media Officer and Venue Media Officer and have to take their seats immediately after both teams have left their photo positions to line up for the match.

- All pitch side photography positions will have a socket for power.
- All pitch side photography positions will have free limited wireless Internet access.

NON-RIGHTS HOLDERS

On match days, accredited Non—Rights Holders (NRH) are only granted access to the stadiums without their equipment. Media Tribune tickets will only be granted according to availability.

Please note that there are no storage facilities for NRH equipment at the stadium. AFCON and the LOC will not take any responsibility for any left—luggage or NRH material. NRH will not be able to attend Press Conference and Mixed Zone on Match Day.

ACCREDITATION CENTERS

- There will be one accreditation centre per host city or stadium.
- All accreditation centres will be situated outside the outer security perimeter or within the proximity of the stadium, thus making for convenient and easy access.
- The Local Organising Committee takes the loss very seriously and expects the same from all accredited members of the media. In case of loss, please take the following action.
- Report the loss to the police

The nearest police station should be contacted as soon as possible to report the loss of any accreditation. The authorities will issue an official certificate of loss.

Report the loss to the Accreditation Centre.

- Please contact the head of the local centre immediately. The following is required:
- The police report
- Application for replacement accreditation

- Payment of an applicable administrative fee

The payment for new accreditation will be processed within 48 hours. Once this time has elapsed the new accreditation may be collected from one of the accreditation centres. Accreditation passes reported as lost will be deactivated immediately and permanently.

If any of the applicants details have changed (e.g. new passport number) of the applicant is unable to attend the Orange Africa Cup of Nations and is to be replaced by a colleague from the same media organisation, applications for changes or replacement of documentation should be directed to the CAF Media Channel.

Match Tickets may be collected from Stadium Media Centre from 16h00 the day before the match. Match Tickets can be collected up to one hour before the match starts.

Parking Stickers must be collected by 16h00 the day before the relevant match in each of the venues.

TRAINING SESSIONS

There are two types of team training sessions:

- Sessions in the Team Base Camp are the responsibility of the Team Media Officer.
- Sessions at each stadium are the responsibility of the LOC Media Officers.

Training sessions at the each stadium take place on Match-Day -1. There could be instances where the teams request to cancel this session but it must be announced at least 24 hours prior to the session. The first 15 minutes of all these sessions are open to all accredited media. The teams may decide to extend the time open to media. The sessions are followed by a Press Conference with the presence of the head coach and at least one playing player. To access these Press Conferences a SAD will be needed if there is a high demand. The distribution will be in the SMC as usual (and at the Broadcast Compound for RTVs). Please check the Media Channel to get the latest news regarding these training sessions.

For these training sessions the following guidelines will be applied:

- Photographers (with bib and SAD), NRH, and Media Rights Licencees TV Crews (with bib) will work as on match day behind the goal lines and on the opposite touch line (no exceptions).

- All press and radio and TV reporters will have to work from the Media Tribunes (no exceptions).

CATERING SERVICES

In each Stadium Media Centre, a dedicated media catering facility has been set up.

MEDIA TRANSPORT

A media shuttle service will be provided to transport media from the airport in each Host City to the media hotels and from the media hotels to stadiums.

MEDIA ACCOMMODATION

The Local Organising Committee has negotiated reasonable rates for Media travelling to Equatorial Guinea and to the various Host Cities.

For enquiries on the accommodation on offer Media should please contact LOC Media and Communications Office in respective venues.

Media Shuttle services will be provided from the official media hotels to and from the stadiums in each venue, including training sites, and to and from the airport.

HOST CITY DESK

Information on the host city and the country, including activities and tours offered to the media will be available at a host city desk in each stadium.

PHOTO SERVICES

There will be Camera Repair Desks for professional photographers in all Stadium Media Centres.

STADIUM MEDIA CENTRES

Each of the stadiums will have a Stadium Media Centre (SMC) with a working area for the media as well as a host of services and facilities. All SMCs are located inside the Stadium.

TECHNICAL SUPPORT

OVERALL CONCEPT

The Orange Africa Cup of Nations Local Organising Committee will make its best effort to provide best effort public Internet access for all accredited media free of charge.

Internet access will make its best effort to provide public internet in all the most important working areas for media and/or wireless access. It is recommended that media use the cable connection whenever possible.

STADIUM MEDIA CENTERS (SMC)

- All working positions will have a socket for power.
- All working positions will have Internet access and there will be limited wireless Internet access throughout.
- Mobile phone and international calls can also be made

This vision materialises into a strategy for fighting cancers based on three pillars: prevention, treatment, and support.

Actively involved through local actions among the populations, the Foundation also makes use of its leadership to actively advocate to public authorities for the free provision of screening and support of the people affected by cancer as well as the access to treatment for all.

Africa United is a platform that leverages sport to catalyze action on health, led by the Confederation of African Football (CAF) and the African Union, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, World Bank Group and CDC Foundation, and includes African leaders, international health bodies, private companies, celebrities, NGOs and other multi-sector actors.
