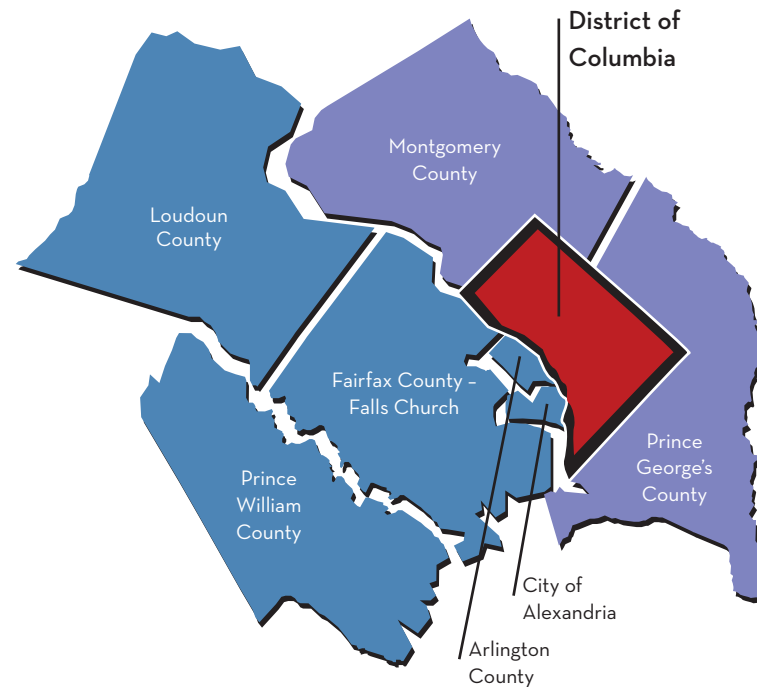

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Why should I donate through DC One Fund?

The DC One Fund is a convenient tool for you to make a donation to the charitable organization of your choice through payroll deductions. If you itemize deductions on your taxes, this is a simple way to track your donations. Also, please remember that every donation of any dollar amount makes an impact in our community.

When does the One Fund campaign end?

The DC One Fund Campaign will close on December 20, 2016.

How do I find my agency's coordinator?

Go to onefund.dc.gov and click on "DC One Fund Organizational Chart with Agency Coordinators (PDF)," which is located at the bottom of the homepage. The second option is to send an email to dconefund@dc.gov with your agency's name and we will respond to you with the name, email, and phone number of your agency's coordinator.

My charitable organization is not a member of United Way or United Black Fund, how do I get my charitable organization on the list of DC One Fund charities?

If your organization resides in the District of Columbia, you can participate in future campaigns by submitting an application for independent organizations at onefund.dc.gov. Your organization must reside in the District of Columbia to participate. You may also contact United Way of the National Capital Area or the United Black Fund to discuss additional membership options.

Can I do a one-time donation?

Yes, you can. Go to onefund.dc.gov and click the "pledge now" button, log in, and then you may donate using the one-time payroll deduction option or the credit card option.

Can I give \$25 or less to my favorite charity?

United Way of the National Capital Area, which is the lead administrator of the DC One Fund drive, will not send donations of \$25 or less to an individual charitable organization. If an employee wants to designate funds to his or her nonprofit of choice, the total annual contribution must be at least \$26. Donations of \$25 or less will be treated as undesignated contributions.

Can I change the amount of money allocated or the charitable organization to which my donations are allocated?

Yes. You will need to email the Office of the Secretary at dconefund@dc.gov or call (202) 727-6306.

If my username and password for onefund.dc.gov is not working, how do I fix it?

Please contact your Agency Coordinator OR email dconefund@dc.gov OR call the United Way NCA Helpdesk at (202) 808-0513. This information is located directly above the login username and password section on the onefund.dc.gov website.

What We Accomplish

The value of your investment in United Way NCA can be seen in the lives that are improving every day. In the District, over the past year through individual contributions by United Way NCA supporters like you and our Community Impact grants, we created real results:

- 11,022 at-risk children, families, and seniors received healthy, nutritious meals.
- 649 families relocated to emergency safe housing.
- 333 middle school students received academic support, attendance monitoring, social and emotional support, leadership development, and skill-building training.
- 255 elementary school children received one-on-one tutoring.
- 223 individuals at-risk of homelessness were placed into unsubsidized employment.

How We Do What We Do

Hearing our stakeholders, advocacy groups and policymakers, we identified opportunities to make investments that will have lasting impact on people's lives. In 2015, United Way National Capital Area launched our multimillion-dollar, five-year Community Commitment. Focusing on our areas of impact: education, financial stability and health, we have created programs such as:

Education: Using a community school model, we are bringing together partners to provide wrap-around services: services that address the whole child and their total environment both inside and outside of school.

Financial Stability: We are opening Financial Empowerment Centers, which are one-stop shops to assist hard working people to achieve stable financial footing by accessing services. Services may include money management counseling, credit and housing counseling, asset-building and access to free or low cost banking products.

Health: In 2009, United Way of the National Capital Area created Fun, Fly, & Fit, a child obesity initiative that encourages children and youth to be more physically active—in and out of school. The program is so successful that it is now being replicated in Baltimore and Minneapolis.
