Apology regarding the paper retractions

As a researcher, I am deeply ashamed of the fact that two papers of which I was an

author were found to contain multiple errors and, as a result, had to be retracted. I also

deeply regret the fact that as a co-author, I was not able to identify these errors

beforehand and to exercise my leadership to prevent this regrettable situation, including

misconduct, from occurring. I apologize wholeheartedly for the confusion and

disappointment that this situation has caused.

With the retraction of the papers, there is no longer any experimental basis to support

the consistency of the STAP phenomenon, and considering the discrepancies that have

been pointed out recently regarding the cell genotypes, it has become increasingly

difficult to call the STAP phenomenon even a promising hypothesis.

As a deputy director of our center, with responsibility for nurturing young researchers, I

feel a deep responsibility for what has happened, and plan to comply with whatever

decision RIKEN finally reaches regarding my own status.
