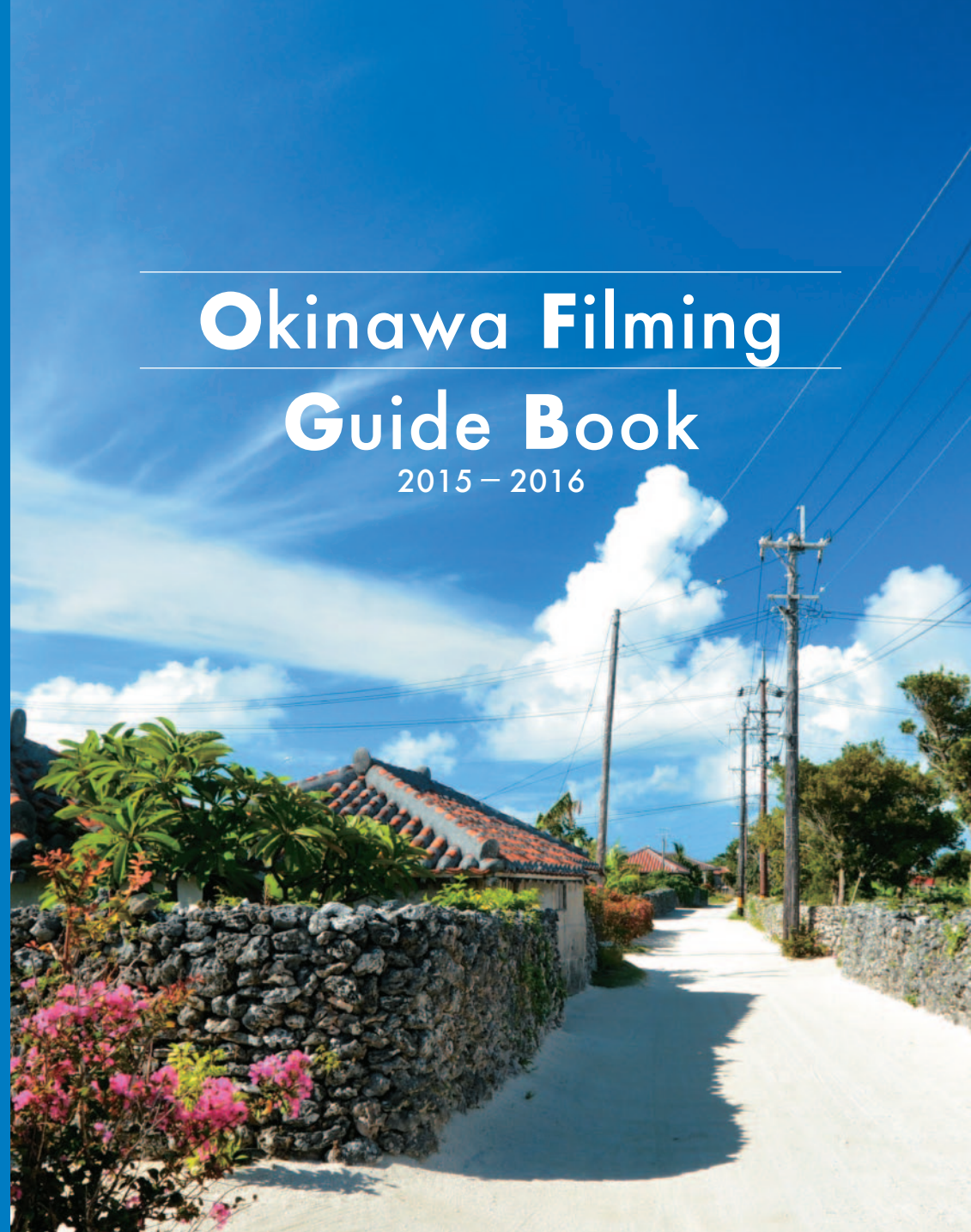

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Introduction

As the only prefecture situated in the subtropical zone in Japan, Okinawa is well known as southern resort islands blessed with mild climate. Especially, the beauty of its natural landscapes is outstanding—with diverse locations featuring, first and foremost, the sea with one of the best clarity in the world that offers gradual blue color extending over to the horizon, then the beautiful coastline of white sands, the endlessly high, vast, and transparent sky, and the subtropical deep forests made of thick green leaves. Furthermore, the "view of an island in daylight"—created by the shadow contrasted with the sun that sheds vivid lights over the island—is one of the unique sceneries offered by Okinawa. Indeed, Okinawa is a place truly suitable for location.

We hope this guidebook will be useful in both your location search and the filming process.

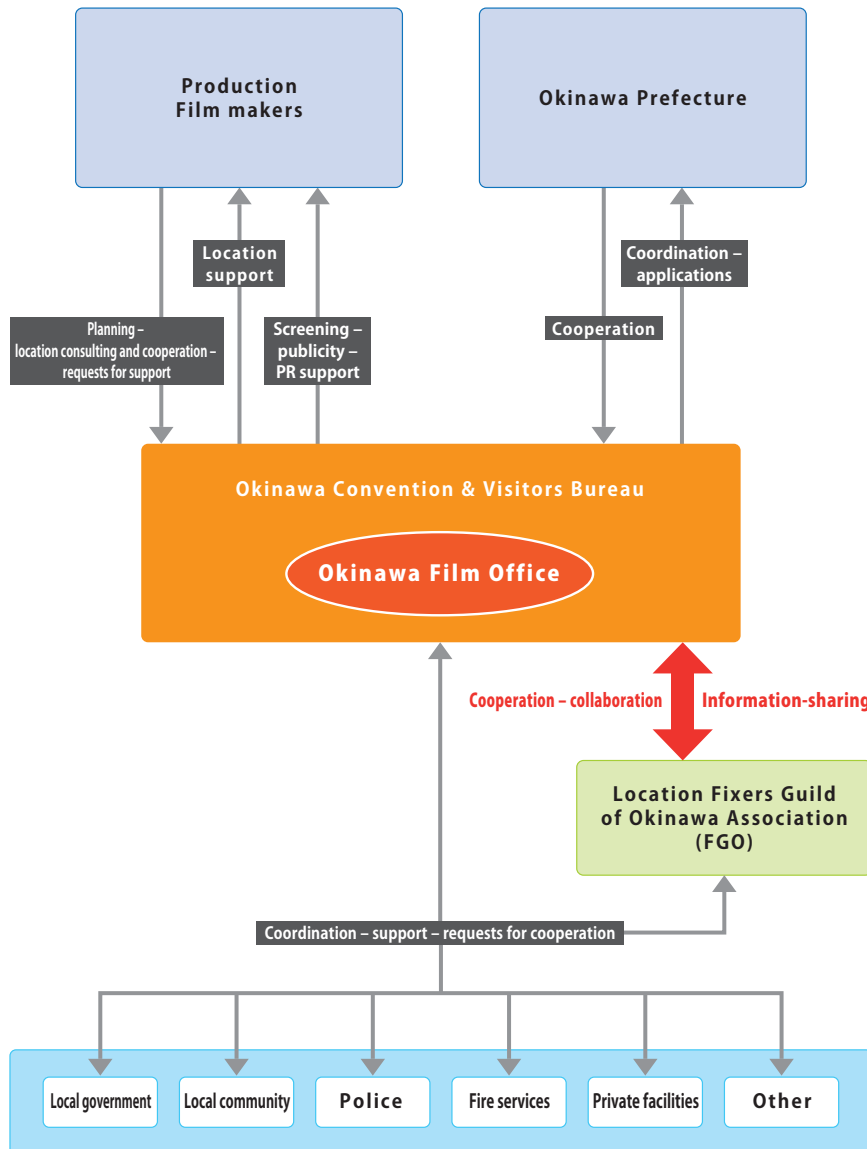

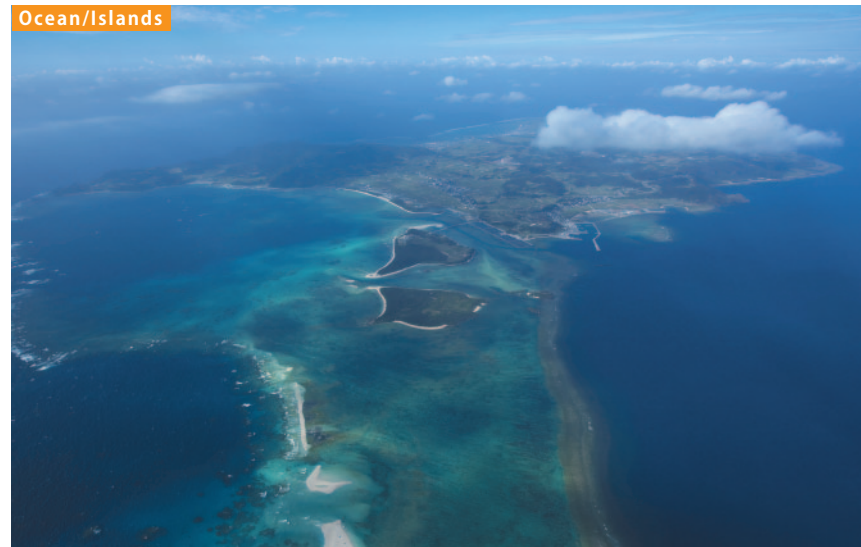

Overview of Okinawa Prefecture

Okinawa Prefecture Overview

Okinawa Prefecture has jurisdiction over 5 counties, 11 cities, 11 towns and 19 villages scattered around the Ryukyu Islands, which form part of the Nansei Islands -- a chain of islands extending from Kyushu to Taiwan. With a land area of 2,276.64km², Okinawa is one of the smallest Japanese prefectures and the country's only "island prefecture." The Ryukyu Islands are comprised of some 160 small and large islands sprinkled over a vast southern ocean area from 23 to 28 degrees North Latitude and from 122 to 132 degrees East Longitude, stretching 1,000km east to west and 400km north to south.

Due to its geographic location between mainland Japan and other countries in East Asia, facing the East China Sea on its west side and the Pacific Ocean on its east, Okinawa once thrived as an intermediary trader with the surrounding nations. Even today, Okinawa plays an important role in connecting Japan to other Asian countries, and the island has a vision of becoming a major hub for international trade and transportation in the future.

Located in a subtropical climate zone, Okinawa enjoys warm weather throughout the year and a longer summer season than mainland Japan. The annual average temperature in Naha City is 23.1°C with around 2,000mm of precipitation, and it rarely drops below 10°C even in the winter. Some of the characteristics of Okinawa's climate include high humidity, long summer season and typhoons.

Okinawa is situated at almost the same latitude as Hawaii, the Bahamas, and major other Asian cities such as Hong Kong, Taipei and Seoul are within 1,500km of the prefecture. Due to the warm climate and beautiful coral reefs surrounding the islands, Okinawa has a high potential for success in the tourism industry.



History

The discovery of human bone fossils of the Yamashita Cave Man dating back some 32,000 years has confirmed that humans have lived on Okinawa for many thousands of years. Human remains and artifacts unearthed in various places in Okinawa also indicate that Okinawans started having contact with neighboring nations as early as the 12th or 13th century.

In 1429, the Ryukyu Kingdom was established by Sho Hashi, the founder of the First Sho Dynasty, by uniting the three dominant kingdoms of Nanzan, Chuzan and Hokuzan, by conquest. The first Sho Dynasty lasted for only seven generations, with Kanamaru (later Sho En) later taking over the throne and starting the Second Sho Dynasty. This period of history for Okinawa is known as the "golden age of trading," during which time the Ryukyu Kingdom actively traded with China, Japan and other Asian countries, prospered as a maritime kingdom, and became recognized by even European nations. The unique culture of the Ryukyus is largely attributed to the wide variety of foreign goods and cultures brought through trading during the Second Sho Dynasty.

In the early 17th century however, the Ryukyu Kingdom was incorporated into the Japanese feudal system under the shogunate, and later annexed by Japan with the birth of the Meiji government. This marked the end of the 500-year history of the Ryukyu Kingdom and the establishment of Okinawa Prefecture.

When World War II broke out in the Pacific in 1941, Okinawa became the tragic scene of the only ground battle in Japan, resulting in the death of one fourth of the island's population. In the postwar period, Okinawa was placed under U.S. administration for 27 years, until its reversion back to Japanese control on May 15, 1972. Although Okinawa regained its status as a Japanese prefecture, there remains a number of U.S. military bases and facilities throughout the main island. This has created a variety of sensitive issues, such as the relocation of Marine Corps Air Station Futenma to Henoko, and the deployment of the V-22 Osprey aircraft to U.S. bases in Okinawa.

Today, Okinawa places a particular emphasis on tourism, and the island is rapidly growing in popularity as a tourist destination, attracting a great many visitors from mainland Japan and abroad looking to enjoy the island's warm weather and unique culture.

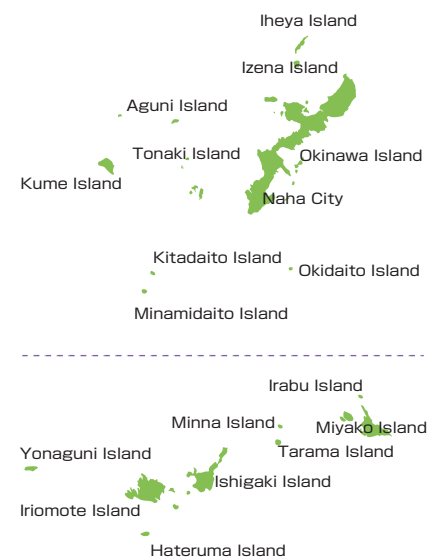

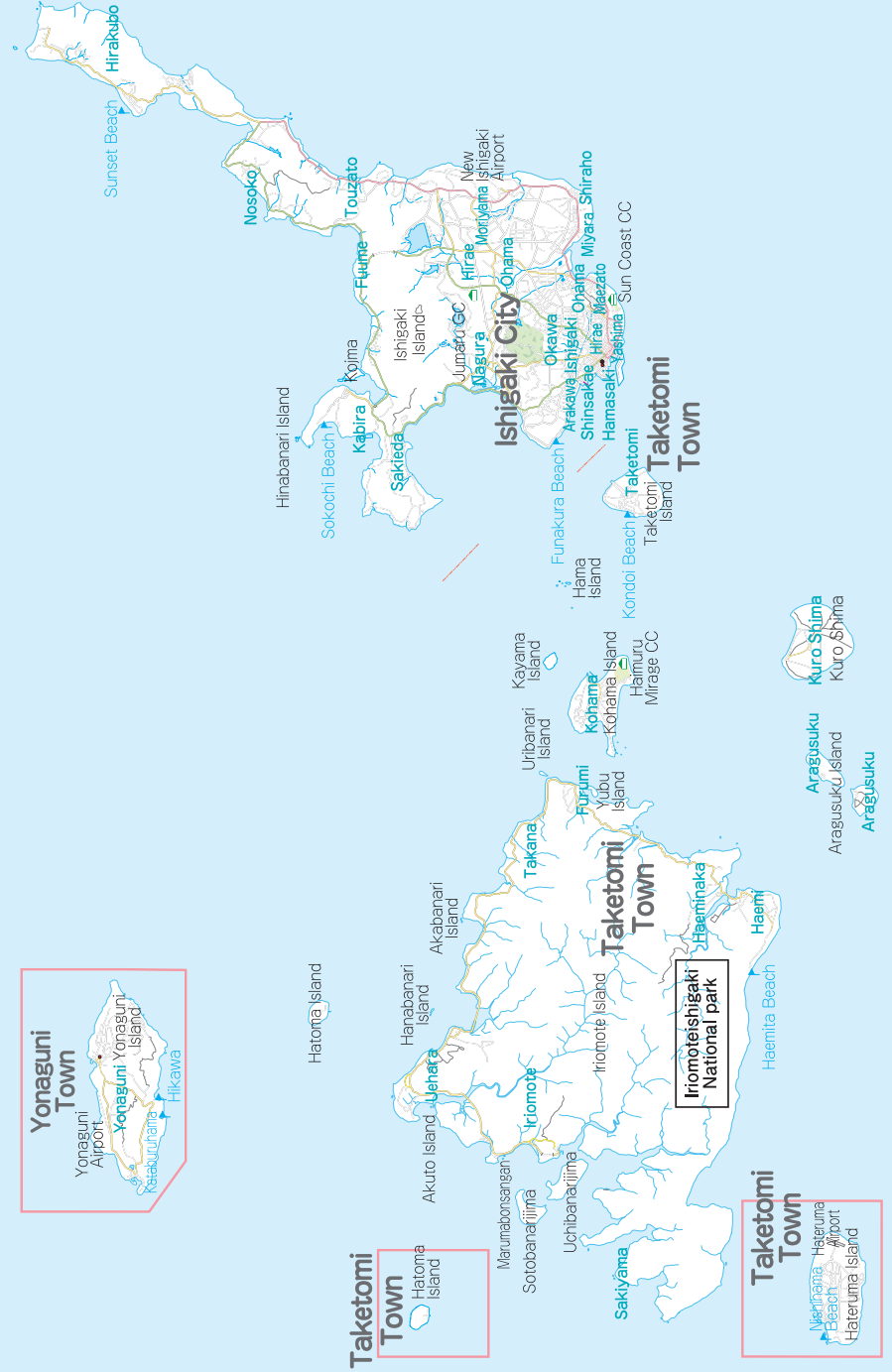

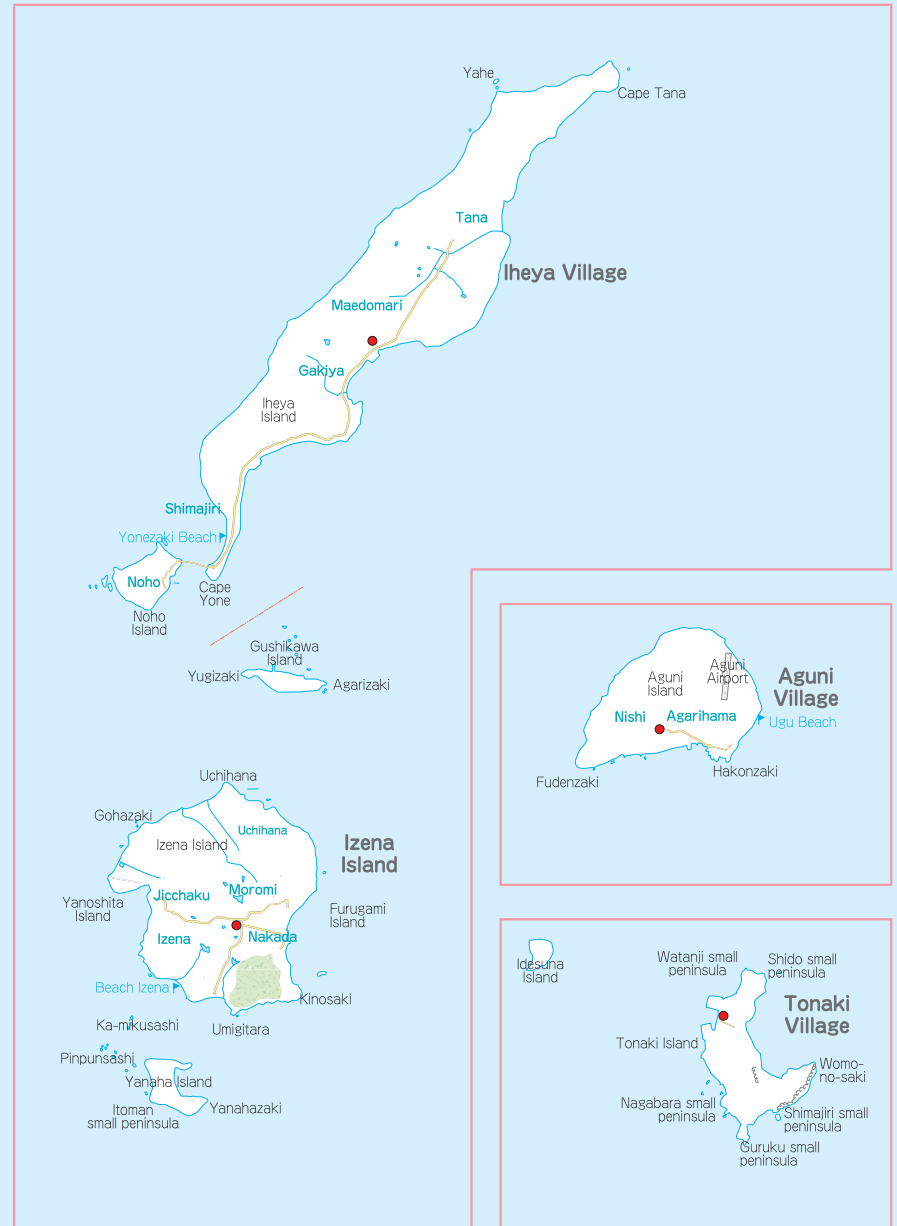
Okinawa Island Map

Annual Events in Okinawa

Earliest cherry blossoms in Japan

The Hikanzakura (Taiwan Cherry) blossom comes into bloom in January. The blossoms start in the north of Okinawa, and cherry blossom festivals are held in towns and villages throughout the island.



Muuchii

(Dec. 8 in the Chinese calendar -- Jan. 8, 2014)
An annual tradition to pray for the family's health by eating muuchi, a traditional Okinawan steamed rice cake, wrapped in a gettou (shell ginger) or Chinese fan palm leaf.



Whale Watching

January to March is the season for watching humpback whales migrate through the warm waters of the Kerama Islands.



Beach Opening

The opening of beach facilities in Okinawa is the earliest in the country, taking place in late March or early April. Swimming is possible until the end of October.



Shiimii

(March in Chinese calendar, although exact date varies from year to year -- April 5, 2014)
An annual Okinawan ceremony in which Monchu (family members based on paternal lineage) gather in front of the family tomb and dine together with offerings of food and alcohol for their ancestors.

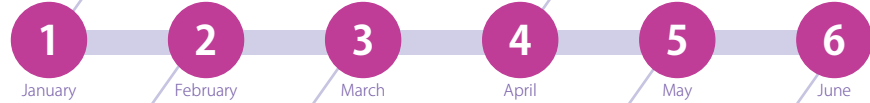
Lily Festival on Ie Island

During this annual festival, you can see over 1 million lilies in full bloom.



Deigo

The prefectural flower for Okinawa, the deigo (erythrina variegata) blossoms between April and June.



Chinese New Year

Traditional Ryukyuan festivals and ceremonies are held according to dates in the Chinese calendar. For Okinawan people, Chinese New Year is a big celebration.

Okinawa Marathon

A popular marathon which runs through several cities and towns, including palm-lined roads and taking in the American atmosphere through Kadena Air Base.



Japanese professional baseball training camps in Okinawa

Due to its relatively mild climate during February and March, many Japanese professional baseball teams come to Okinawa for pre-season training.



Okinawa International Movie Festival

An annual movie festival held over one week in two cities on the island. Other related events will be held concurrently with this festival.



Urizun

"Urizun" is the name of the season throughout March and April, during which time Okinawa has very comfortable weather.



Naha Hari

The program includes a variety of dragon boat races.



Irei-no-Hi

Okinawan Memorial Day marks the anniversary of the end of the Battle of Okinawa. It is a holiday held only in Okinawa Prefecture. Victims of the war are commemorated by people throughout the island by offering a silent prayer.

Itoman Hare

Held in the fishing town of Itoman, this is a festival for thanking the sea for its blessings, and praying for safe voyages and a good catch.



All-Island Shishi-mai Festival



The shishi-mai (lion dance) casts out evil spirits and brings prosperity and bumper crops to the local area. This event features shishi-mai dances performed by various teams from all over Okinawa and mainland Japan.

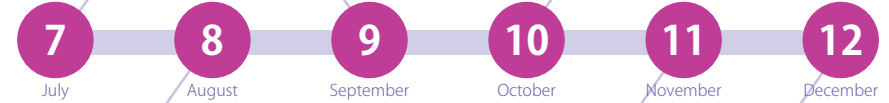
Itoman Great Tug-of-War



Another large-scale tug-of-war festival on the island. The festival is held to give thanks for a bountiful harvest and pray for a good catch of fish.

Summer Festival at Ocean Expo Park

Here, at the biggest fireworks festival in Okinawa, audiences can enjoy events such as concerts while watching the sunset.



Kyubon

(July 13-15 of Chinese calendar -- Aug. 8-10, 2014)
Called Obon in mainland Japan, this is a festival commemorating and giving tribute to one's ancestors. Most businesses are closed during this time since the majority of Okinawans take part in this event.



Yonabaru Great Tug-of-War

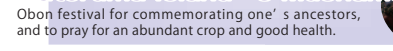
At this, one of the biggest tug-of-war events held on the island, spectators can enjoy "memoi," a dance performed by women in front of the rope before the tug-of-war commences. An enthusiastic performance by hatagashira (portable Shinto shrine) bearers follows. A combination of the rare sounds of golden hand drums, gongs and conches echoes throughout the site.

Angama

This is the name of the obon ceremony which takes place across the Yaeyama Islands. The performers, called Angama, wear elderly male or female facemasks, representing ancestral spirits, and parade around each house in the village. They also enter houses and answer questions about the afterlife asked by villagers.

Hateruma Island's Mushama

Obon festival for commemorating one's ancestors, and to pray for an abundant crop and good health.



Naha Great Tug-of-War Festival

One of the biggest festivals in Okinawa, which takes place in Naha City. This event causes the main road in Okinawa, Route 58, to be closed in the vicinity for the afternoon.



Shuri Castle Festival

The festival pays homage to the Ryukyu Dynasty period. A beautiful traditional procession takes place on Kokusai Street in Naha City. After sunset, Shuri Castle lights up with more than 7,000 candles.



Paantu

In this festival, men representing Paantu, who are visiting gods dressed in grass and mud, go around smearing it on everything and everyone. It is a ritual for casting out evil and praying for a year of good health.



Okinawa Art and Culture Festival

This event highlights prefectural artworks such as traditional performing arts of the Ryukyus.

Kohama Island's Ketsugan Festival

Dance and kyogen performances are held to give thanks for the fulfillment of prayers offered in the previous year. This festival was designated as an Important Intangible Cultural Property by the Japanese government in 1994.



Yasuda's Sunugu

A traditional ritual in the Yasuda area, at which people pray for their health, rich hunting, a bountiful catch and a good harvest.



Traditional Culture and Performing Arts

Traditional performing arts

During the Ryukyu Kingdom era, Okinawa gave birth to a rich culture, which is very different from that of mainland Japan. Traditional performing arts are some of the symbols of this culture. The traditional performing arts of Okinawa can be largely grouped into two main categories: the court-performing arts, developed under the patronage of the Ryukyu Kingdom's royal government, and the folk-performing arts, locally passed on from one generation to the next.

Developed to entertain envoys from China, Okinawa's court-performing arts include refined classical dances, such as the kumi-odori, in which performers appear in exquisite costumes and dance, and graceful music played with the sanshin, flute, kokyū (Chinese fiddle) and koto (Japanese zither). The court performing arts, in general, are characterized by their extreme elegance.

In contrast, the folk-performing arts have their origin in Okinawa's traditional rites and rituals to celebrate and pray for good harvests, and are often accompanied by folk songs and dance. After the sanshin was introduced to Okinawa from China in the 14th to 15th century, a rich variety of folk-performing arts were born, incorporating music and dance, and even today these arts can be observed in traditional festivals and events throughout the prefecture.

In Okinawa, known as the "island of performing arts," music and dance have always been very much a part of people's lives, and they continue to flourish today.

● Ryukyuan dance

Ryukyuan dance includes classical dance founded on royal court performances, folk dances inherited within each locality over generations, zo-odori, which first appeared in the Meiji era and which depicted the experiences and feelings of the common people, and sosaku-odori, a relatively new type of Ryukyuan dance, choreographed in a modern style. Ryukyuan dance is now recognized by the Japanese government as an Important Intangible Cultural Property.



● Kumi-odori

Kumi-odori, created by adopting some of the unique features of Japanese noh and kyogen (forms of traditional Japanese comic theater), is a theatrical performance of dance, songs and stories. Kumi-odori, kumi-odori tachikata (performers) and kumi-odori ongaku uta sanshin (musicians and singers) have collectively been designated as an Important Intangible Cultural Property by the Japanese government.



● Eisa

Eisa is a dance traditionally performed during the Obon celebration, mainly in the main island of Okinawa, to pray for the peace of their ancestors' souls. Today, in addition to the traditional eisa shows, you can enjoy a variety of new-style eisa with innovative choreography and contemporary music. A mainstay of Okinawa's performing arts, eisa is performed at festivals and various other events throughout the island.



● Karate

Karate is an art of self-defence that uses no weapons. Karate is said to be a fusion of the ancient martial arts of Okinawa, known as "te," and the Chinese "kenpo," and was categorized into three different types, including Shuri-te, Tomari-te and Naha-te, before present-day karate styles were developed. Today, this Okinawan-born martial art is widely practiced throughout the world.



Traditional arts and crafts

The Ryukyu Kingdom flourished in its day through trading with Japan, China and other countries in East and Southeast Asia. Absorbing the elements of their societies, the Ryukyus established a unique culture of its own. The culture and traditions of Okinawa, which are still observed in the present day, have deep roots in the island's history as a trading nation.

In recent years, Okinawa's traditional arts and crafts have gained increased recognition both at home and abroad. Okinawa is ranked third amongst all Japanese prefectures according to the number of items designated as national traditional artifacts by the Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry.

The fourteen arts and crafts of Okinawa designated as traditional artifacts of Japan by the Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry:

Kumejima-tsumugi, Miyako-jofu, Yuntanza-hanaori, Tsuboya-yaki, Ryukyu-kasuri, Shuri-ori, Ryukyu-bingata, Ryukyu-shikki, Yonaguni-ori, Kijoka basho-fu, Yaeyama-jofu, Yaeyama-minsa and Chibana-bingata

● Yachimun

Affectionately called "yachimu" in the local dialect, Okinawan pottery, uses techniques influenced by ceramics imported from China and Korea. Tsuboya-yaki, one of the most famous types of Okinawan pottery, can be divided into two general categories: ara-yaki, or unglazed pottery, and jo-yaki, or glazed pottery. The majority of today's yachimun is made in the jo-yaki style and it's available in a wide variety of forms, including tableware for everyday use and floral vases.



● Bingata

Bingata, unique Okinawan dyed clothware, is identified by its beautiful array of radiant colors. The method of bingata dyeing was inspired by Kyo-Yuzen (hand-dyed silk from Kyoto), employing multiple imported techniques including stencil dyeing of chintz from India and Java, and Chinese textiles. Originally bingata was dyed using Ryukyu indigo, fukugi and other expensive pigments imported from China and it was used for royal attire and clothing worn by warriors.



● Minsa-ori

In the local dialect, "min" means cotton and "sa" is narrowness. From this we get "minsa" – a fabric used to make obi (belts/sashes for kimono). The alternating pattern of five and four small rectangles symbolizes "love forever," and because of this woman in times gone by in Okinawa would give an obi made from this textile to the man she loved. Both ends of minsa obi have a particular pattern, representing the numerous legs of a centipede, which is said to be expressing the wish of the man to visit her frequently. Of all the minsa fabrics in Okinawa, that of the Yaeyama islands is the best known.



● Ryukyu glassware

Ryukyu glassware is a new handcraft of Okinawa that started out in the postwar period, when people had very few materials. Initially, a variety of glassware items for everyday use were produced by recycling the bottles discarded by U.S. armed forces in Okinawa. Today, there are some workshops which use not only discarded bottles, but also different raw materials for Ryukyu glassware production. Known for its handmade style combined with the bright sparkles reminiscent of the radiance and nature of Okinawa, Ryukyu glassware is now one of the most popular and familiar Okinawan handicrafts. There are also a number of unique glass artworks produced by innovative local artisans.



● Sanshin

Originally introduced from Quanzhou City in Fujian Province, China, during the time of the Ryukyu Kingdom, the sanshin is now a quintessentially Okinawan musical instrument, used in all of the island's traditional performing arts. Usually, the neck of the instrument is made of ebony or red sanders, the uma (bridge that holds up the strings of the sanshin) is made of bamboo and the body is covered with snakeskin. It's played with a claw-shaped bachi (pick) made from the horn of a water buffalo or cow. The sanshin is a popular accompaniment not only for Okinawan folk songs, but also for a wide variety of other music, with a pleasant sound that captivates people's hearts.



Okinawan Cuisine

The elements of the unique Okinawan culture is clearly reflected in its cuisine. Some of the present-day Okinawan dishes have their roots in traditional Ryukyuan cuisine and they are as popular with Okinawans today as the popular and more modern rafute and inamuruchi (miso-based soup with pork). The tradition of Ryukyuan cuisine was first established to entertain the taste buds of visiting Chinese envoys, and thus features some similarities to Chinese cuisine.

During the time when Okinawa was ruled by the U.S. government, there was an influx of canned pork luncheon meat and other food supplies through the U.S. military. This led to the introduction of popular American food items, including hamburgers and fried chicken, rapidly establishing the American food culture in Okinawan. Canned pork luncheon meat is a particular favorite of Okinawans and is an essential ingredient for local dishes, such as the popular goya champuru.

Taco rice



An Okinawan specialty dish using Mexican taco ingredients put onto a bed of rice. Taco rice was created by local Okinawans after the WWII in Kin Town, where Camp Hansen - a U.S. Marine Corps base - is located.

Goya champuru



Stir-fried goya (bitter melon), tofu, pork and eggs.

Rafute



A typical Okinawan dish in which chopped pork belly is slowly simmered with brown sugar, soy sauce and awamori.

Okinawa soba



Okinawan noodle soup is served in a clear, hot broth, made by simmering dried bonito flakes and/or pork bones, and is typically topped with slices of braised pork belly (san-mai niku), fish paste, chopped spring onion and pickled ginger. There are a number of local versions of Okinawa soba, such as Yaeyama soba and Miyako soba, and the types of noodles and toppings vary considerably from region to region, and from restaurant to restaurant. They are all worth trying!

Pork tamago (pork and eggs)



An Okinawan breakfast staple with pan-fried canned pork luncheon meat and scrambled eggs. Almost all eateries in Okinawa have pork tamago teishoku, or a set meal with pork tamago. This is one of the best loved dishes on the island.

Awamori

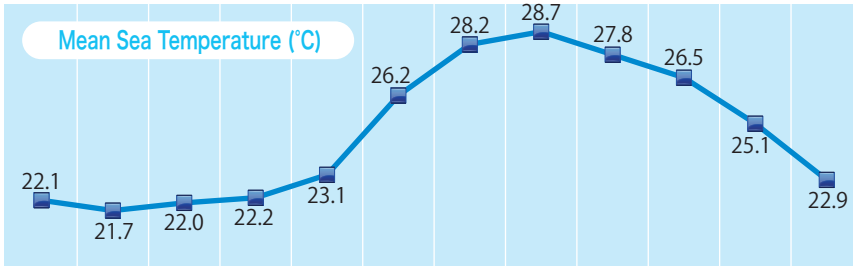
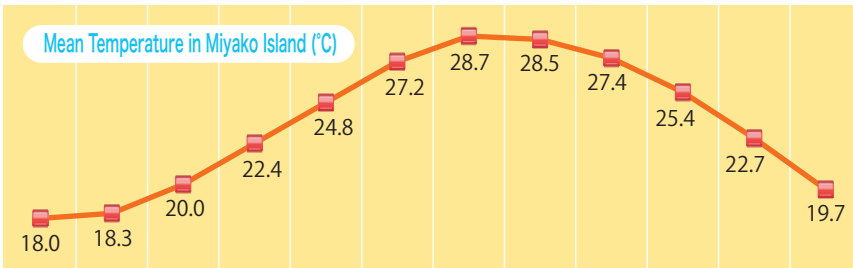
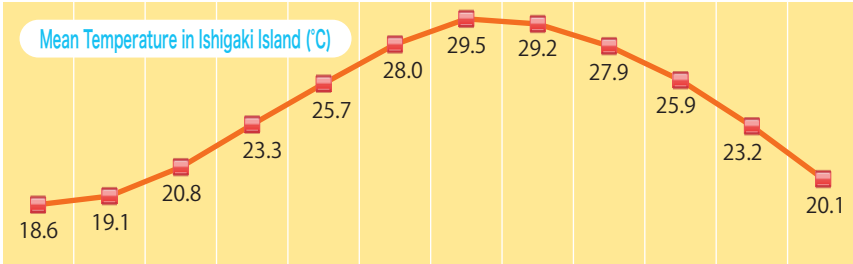
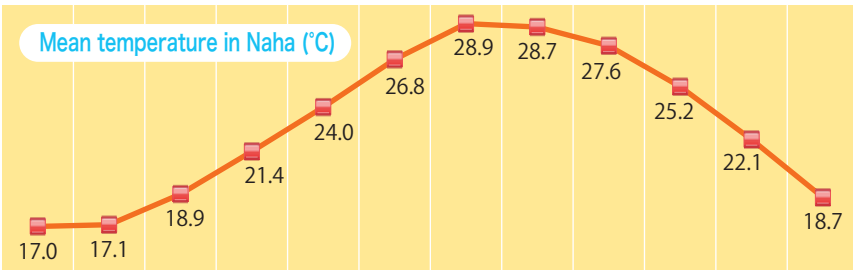

Annual Calendar in Okinawa

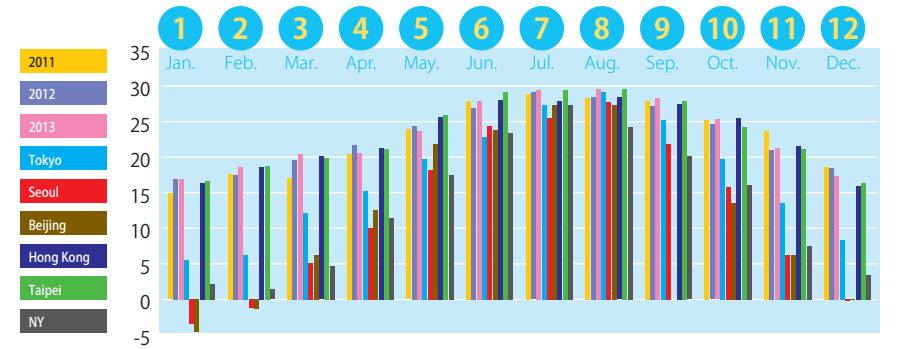

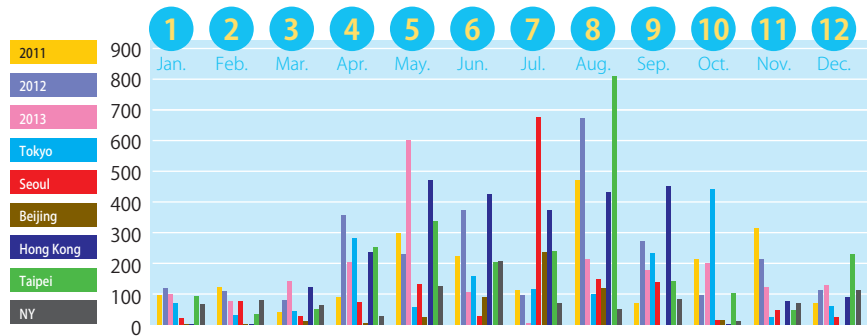

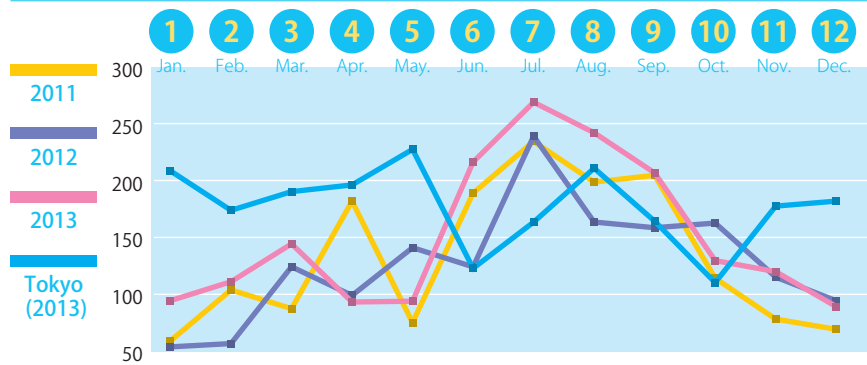

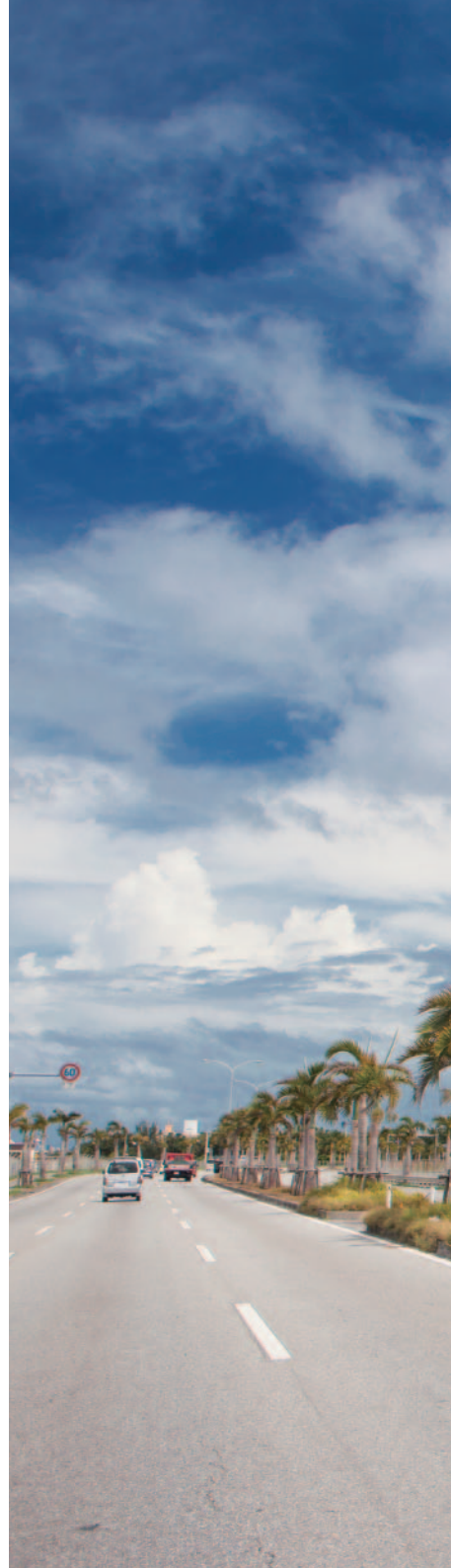

Countermeasures against typhoon

- Avoid going out and stay inside the accommodation facilities during a typhoon; there is a risk of a direct hit from flying broken trees, or turnover due to a strong wind.
- Continue using caution after the severe storms are gone, and thoroughly check weather information before taking an action.
- Operations of buses, ferries, or airplanes are affected by the weather condition, so please check the information on them before traveling.

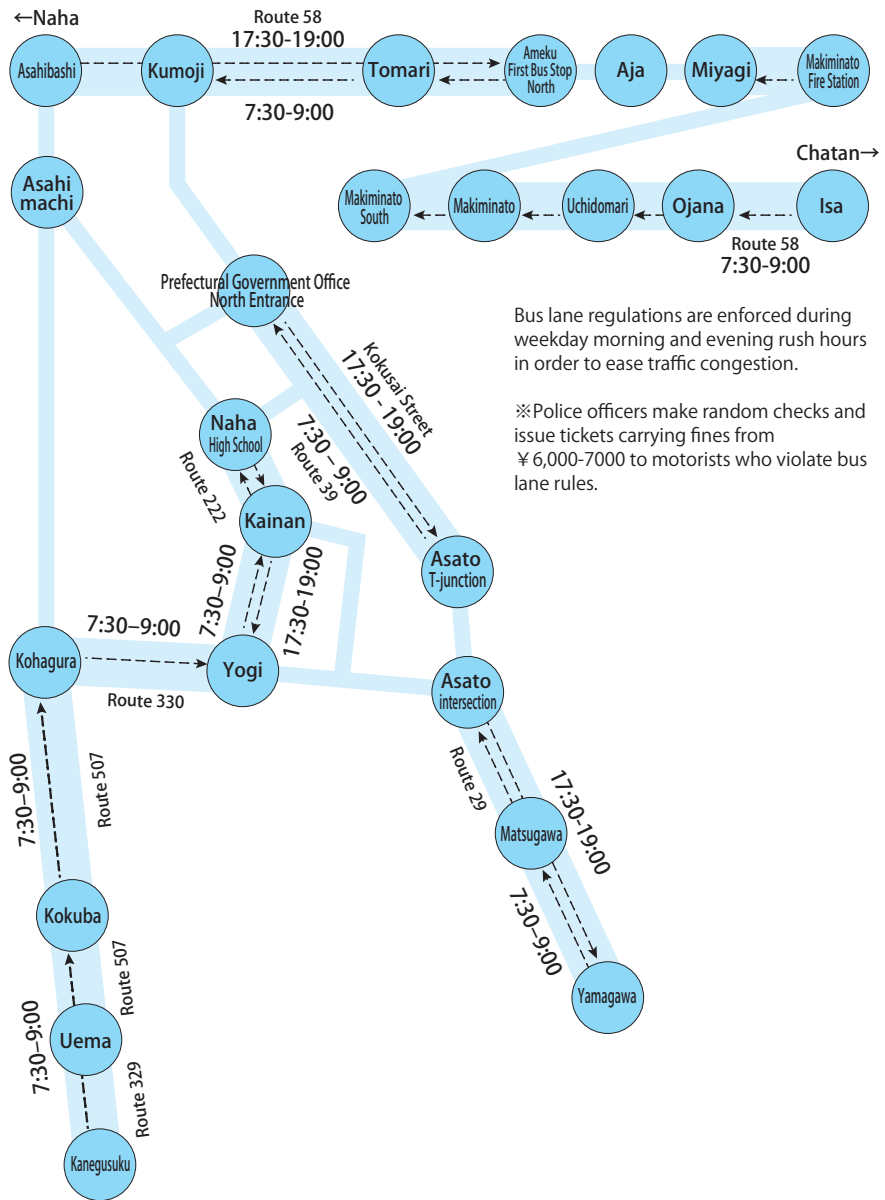

Frequently Asked Questions

- Q1 How much will shooting support cost?**
- A** There is no fee for the shooting support provided by the Okinawa Film Office (OFO). OFO is run with funding from Okinawa Prefecture as part of the Film Commission Program, and operates on the concept that location shooting in Okinawa benefits Okinawa's tourism and local development. Please note, however, that some of the facilities we introduce as shooting locations may charge usage fees. Payment of any such fees shall be made directly to the charging facility, not to OFO.
- Q2 Offering Production expenses?**
- A** Nationwide, the Film Commission does not provide financial support for production or serve as an agent for financial/commercial tie-ups. On the other hand, there are national financial aid programs offered by the Cultural Affairs Agency, Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry, and other national government entities.
- Q3 How support for independent films (Indies)?**
- A** We support independent films as long as the objectives of the shooting are clear. Our services, however, are not for personal filming.
- Q4 Does Okinawa Film Office provide transportation for location scouting and location filming, and/or provide someone to accompany the film unit to the respective locations?**
- A** Okinawa Film Office may be short of staff depending on the season. Currently, our staff is mostly occupied with preliminary location reviews and permit/approval coordination, and is often unable to meet such requests. There are several firms in Okinawa that specialize in shooting location coordination which you may want to consider retaining if you are looking for local full-time support.
- Q5 Can I ask Okinawa Film Office to apply for shooting permits? What is the scope of your services for obtaining shooting authorization?**
- A** There is no location that will issue a shooting permit directly to Okinawa Film Office. Our service is limited to coordinating with the shooting location owners/managers to obtain approval. Where shooting permit applications are required, the applicant must be the shooting party; Okinawa Film Office cannot submit applications on behalf of the shooting party. Okinawa Film Office helps facilitate application acceptance through advanced coordination. For further details, please visit our website at: <http://filmoffice.ocvb.or.jp>
- Q6 Can Okinawa Film Office introduce active or interesting elderly people in Okinawa?**
- A** Although Okinawa is known as a prefecture of longevity, Okinawa Film Office does not maintain a database on the elderly population nor will it serve as an agent to research or introduce such individuals.

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Q 7 What are the means of transportation available for the shooting party?

A The transportation means in Okinawa are limited to airplanes, ships, buses, taxis and the monorail (which runs only in Naha City); there are no trains or subways. Chartered buses are used for most location shooting, but it should be noted that Okinawa's roads are crowded with vehicles. Bus lanes* and other traffic restrictions in Naha and its vicinities can cause congestions and may force a change in your filming schedule. It may be a good idea to employ an experienced local firm that is familiar with the congestion and the back streets. When using ships from Okinawa, Miyako or Ishigaki Island, note that ship service may be suspended when the waves are three meters or higher.

*Bus lanes

Bus lane restrictions are in place to ensure smooth operation of commuter buses during the weekday morning and evening rush hours. The lanes designated as bus lanes can be driven on only by buses, taxis with passengers, two-wheeled vehicle and authorized vehicles only; regular passenger vehicles are prohibited. Bus lane hours are 7:30-9:30 in the morning, and 17:30-19:00 in the evening. Some roads, such as Kokusai Street, become bus-only roads that are off-limits to regular passenger vehicles. The fine is ¥7000 for driving on bus-only roads and ¥6000 for driving on bus lanes. The violations will also result in 2 points and 1 point on your driving record, respectively.

Q 8 Are there any types or scenery that cannot be found or shot in Okinawa?

A Since there is no train system, you will not find train stations or railway crossings. There are very little Japanese-style houses or architecture, new or old. There are no spacious dry riverbeds, high mountains, bamboo or cedar forests, or country landscape typical of rural Japan. Old shrines and temples are very limited in number.

Q 9 Is there anything difficult to find in Okinawa?

A Film development laboratories are available only for still photography; movie films cannot be developed in Okinawa. When sending films to and from Okinawa, the quickest way is to send them as cargo to the destination airport, for pickup at the airport. Although there are no facilities that specialize in rush printing, several facilities in Okinawa are equipped with the capability. Please inquire if such services are needed. Specialists that provide costumes, wigs, props, items needed to shoot gunshot or explosive scenes, and stunts are also difficult to find. For still photography, it should be noted that positive films, as well as medium- and large-sized still films, are not in regular supply and can be out of stock.

Q 10 What is suitable clothing for the climate in Okinawa?

A Short-sleeved shirts are appropriate between April and September. During the hottest season from July to September, caps or hats are indispensable to prevent heat strokes. Sunglasses are also a must. People prone to sunburns should use sunblock lotion and cover themselves with light long-sleeves. The shooting party may also want to prepare sunshades or tents. The hot and humid weather causes lots of perspiration, so carrying a towel is also recommended.

Weather tends to be stable and mild from October to November. Short-sleeved shirt with a light cardigan or a long-sleeved shirt would be appropriate. Although Okinawa's winters are warmer than mainland Japan, jackets are recommended from December to January due to strong seasonal winds and frequent drizzles. Sweaters can be worn inside the jacket, but are not suitable as outerwear because of the strong winds. From February to March, temperatures vary greatly between cold and warm days. A jacket or spring coat worn over a sweatshirt or a long-sleeve shirt would be appropriate.

Q 11 Are there any unique Okinawan customs that should be noted?

A Many old customs are still observed in Okinawa. For example, Obon and New Year's Day celebrations in Okinawa still follow the Chinese calendar. Shooting parties will likely receive very little cooperation or assistance from the local community during such celebrations. Okinawa also has many sacred sites called *uganju* and *utaki** which are worshipped as part of people's daily lives. Some cannot be visited when ceremonies or rites are being conducted. Many of the sacred sites are difficult to distinguish from its surroundings, so local community representative should be consulted prior to shooting. Careful coordination is needed when shooting sacred sites and/or local rites and rituals.

*Uganju and utaki

Uganju and utaki are sacred sites where gods are said to descend. A sacred site may be a grove within an old community, a small hill, a promontory, or a natural well which the local people call "ga." There sacred sites are called *utaki* in the official language, but more often, they are locally called *uganju*. In some areas, the larger sacred sites are referred to as *utaki* while the smaller ones are called *uganju*.

Many of the sites have no structures or particular objects of worship. People offer incense, liquor, salt, rice and fresh flowers with their prayers. In recent years, some communities have built concrete shrines at these places of worship.

It is strictly prohibited to remove plants or rocks from these sacred sites or to soil the site in any way. Furthermore, it should be noted that the sacred sites were traditionally off-limits to males, and some people still frown upon men entering them.

Q 12 We often hear about the dangers of habu, the poisonous snake. Is it safe?

A Many mistakenly believe that the habu snake is prevalent throughout Okinawa. The fact is that some islands such as Miyako, Izena, and Kudaka are not inhabited by habu. The habu is a nocturnal creature and will not come out to an open area during the daytime.

Caution against the habu is certainly needed, but with the technological advances against habu, incidents of habu bites are decreasing each year. Treatment for habu bites have also advanced significantly. It is also possible to take measures before-hand to avoid habu incidents.

Although the habu is a well-known hazardous creature in the woods, less known is the hazardous creature in the ocean: the box jellyfish. Injuries from box jellyfish stings are increasing each other. Occurrence of box jellyfish stings range from June to October, with July and August being the peak months. Stings usually occur within 25 meters from the shore, where the water is less than two meters deep. Stings by the tentacles of a box jellyfish will cause raised welts, extreme itching, and other symptoms. The box jellyfish is a nearly-transparent creature of light blue color with eight tentacles, and are found throughout the waters of Okinawa Prefecture. In addition to the box jellyfish, there are other hazardous creatures that inhabit the coral reefs and the shallow waters, but they should not cause problems as long as they are not touched or tampered with.

Q 13 Any cautionary notes concerning filming equipment?

A Equipment will be exposed to high temperatures and humidity in the summertime. Watch out for salt damage when shooting near the ocean, since sea water spray can easily be carried by strong winds. Squall-like rain showers can also contain substantial amounts of salt even when away from the ocean. Additionally, Okinawa is prone to strong winds, especially along the coasts and on high grounds, where measures should be taken to prevent reflector boards and lights from being blown down.
