

WORLD AGRICULTURAL SUPPLY AND DEMAND ESTIMATES

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HIGHLIGHTS

World supply and use changes this month are dominated by downward revisions in U.S. 1993 crops and projected smaller 1993/94 carryover stocks. U.S. 1993/94 ending stocks of corn are projected at 802 billion bushels, down from 886 million last month because of the smaller indicated crop. Projected soybean stocks of 150 million bushels are down from 165 last month because of a smaller crop.

The U.S. wheat crop is indicated modestly lower, use is forecast higher and stocks are projected at 598 million bushels, compared with 642 million a month ago. A slightly smaller cotton crop and larger expected exports point to a cotton carryover of 4.5 million bales, below the 4.9 million of last month. Projected sugar stocks of 1.3 million tons are up from 1.1 million last month because of a larger crop estimate.

Tightening feed supplies and higher prices will squeeze U.S. livestock producer returns in coming months. Still, U.S. total meat production is projected 2.5 percent larger in 1994, in spite of an expected decline of more than 2 percent in pork output.

NOTE: The name European Union or EU is now used for the group of 12 countries formerly identified as the European Community or EC in this report.

GRAINS

WHEAT. Global 1993/94 production is down marginally from last month. Larger imports and consumption are indicated for a number of countries. With the increased global demand, projected U.S. exports are up from last month. Projected 1993/94 global ending stocks are down from last month largely because of reduced U.S. and EU stocks.

Projected U.S. 1993/94 ending stocks are down 44 million bushels from last month and 69 million above carryin levels. Estimated production is 19 million bushels below last month and projected exports are up 50 million. There also are small changes in projected imports and seed use, and feed and residual use is reduced 25 million bushels. The projected price range is up 10 cents on the low end and 5 cents on the high end to \$3.10 to \$3.25 per bushel.

COARSE GRAINS. Projected 1993/94 global production is up marginally from last month as gains in foreign output more than offset the lower U.S. crop. The foreign increase is mainly because of larger crops of corn in China and South Africa and barley in Eastern Europe. Projected corn exports are down from last month for the United States but up for China and South Africa. Projected 1993/94 global ending stocks are up slightly as larger foreign stocks more than offset the lower prospective U.S. stocks. However, global stocks are still projected to be the lowest since 1983/84.

Estimated U.S. 1993/94 corn production is down 159 million bushels from last month and around 3.1 billion from last year. While part of the reduction is offset by a 25-million-bushel drop in domestic use and a 50-million-bushel drop in exports, projected ending stocks are down 84 million bushels from last month to 802 million. This would be the lowest ending stocks of corn

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since 1975/76 (the first year September 1 stocks are available). The projected price range is up 10 cents on low end to \$2.55 to \$2.75 per bushel. The midpoint of the projected price range indicates prices received by farmers are expected to average around \$2.85 per bushel for the rest of the year.

RICE. Projected global 1993/94 rice supply, use and ending stocks are up from last month, primarily because of larger forecast production, consumption and stocks for China. Global exports are nearly unchanged from last month. Imports by Japan for 1993/94 (November-October) are projected at 2.2 million tons, up 200,000 from last month.

Forecast U.S. 1993/94 production is down nearly 6 million cwt from last month and more than 23 million from last year's crop. The decline in production is due to a decrease in harvested area. Domestic and residual use is lowered nearly 1 million cwt from last month. Ending stocks are down 3 million cwt from last month. The projected price range for 1993/94 is raised 25 cents on both ends to \$8.25 to \$9.75 per cwt.

OILSEEDS

World oilseed production in 1993/94 is projected at 223.1 million tons, up 0.2 million from last month but 3.6 million below last year's record crop. With U.S. production revised down this month, foreign production accounts for all of the increase.

Foreign production is projected at a record 165.4 million tons, up 1.2 million from last month and up 7 million from last year. Significant increases are indicated for China, the EU and Brazil. Soybeans account for much of the rise with smaller increases for rapeseed and peanuts, while sunflowerseed and cottonseed prospects are off. Brazil's soybean crop is projected at a record 23.8 million tons, up 0.5 million from last month due to favorable weather. Also, Argentina's soybean crop is increased to a record 12.2 million tons, up 0.2 from last month, as producers switched some acreage from sunflowerseed to soybeans. China's soybean crop is raised by 0.4 million tons to 12.0 million based on official sources.

U.S. production is estimated at 57.7 million tons, off 1.0 million from last month and down 10.1 million tons from last year. Soybeans and sunflowerseed account for most of this month's drop. U.S. soybean production is placed at 49.2 million tons or 1,809 million bushels, off 25 million bushels from last month.

Global trade and use of soybeans and other oilseeds are up only slightly from last month, reflecting slightly larger supplies. U.S. soybean domestic use is unchanged, while soybean exports are reduced slightly on the basis of increased foreign competition and lower U.S. availabilities. U.S. supply and use balances are considerably tighter for soybean oil as oil extraction rates and supply prospects are cut.

Season-average U.S. soybean farm prices are projected to range between \$6.10 to \$7.10 per bushel, up slightly from last month. Soybean meal prices are projected at \$185 to \$215 per short ton, down \$2.50 from last month, while soybean oil season-average prices are projected to range between 26.0 to 29.0 cents per pound, up about 7 percent from last month.

COTTON

Global cotton stocks for 1993/94 are revised down slightly this month as smaller production more than offsets a modest reduction in consumption. The crop is projected at 80.3 million bales, 1 percent below a month earlier, primarily reflecting a further downward revision in Pakistan. World

use is revised down slightly to 85.6 million bales as reduced activity in Pakistan more than offsets improved consumption prospects in India. Global trade is forecast to remain above 26 million bales. Ending stocks are projected at 33.3 million bales, down 1 percent from last month.

The U.S. cotton outlook for 1993/94 also features smaller prospective stocks, stemming from a slightly smaller crop and brighter export prospects. Exports are forecast at 6.2 million bales, up 5 percent from last month, reflecting more competitive U.S. prices and reduced supplies abroad, particularly in Pakistan. U.S. mill use is revised down 1 percent to 10.2 million bales. This season's U.S. ending stocks are expected to total 4.5 million bales, down 8 percent from December indications and slightly below the beginning level.

SUGAR

U.S. sugar production in fiscal year 1993/94 is projected at 7.54 million short tons, raw value, up nearly 200,000 tons from last month. The revised projection indicates sugar recovery from beets above last season's record level, and higher cane sugar output in Louisiana and Florida. Production forecasts are based on today's National Agricultural Statistics Service report Crop Production, 1993 Summary. The beet sugar forecast includes about 250,000 tons produced from the desugarization of molasses.

Projected domestic deliveries of sugar are unchanged at 9,225,000 tons, up 1.8 percent from last fiscal year. Ending stocks, projected at 1.3 million tons, are up 200,000 tons from last month but, if realized, would be the lowest since 1989/90. The deliveries estimate for 1991/92 is revised.

LIVESTOCK, POULTRY AND DAIRY

Projected U.S. total meat production for 1994 is down slightly from last month, but it is still expected to be record large. Pork production is projected to decrease more than 2 percent, a larger decline than projected last month. The December Hogs and Pigs report showed a smaller September-November pig crop than expected and March-May sow farrowing intentions were below anticipated levels.

Fourth-quarter 1993 pork, broiler and turkey production were larger than expected while beef output fell short of anticipated levels. Hog prices have been weaker than forecast and with relatively high pork output continuing into early 1994, the hog price forecast for the first 2 quarters is down from a month ago. Export prospects for broilers continue to improve.

Fourth-quarter 1993 exports were larger than expected and the forecast for 1994 is increased.

Milk production is trailing expected levels as both cow numbers and output per cow fall short of expectations. The 1993/94 milk production forecast is reduced 0.6 billion pounds this month. This is expected to result in lower CCC net removals than forecast last month as commercial use is only slightly weaker. The milk price forecast is up this month.
