IPSWICH Jets coach Bill Gardiner has challenged his team to to play their way into a jumper in tonight's trial match against Queensland Cup champions the Burleigh Bears.

Ipswich coach Bill Gardiner said the squad has been nar-

## Jets to appeal Fowler suspension

THE Ipswich Jets will appeal a two week suspension tonight after prop Anthony Fowler was cited by the Redcliffe Dolphins on video evidence early in the week.

Queensland Rugby League suspended the powerful forward on Tuesday for an alleged high tackle in Sunday's state league match won by Redcliffe 26-16.

Jets chief executive officer Craig Teevan said they had copped a number of suspensions "on the chin" in recent years but they would fight to have Fowler exonerated in time for Saturday's crucial clash with Wests.

After viewing the footage, Teevan said there was not much in the tackle and it was hard to distinguish the point of contact on video evidence.

"I'd like to think that (he will be let off).

The point of contact is hard to prove — there was no malice in the tackle." Teevan said.

Teevan said the referee had awarded a penalty to the home side after the touch judge came on to the field to report the tackle to the referee.

The suspension is the second time this season that an Ipswich Jets player has been cited on video evidence despite the referee not placing the tackle on report.

Craig Green was suspended for one match following Wynnum's video complaint in round two.

Although Teevan accepted the ruling on Green, he believes rival clubs view the Jets as a force in the competition and are now more inclined to cite their play-

"I think we're starting to gain respect.

A lot of clubs see us as a threat and a bit of a danger. We might have to return serve," he said.

Fowler has been impressive for the Jets this season and would be a big blow to the club if he is forced to sit out the round five match.

Teevan said that both Fowler and the player he tackled spent time in the blood bin after clashing heads in the incident.

He also praised exciting youngster Marshall Chalk.


• Meanwhile, the Ipswich colts finished their season with 40-16 loss against Logan.



## Mercy quits Jets

## Ex-NRL star considers Maroons go to church return to local league

THE career of North Queensland Cowboys try-scoring record holder Ray Mercy is uncertain after he quit the Ipswich Jets for a possible return to the local

Mercy yesterday said his work commitments as a labourer had prevented him from getting to Jets training on time.

"It's not fair on the other play-ers getting there late," said Mer-cy, who scored a club record four tries while playing for the Cowboys against Balmain in 1998.

"Football has to take a back-ward step for a while."

The 27-year-old's promising National Rugby League was cut short by off-field problems. He went on to link with Brothers, where he played a key role in the team's 2000 premiership victory.

But Mercy is not "real sure" whether he will go back to the Ipswich Rugby League after cut-ting ties with the Jets.

"If I was going to play anywhere it would be Brothers," he said. "I just like playing. It keeps me fit."

A return to Brothers would see the talented centre reunited with his brother Ken.

Brothers captain/coach Pat O'Doherty would take Mercy back with open arms.

"He might turn up in the next week or two or he might have the

year off," O'Doherty said. He said Mercy was dualsigned, allowing him to return to Brothers from the Jets when he wanted to.

Mercy's departure from the Jets is a bitter blow for the struggling Bundy Gold Cup team, which has recorded one victory from six matches.

His early season form was impressive, with many tipping him. to push for a place with the Jets' NRL affiliate, the Canberra Raiders.

Jets chief executive officer Craig Teevan said Mercy was likely to rejoin the local league.

Teevan said Mercy attended training on the Monday after the Jets' win against Central Comets in round five but hasn't been sighted since.

"His reasoning was that he had casual work," Teevan said.

Inswich has an opportunity to get its season back on track when the Gary Greinke-coached side meets the East Coast Tigers on Friday night at the North Ipswich Reserve.

The eighth-placed Jets were thumped 42-8 by the Burleigh Bears on Sunday.

Jets head coach Gary Greinke was elated with the launch of the program.



Meanwhile, the Raiders yesterday held a coaching update with their Queensland affiliate partners at Logan.



IPSWICH Jets lock Danny Coburn can't help but get excited about his club's Queensland Cup prospects this season.

In a career spanning more than five years at the Jets, the quietly-spoken representative forward has experienced more defeats than victories.


McCarthy said he hoped to play "the whole game if possible".

# Thumbs down to golden point in Origin: Gilly

**LEAGUE:** Ipswich Jets coach and former Queensland captain Trevor Gillmeister last night said the "golden point" rule to be adopted for this year's State of Origin series would encourage negative football.

"I don't agree with it," said Gillmeister shortly after the rule was passed at a threehour Australian Rugby League board meeting in Canberra yesterday, despite vehement opposition from the Queensland camp.

"If they want to be fair dinkum and get an outright winner, they should've gone with the try only (for first scoring play in extra time)"

"We all laugh at the poor soccer blokes who play for 100 minutes and have a penalty shoot-out.

"It's just going to create negativity. The blokes with the footy are going to tuck it under their arm, run from dummy half, run from dummy half and try and set up for a long-range field goal.

"What's the sense in that? If they've got to come up with a solution you've got to go for the try. People want to see the ball tossed around."

Gillmeister captained the Maroons in the 1995 series when they whitewashed NSW 3-0 under coach Paul Vautin, despite being massive underdogs.

Current coach Wayne Bennett has repeatedly stated his disapproval of golden point, saying it risks the health of exhausted players, while QRL general manager Ross Livermore also campaigned against it.

QRL chairman John McDonald said his league's position had not changed.

"We believe it's still 40 minutes each way and it's international rules which should pre-

vail," McDonald said last night, "We don't believe it's the right decision."

But the Blues had the numbers in the ARL board room and the golden point rule was a fait accompli.

"It is a contentious issue but the feeling of the board was that there was significant demand for matches to be decided (in the Origin) series," ARL chairman Colin Love said yesterday.

"The truth of course is that there have only been two draws in the history of Origin so we are not talking about a radical change to the way the series is played."

The golden point rule is yet to be tested in the National Rugby League, in which a draw is declared if the scores are still locked after 10 minutes of extra time.

Under the ARL system, teams will play an initial five minutes extra time and if the scores are still level at the end of that period, they will swap ends and continue playing until someone scores and a winner is declared.

THE high-flying Ipswich Jets have silenced the most parochial supporters in the Queensland Cup to leap into top spot after eight rounds of the competition.

The inspirational Jets proposaid there was plenty of room for improvement. "We're not there yet. We still have patches during the game where we slack off," Mathiou said.


Ipswich probably would have racked up more points yesterday had star halfback Ricky Bird played the full game.





# Jets set to land at new home base

**LEAGUE:** The Ipswich Jets may have played their last game at Bendigo Bank Oval, with the Ipswich Showgrounds the favoured site to become the club's new home ground.

Jets chief executive Craig Teevan has revealed the Jets were exploring the option of leaving Bendigo Bank Oval, which comes under the control of the Ipswich Rugby League (IRL).

He said the Jets had lost a lot of money from Saturday night's well-attended finals match against Wynnum because they didn't make any profit from alcohol or food sales.

Under the current situation, the IRL makes money from the sale of alcohol while Swifts control the canteen and food rights.

"It's a shame things get to this stage but in all honesty, it's a business," Teevan said.

"The Broncos moved from Lang Park to ANZ Stadium many years ago for the same reason. We don't make a return. We lose to play here, simple as that."

Teevan said the returns from a possible move to the Ipswich Showgrounds could be greater than that at Bendigo Bank Oval.

"We're still a month off from finalising a lot of things (with the Ipswich Show Society)," he

He stressed the Jets had not left the North Ipswich venue at this stage.

Ipswich venue at this stage.

"It's not over the line yet but it's a very, very big possibility." he said.

But for the Jets to remain at the Oval, the Ipswich club and the IRL will have to quickly

work out their differences.

An independent source yesterday told the QT that a possible solution would be for the Jets to hire Bendigo Bank Oval, possibly for


the next three years.

If that happened, the Jets could increase their monthly fee but benefit from running the bar and their own food court.

IRL chairman Ray Jorgensen said the IRL was "there for rugby league in Ipswich".

He said his committee would wish the Jets all the best if they elected to move on.

Jorgensen said the IRL was working on a five-year development plan that involved some major corporate backing.



"If the Jets want to come on board, we'l accept them," said Jorgensen, whose group looks after the ground and pays the bills.

It is understood that IRL sponsor Bendig Bank would be firmly against the Jets leavin the venue. With televised matches and othe extensive media coverage on the Queenslan Cup, Bendigo Bank receives tremendous ex posure.

Ipswich Show Society manager John Sher herd said his organisation didn't want t come between the IRL and the Jets.

A ONE-match ban slapped on Jets prop Danny McAllister following last September's seasonending loss to Wynnum won't prevent the consistent forward from playing in Saturday's round one clash against Brothers/Valleys.

Jets officials successfully argued that McAllister, regarded by many as the leading prop in the competition, would have

played in that game had he not been suspended.

McAllister was suspended over an on-field incident during Ipswich's heavy loss to Wynnum.

McAllister's new front-row partner for the clash at Bendigo Bank Oval is Kerry Theuerkauf.

The West End junior replaces retired skipper Jamie Mathiou. Veteran lock Danny Coburn is the new skipper.

"I think it's a good reward for Cobes," Teevan said.

The Jets will field a vastly different backline to the one that coach Trevor Gillmeister had at his disposal last season

The newcomers are fullback Adam Connelly, winger Gorden Rattler and centre Steve Matai.

Terry lese, who played with West End, was one of a number of players who narrowly missed selection Shane Williams has been named in the Jets' reserve grade squad.

Teevan quashed speculation that the club had fallen out with Williams, who had been linked to IRL club West End.

Teevan said he had "no doubt at all" the utility had the ability to force his way back into the Queensland Cup side.

"Providing of course he does everything right, he's as good a chance as anyone," Teevan said. "He's proven to us before that he can do the job."

Williams trained with the Jets last night and a move to West End now appears extremely unlikely.

### Gilly starts search to fix big problem

A DISASTROUS start to the season has prompted desperate Ipswich Jets coach Trevor Gillmeister to begin searching for more prop forwards in an attempt to beef up his lightweight pack.

The Jets' season slipped further into crisis mode on Saturday when they were thrashed 58-6 by the North Queensland Young Guns in Townsville.

Ipswich lacks size and firepower up front following the retirement of prop Jamie Mathiou and the possible unavailability of leading prop Danny McAllister (neck) for the remainder of the season.

Gillmeister yesterday revealed he had phoned some of his league contacts in an attempt to lure a fringe NRL player to Ipswich. "I even rang Daniel Anderson in New Zealand. I rang around hoping to pick up one or two front rowers," Gillmeister said.

"You can't win without going forward."

So far his behind-the-scenes work has been unsuccessful.

The Jets' lack of size up front was highlighted by the fact that Kerry Theuerkauf has started at prop in every match this season.

The consistent Theuerkauf is better suited to the backrow and in previous years he has been used off the bench.

Saturday's loss was Ipswich's fifth in succession in their worst start to a Queensland Cup season in many years.

But the shattering defeat fell short of the club's heaviest Cup loss — a 64-4 loss to Norths at Bendigo Bank Oval in 1997.

In a remarkable turnaround since the Jets' brilliant start to the 2003 season under rookje coach Gillmeister, the under siege Ipswich side has not celebrated a victory in 11 matches.

Ipswich lost its two finals matches at the end of last season and its three trial games in 2004.

The Jets started the current season with a shock 18-18 draw to Brothers Valleys and they have not won since.

"We did the little things good last year," Gillmeister said.

"We got on a roll, had quick play the balls and our support play was good."

It has been a completely different tale this year, with handling errors plaguing the Jets' campaign.

Gillmeister admitted he felt "embarrassed" for his players as the Young Guns piled on the points in front of a massive crowd in the curtain-raiser to the NRL match.

"They played well. You've got to give them credit," Gillmeister said of the Young Guns.

He said the Jets only had the ball about 16 times in the first half and 17 times in the second half.

"That's just not enough football, you can't win games like that," Gillmelster said.

The frustrated Jets mentor conceded that some of his players were still finding their

feet, while others were "happy to be in the side".

"There's still quite a few blokes still battling with the step up," Gillmeister said.

He said the standard of play in the competition had improved 20% on last year.

Halfback Ricky Bird, who failed to finish the game because of an ankle injury, scored the only try for the Jets.

### Jets prove they can be winners

Skipper Danny Coburn believes his team can build some momentum after Saturday's breakthrough win. "It's been coming, we haven't been far off the mark," Coburn said.

The hard-hitting lock said the "fun" factor had returned to their game against the Seagulls.

Coburn said the players appreciated the support from the rowdy group behind the goal posts.

"It was awesome. It really lifted us," he said.

Steven West and Joel Smallwood both bagged two tries for the lets

In another positive sign, centre Steve Matai played his best game for the club after a slow start to the season.

The hard-running Matai made several clean breaks. His last break led to a crowd-pleasing try to halfback Ricky Bird.

Prop Geoff Thomson made an encouraging top grade debut.

Thomson was well supported by Mat Cameron and Kerry Theuerkauf.

The Jets look set to be without winger Gordon Rattler for at least eight weeks after he hurt his collarbone against the Seagulls.

Kyle Warren hurt his knee but the former North Queensland forward should be fit to play the Dolphins.

The Dolphins suffered their first loss of the season on Satur-

day when they were beaten 34-26 by Toowoomba.

A win today could mark the start of a mid-season resurgence for the Jets, who have just three competition points after seven rounds.

The Jets will be missing winger Gordon Rattler after the speedster broke his collar-bone in their 38-8 victory against Tweed Heads last fortnight.

Redcliffe coach Neil Wharton has tinkered with his forwards, sliding forward mainstays Danny Burke and Grant Flugge back to bench and promoting Nathan Sologinkin and Gavin Cooper to the starting 13.

The Jets will also clash with Redcliffe in BRL colts and A grade matches at Dolphin Oval today.

The colts are coming off a big win over Brothers Valleys but Jim Landy's team may find the going tough because of injuries and the possible promotion of star winger Gideon Mzembe.

### Surprise news gives Jets a lift

LEADING lpswich Jets prop Danny McAllister is on target to make a surprise return from a career-threatening neck injury in the next few weeks.

McAllister's likely return within the next month was one of the few positives to surface out of the weekend after the Jets were belted 34-8 by Redcliffe in their Queensland Cup match at Dolphin Oval.

The Jets prop received his positive news after visiting a neurosurgeon.

"I'm going to struggle for a couple of weeks when I come back I know that. But I'll just do my best," McAllister said after watching his teammates crash to their sixth loss of the season.

"I'm still going to training but it's a bit limited. I can't do the contact (work) at training (yet)."

Jets coach Trevor Gillmeister would love to have the former South Sydney prop back in his starting side.

However, Gillmeister said his current team couldn't afford to sit back and wait for injured players like McAllister to return.

"Those blokes in there can't mark time until he gets there, or if he does get there," Gillmeister said. "If he can play that's good, but you can't be waiting for him to come back."

Gillmeister was furious with his side at half-time after the Jets failed to capitalise on a promising start against the competition heavyweights. The Jets led 4.0 early but the Dolphins took con-

trol to lead 28-4 at the break.

Gillmeister said it looked like some of his players "put the cue in the rack for the last 10 minutes" of that first half. "That's the disappointing

"That's the disappointing thing. And the problem is the same three or four blokes are busting their backsides every week," Gillmeister said, referring to consistent players like Kyle Warren, Danny Coburn and Ricky Bird.

"I'm probably being a bit biased, but if there's two better forwards running around at the moment than Cobes or Killer (Warren), I haven't seen them and that's including the Redcliffe blokes."

Gillmeister said the Jets had no excuses even though they were again forced to reshuffle their backline following injuries to Gordon Rattler and Nicholas Cowburn.

"We went away from what we've been training to do. You could have thrown a blanket over us in that last 15 minutes (of the first half)," he said.

McAllister and injured hooker Jamie Tomlinson watched Saturday's game from the bench.

Although the Jets are anchored near the bottom of the table, McAllister believes his club can still string some wins together.

"We showed that against Tweed. You couldn't even say who was the best player in that game, it was just everyone," he said. "When the Jets play like that, we can beat anyone."

Redcliffe forward Daniel Green said the Dolphins' game plan was to overpower the Jets towards the end of each half.

"Everyone comes out firing in the first 10 to 15 minutes because we are the benchmark obviously," he said. "That's what we're learning, hold that pressure and we'll be right."

Green, a former Ipswich player, broke the Jets' spirits in the first half when he forced a mistake out of fullback Joel Smallwood.

Critics argue that there is not enough local talent in the Queensland Cup side. What are your thoughts?



The number of local players in each side is diminishing. The Comets are having their best ever season this year after many years of mediocrity. Why? Because they have imported many players. Success is what peo-ple judge you on but don't get me wrong, I would love to see more local talent in our Cup side. But again they must have the ability to be there. Our club has spent considerable resources on our colts team and our junior development squads in the past so that, in time, local players will come through the system and take their place in the top team, I mentioned some players earlier who will do that in the next few years. But development is a problem. ### **Cruel loss torments loyal supporters**

ANOTHER one that got away.

For the fifth time this season the Ipswich Jets have lost a Queensland Cup match by six points or less.

Tweed Headş inflicted further pain on the inconsistent Jets yesterday with a 28-24 win at the Piggabeen Complex.

The bitter feeling of defeat has left loyal supporters and players like prop Danny McAllister scratching their heads.

"I wish I could give you an answer to that, I really do," Jets prop Danny McAllister said when asked about the Jets' failure to repeat the form which carried them to a big 36-12 win over Young Guns the previous week.

McAllister, who is poised to retire at the end of the season, was fuming at the final scoreline. "We should have won that by 20 (points)," the Queensland Country prop said. "(Tweed's) off-loads killed us."

Both sides scored five tries but the Seagulls were more accurate in the goal-kicking department.

However, the result may have been different had the referee not disallowed a try to Jets youngster Cody Fullarton with nine minutes remaining.

McAllister, his teammates and Ipswich supporters were adamant that Fullarton grounded the ball.

Fullarton received an even bigger setback just minutes later when he injured his knee. Jets medical staffare almost certain that Fullarton has suffered damage to his cruciate ligament.

Injury also cut short Kyle Warren's involvement in the game. A hamstring strain forced the Queensland Residents forward off the field late in the first half.

The Seagulls led 16-14 at half-time.

Teenage forward Matt McPhee and experienced pair Kerry Theuerkauf and Walter Mackie toiled hard all day for the Jets.

Mackie, a former New Zealand A forward, has re-signed with Jets for 2005.

Gillmeister feels so strongly about the issue that he won't re-

sign with the Jets until the matter is sorted out.

"We're not professional enough and it's not the Jets' fault. That's the reality of it," a frustrated Gillmeister said yesterday.

Gilimeister said, without a gym on site, his players were disadvantaged compared to other Queensland Cup teams.

"I feel for the players. The players are the meat in the sandwich and that's what shits me," Gillmelster said.

"It's frustrating for me and the players. It looks like they (IRL) don't want us to win."

IRL chairman Ray Jorgensen claimed no one from the Jets had approached him about allowing the Jets to put a gym facility in place.

"Gilly hasn't come to me and spo-

ken to me personally about it," Jorgensen said.

"If they want a gym, then we've got to work out where to put it. There's no big drama as far as I'm concerned."

Jorgensen told the QT that he would be willing to let the Jets bring in a demountable building which could be used as a gym.


The IRL and the Jets have held some discussions with the Ipswich City Council about the issue.

One option is for the gym to be built on the council-owned land next to Bendigo Bank Oval.




