For the first time, Peter Planyavsky's significant biography has now been published by the University of Rochester.


The newly published book is available to the world in English, thanks to extensive and detailed translation work by Christa Rumsey.

CAROLS AT MALVERN

A Review by Colin Jenkins.

In the recent issue of Organ Australia the Editor reported that a church with a 1906 Fincham pipe organ was sacking the choir and organist at Christmas. The service of readings and carols at Malvern Presbyterian Church on Sunday December 14 was sadly their 'swansong'.

I had over the years heard excellent reports about their carol service but until then had never been able to attend. I wish to thank and congratulate the director and organist Dr. Gordon Atkinson, the sixteen choristers and the brass ensemble on their dedication and professionalism in such sad circumstances and for the high standard of their performance. The well balanced and blended choir sang about a dozen varied works, many of which were unaccompanied. It was certainly a demanding program for the choir, some of the composers/arrangers being Harold Darke, Healey Willan, Charles MacPherson, June Nixon, William James and Philip Ledger. The service ended with Dr. Atkinson playing the wonderful J.S. Bach BWV 729 'In Dulci Jubilo'.

Such was the dedication of the choristers that several travelled quite a distance to be part of this choir. There must certainly be a heavy sense of loss. One lady who has been actively associated with the church and the choir for many decades told me that she will now be attending church elsewhere. PARISH COORDINATOR OF LITURGICAL MUSIC

The parish of St Brendan's, Flemington, is seeking to engage a Parish Coordinator of Liturgical Music to assist in the provision of liturgical music. The parish wishes to assist in the training and formation of future liturgical musicians in memory of the late Fr Bill Jordan (1935-2013) who dedicated so much of his priestly ministry at local and national level to the promotion of liturgical music in the life of the Church. The Fr Bill Jordan Memorial Fund has been established with the aim of assisting in the training and formation of future liturgical musicians and singers.

The Parish Coordinator of Liturgical Music is a position of pastoral leadership and the required skills include the ability to interact with parishioners, parish staff and other musicians and the ability to engage the parish in the musical celebration of faith in worship.

The successful applicant will be responsible for:

- The arrangement and provision of liturgical music principally at the 10.30am parish Mass on allocated Sundays and with 1. alternate provisions also for the Vigil Mass at 6.00pm;
- Assist in the formation of a small choir to cultivate a culture of quality liturgical music in the parish in response to the needs of 2. the parish;
- 3. Liaise with the Parish Priest and Pastoral Associate in the selection of liturgical music for Sunday Mass and for seasonal celebrations such as Christmas and Easter, Confirmation and First Eucharist;
- 4. Liaise with the school community in encouraging family participation at Sunday Mass.

Selection Criteria:

- Have successfully completed Grade 5 AMEB or equivalent on their chosen instrument; a.
- b. Have experience in singing in a choir;
- Have piano/organ playing skills; c.
- Have excellent communication skills; d.
- Be well organised and able to work alone and collaboratively with others; e.
- Hold a current Working With Children Check and National Police Check

Remuneration:

In employing a Parish Coordinator of Liturgical Music, the parish wishes to assist a young student of liturgical music in their ongoing training and formation and will provide \$6,000 per annum from the Fr Bill Jordan Memorial Fund to meet the total cost of employment. This is a one year part-time position with pay and conditions in accordance with the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne 'Conditions of employment for parish employees 2011'. The employment is conditional upon the employee undertaking an agreed course of study and directing the net pay towards tuition fees.
