## Media Information

## HISTORICAL INFORMATION

The University of Nevada women's basketball program began in the year 1899, when the team, coached by Ada Edwards, earned its first win over a varsity opponent, Stanford. Since its inception in 1899, records of the program's history have not accurately been kept up to date. For the purposes of all records, wins and losses and other statistical information related to the Nevada women's basketball program, the 1981-82 season will be considered the first for the program, the first year women's basketball was recognized by the NCAA.

## CREDENTIALS

All requests for credentials for Nevada women's basketball games should be emailed or called in to Katie Rihn at krihn@unr. edu or (775) 682-6963 no later than 48 hours before the game.

Assigned courtside seating for credentialed media is limited and will be available on the following basis: (1) local, national and visiting team outlets covering Nevada women's basketball on a deadline basis; (2) live television and radio outlets covering the game; (3) others, granted on a priority basis. Nevada's complete credential policy is available at www.nevadawolfpack.com.

The media entrance at Lawlor Events Center is located at the main entrance and will open one hour before each game. Media arriving earlier than two hours prior to the game can enter at the bottom of the truck ramp on the southeast side of the arena.

Media parking (by pass) is in the West Stadium Parking Complex, located just north of Lawlor Events Center.

## MEDIA WORKROOM

The media workroom is located in Meeting Room 4 in the main hallway immediately to the left of the Lawlor floor-level entrance.

Wireless internet and a limited number of telephone lines are available for filing on a first-come, first-served basis. Game notes, rosters and other information will be available in the workroom before each game.

## PHOTOGRAPHY

Only properly credentialed photographers will be allowed in the designated photo areas of Lawlor Events Center as specified by the NCAA. Any backboard cameras or other remote cameras must be approved by media services.

## POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Wolf Pack head coach Jane Albright and selected Nevada student-athletes will be available approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game. If requested and available, the visiting coach and players will be available outside the opponent locker room. Please contact the visiting SID for details.

Completed in 1983, Lawlor Events Center, located on the University of Nevada campus, has been home to Wolf Pack basketball, men's since its inception and women's since 1994-95. The arena seats 11,536 in an oval configuration with every spectator enjoying a center-court line of sight. The seating capacity includes 60 seats mounted on the main floor, bringing fans nearly courtside on all four sides.

Named after Nevada's legendary coach and athletic director Glenn "Jake" Lawlor, Lawlor Events Center was made possible by a grant approved by the Nevada State Legislature in 1979. Ground was originally broken in October 1981, and the construction project was completed on schedule for the grand opening on Nov. 4, 1983.

Originally built at a cost of $\$ 26$ million, Lawlor Events Center has undergone periodic modifications and improvements. During the 1998-99 season, Lawlor Events Center unveiled a state-of-the-art electronic imaging scoreboard that allows fans to see highlights before each game, player pictures and stats, and includes two statistics boards at each end of the floor. At the start of the 19992000 season, in a never-ending effort to consistently modify the facility, the teams played on a new floor.

The arena's capacity and the efforts taken to improve the facility made Lawlor the home of the Big West Conference men's and women's basketball tournaments from 1996-2000. It didn't take the WAC long to tab Nevada for yet another championship tournament coming to Reno in 2005 and 2006. The WAC Tournaments returned to Lawlor Events Center in 2009 and 2010.

The NBA has also chosen Lawlor to host exhibition games. So far, the Sacramento Kings, Utah Jazz, Golden State Warriors, Seattle SuperSonics and the New Orleans Hornets have all played at Lawlor. In addition to the NBA, the Harlem Globetrotters have also played in the Pack's den.

Lawlor Events Center, however, is far from just a basketball arena.
The facility has served as host to concerts and events throughout its history. Lawlor has been host to such sporting events as the Professional Bull Riding Association's Bull-Nanza and concerts such as Fleetwood Mac, Cher, Bette Midler, Metallica, Prince, Yellowcard and Hilary Duff.

As a concert facility, Lawlor is capable of seating 12,000 spectators, and the arena can be changed in configuration or reduced in size to accommodate smaller acts or to provide a more intimate theater setting.

Also utilized extensively for conventions and meetings, Lawlor's main floor provides accommodations for large convention exhibits and can be used for large group gatherings.

The arena's meeting and convention complex, which was upgraded in July of 2002, includes a large foyer for receptions and registration for meetings and conventions. Eight meeting/ banquet rooms provide nearly 10,000 square feet of space, which can be easily divided into smaller rooms with fully-movable partitions and service access to all areas.

Each of Nevada's basketball teams have locker rooms in the facility with two more opponent locker rooms and two smaller dressing rooms. Additional rooms are utilized for press conferences, educational/ social functions, performer rehearsals, personnel briefings, storage for performers, and auxiliary dining, as well as housing for the facility's executive offices.

# NEVADA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2016-1/ MEDH HUID? 



## Season Preview

After earning her 500th career victory last season, Nevada women's basketball coach Jane Albright will guide the Wolf Pack for the ninth time this season, following an injury-plagued 2015-16 year. The Pack has been stifled with injuries to key players the past two seasons, but with a couple of those players back and a few newcomers added to the mix, the team looks to improve from last year's 5-25 finish.

The Pack returns a core of veterans from last year's squad, including seven letterwinners and three starters. This group of experienced leaders will be balanced out by the five newcomers that will don the Silver and Blue for the first time.

Offense will be looked upon as a focal point during the upcoming season and it showed in the team's lone exhibition game versus Stanislaus State. Scoring 91 points, the Wolf Pack managed to hit 50 percent of its shots and forced 27 turnovers in the process.

## GUARDS

Albright will have no problem finding a group of guards to put in the rotation, as 10 of the 14 roster spots are listed as guards. Senior Stephanie Schmid returns for her final season being looked upon as the team's primary threat from beyond the arc. Last season, Schmid knocked down 60 three-pointers, which ranks eighth in Nevada single-season history.

Looking to joining Schmid in the starting lineup is junior T Moe. After being sidelined due to injuries the past two seasons, Moe is hoping the 2016-17 campaign can be the year she will be able to facilitate the Pack's offense in the point guard role. As a left-handed shooter, junior Ashlee Jones will provide depth as a shooting guard and fight for a spot in the starting five as well.

Coming off of a solid rookie campaign which led to an appearance on the All-Mountain West freshman team, sophomore Riana Everidge returns as the team's third leading scorer from last season. Sophomore Camariah King hopes to use the extended minutes she saw as a freshman a year ago in her appearances as a valuable role player off of the bench.

Classmate MorningRose Tobey enters her second season with the program and will be used as a role player who can come into the game and shoot the ball. Junior Halie Bergman comes in to this season off of her first full year with the Pack, where she averaged 5.5 points per game. As a newcomer who joined the program in the offseason, junior Jade Redmon's decision making will be critical, as her assist-to-turnover ratio as a freshman at Eastern Washington ranked 37th in the nation.

## FORWARDS

Led by a trio of forwards from last season's team, the post players on this year's team will be difficult for the opposition to stop. Sophomore AJ Cephas returns as one of the Pack's best players down low, after leading Nevada in blocked shots during her freshman campaign.

Junior Teige Zeller is projected to be the team's starter at the four or five spot and will be heavily relied on for her rebounding abilities and scoring down low. Standing at 6-3, sophomore Terae Briggs joined the Pack in the offseason from United Tribes Technical College. In her freshman year, she used her long reach to challenge opposing teams, which resulted in her averaging a double-double (22.4 points, 12.1 rebounds) last season.

Sophomore Kristin Dearth will sit out the 2016-17 season due to NCAA transferring rules, after competing for Seattle University last year. Freshman guard Desirae Gonzalez will begin the year on the sidelines, as she continues to recover from an injury suffered last year.

The Wolf Pack will kick off the regular season on Friday, Nov. 11 at 6:30 p.m. when the team squares off versus Long Beach State inside of Lawler Events Center.

Jane Albright enters her ninth season as the head coach of the Nevada women's basketball team in 2016-17, and her 33rd overall season.
Albright's 104 victories at the helm of Nevada ranks her second alltime in the Wolf Pack record books. During her eight-year tenure at Nevada, Albright has coached four all-conference Defensive Player of the Years, four All-WAC first team selections, a WAC Newcomer of the Year, three all-conference second team honorees, three AllMountain West honorable mentions, a Mountain West all-freshman selection and a regional finalist for the NCAA Division I State Farm All-America Team.
Last year Albright captured the 500th win of her career with a 70-64 win on the road at San Diego State. She ranks in the top 35 in the nation in active career wins. The season as a whole was stifled with injuries once again as the team lost three starters by the third game. Many of the freshmen and newcomers were forced into more important roles, giving them some added experience heading into the new year.
Albright and the Wolf Pack endured an injury-plagued season in 2014-15, but still managed a few noteworthy accomplishments. As the Mountain West schedule got underway, N e v a d a knocked off in-state rival U N LV thanks to a 71-62

## Mungedi was

 named the MW Defensive Player of the Year for a second straight season.After a couple of rebuilding seasons, Albright's 2013-14 Wolf Pack squad posted an 18-win campaign and compiled 12
 victories in the Mountain West, setting a program record for most conference wins in a single-season. The team also set a program record for free throws made (529) and free throws attempted (760), among registering its highest scoring average ( 71.5 ppg ) since the 1985-86 season.
Thanks to an 8-2 run in the final 10 games of the regular season, the Pack secured the No. 3 seed for the Mountain West Championships, and reached the semifinals round of the tournament. Albright coached three members of the 2013-14 squad to all-conference honors, including the league's Co-Defensive Player of the Year, Mimi Mungedi. Following the season, Albright received the 2014 Carol Eckman Award presented by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) at the NCAA Women's Final Four. The award is presented annually to an active WBCA member coach who exemplifies Eckman's spirit, integrity and character through sportsmanship, commitment to the student-athlete, honesty, ethical behavior, courage and dedication to purpose. She became the program's all-time winningest first-year head coach finishing the 2008-09 season with an 18-14 overall record and a 10-6 mark in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC). The Pack made the program's first-ever appearance in the final of the WAC Tournament after tying the program record for highest-seed earned in the tournament with a No. 3 seed. The Pack also recorded a programbest start to conference play, opening 7-0. Albright led the team to a defeat of No. 7 Louisville to win the championship of the John Ascuaga's Nugget Classic in Reno, the program's first-ever defeat of a nationally-ranked opponent.
Additionally during her first year at Nevada, she coached the WAC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, the WAC Defensive Player of the Year, an All-WAC first team honoree, the Ruth Russell Award winner for the top, senior, female student-athlete at Nevada, five academic All-WAC honorees and a regional finalist for the NCAA Division I State Farm Coaches' All-America team. After the season, Albright was honored at the Final Four by the WBCA with the Kay Yow "Heart of a Coach Award" which is presented annually by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) to honor a basketball coach who has exemplified biblical principles over the course of his or her career.
Her second year at the helm had a similar feel to her first season. She coached a young squad in 2009-10 to an 18-14 overall, 10-6 WAC record and a third place league finish. Nevada once again earned the third seed for the WAC Tournament and an automatic bid to face Wyoming in the WNIT, only the second postseason appearance in the Pack's history.
In 2010-11, Albright guided Nevada to its first 20-win season in program history, finishing 22-11. The 2010-11 squad accomplished the feat with benchmark wins over NC State and San Diego State at the John Ascuaga's Nugget Classic, followed by home wins over Arizona, BYU and Louisiana Tech. Albright's strong coaching earned the team a postseason WNIT bid in which the team defeated St. Mary's to record its first-ever WNIT victory. The 2010-11 team set program records for points $(2,228)$ and rebounds $(1,364)$ in a singleseason, as well.
The women's basketball team is one of the most active of the Wolf

Pack teams in supporting the community. In 2009-10 alone, the Nevada women's basketball team logged more than 530 hours of community service.
Immediately prior to her tenure at Nevada, Albright served as the head coach at Wichita State for five seasons. While at Wichita, Albright signed and coached the 2005 Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year. Her teams ranked in the top-60 nationally in attendance and turned in the top-two single-game crowds in the MVC in her final two seasons. They also excelled in the classroom and the community, turning in the second-highest team GPA in school history and averaging over 450 hours of community service per year.
Perhaps what Albright is best known for is the tremendous success she had in turning around the program at the University of Wisconsin. The winningest coach in Badger history with a 161107 record (.600) from 1994-2003, Albright led Wisconsin to seven postseason appearances in nine seasons, including five trips to the NCAA Tournament.
In 1998-99 her team finished as the WNIT runner-up, and followed that up by winning the WNIT title the very next season. Prior to her arrival in Madison, the program had experienced losing seasons in nine of the previous 10 seasons. Albright led the Badgers to eight consecutive winning seasons, including four $20-$ win campaigns. Her squads averaged 19.2 wins per year in those eight seasons, including three years with 21 victories, which matched the school record for single-season wins. Wisconsin had won 20 games in a
season just twice prior to her arrival. Albright was responsible for six of the best 10 seasons in Wisconsin history, and she is also credited with helping Wisconsin rank in the top-10 in home attendance nationally in every year from 1995-2003.
Albright led her first Badger team to a 20-9 record and was named the 1995 Big Ten Conference Coach of the Year for her efforts. The team set the school record for winning percentage with a 21-8 record in 1995-96. She led the Badgers to a 16-1 start and the highest national ranking in school history in 2001-02 (No. 5 in the Associated Press poll and No. 7 in the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' poll). She also coached 41 Academic All-Big Ten selections in her nine years at Wisconsin, the most of any school during that period. Albright's first collegiate head coaching job came at Northern Illinois where she served at the helm of the women's basketball program for 10 seasons. The winningest coach in Northern Illinois history with a 188-110 record from 1984-94, Albright's Huskie squads turned in five 20-win seasons and four NCAA Tournament bids.
Northern Illinois also won three conference championships and had three runner-up finishes during her tenure. In addition to her collegiate success, Albright served as the head coach of USA Basketball's gold medal-winning Jones Cup team in 1996. She was an assistant coach on USA Basketball's Junior National team in 1992 and led the 1991 U.S. Olympic Festival South team to a gold medal. Albright began her collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant for Pat Summitt at the University of Tennessee from 198183. She assisted with UT's first NCAA Final Four team in 1982.

Camille Williams enters her ninth season with the Nevada women's basketball program in 2016-17 and her fourth as an associate head coach. Under Williams' guidance as her position coach, former Wolf Pack star Mimi Mungedi was selected with the 25th overall pick in the 2015 WNBA Draft by the Tulsa Shock. Mungedi was also named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year for two straight seasons.
Williams spent three seasons, 2005-08, as an assistant coach at UC Santa Barbara prior to coming to Nevada. During her time with the Gauchos, she assisted with guard and post player development and defense, served as the co-recruiting coordinator and oversaw UCSB's academic development.
While at UCSB, the Gauchos won its 13th Big West Conference Championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2007-08. She served as the lead contact in the recruitment of a pair of McDonald's AllAmerican Nominees, Meagan Williams, the Sacramento Player of the Year, and Ashlee Brown, an all-state player from Arizona.

## EUROPEAN PLAYERS

Five players in school history have made careers of playing basketball after completing tenures at Nevada.

Local standout Kayla Williams followed up her four years wearing silver and blue with a professional stop in Australia.

Tahnee Robinson completed one of the most stellar careers in Nevada history and concluded her professional career in Poland. At Nevada she was one of the best scorers in the nation at 22.1 ppg and was a finalist for the Sullivan Award.

One of the best point guards to ever play for the Wolf Pack, Dellena Crinier played for the PTS Lider in Poland after finishing her career in 2009.

After her four-year career for the Wolf Pack, Kate Smith signed a contract to play overseas in 2003. Smith was a two-time All-WAC selection and finished her career with 1,942 points, the second-best in school history.

Smith signed a contract with the Helios, a team located in Sion, Switzerland, which is about an hour and a half east of Geneva. When she left to play for the team that summer, the Reno, Nev. native was the only American on the roster.

Smith was not the first Wolf Pack women's player to sign a contract to play overseas. KaTrina Crenshaw played for Nevada from 1994-97 and was considered one of the most dominating players for the Pack on the boards. She is still ninth in school history for career rebounds and steals.

After leaving Nevada, Crenshaw played for a number of European teams including Pallacanestro Femminile Bellinaona (Switzerland), Faol Friburgo (Brazil) and Rmat Chen (Israel). She was one of the leading rebounders and scorers in the league in 1998-99 and in 2000-01 her team placed third in the Carioca Championship (Brazil).

The most recent Nevada grad to join the ranks overseas is Arielle Wideman. Wideman graduated in May 2014 and signed to play for Breidablik in Iceland. She finished her Wolf Pack career tied for third all-time in assists.
