

POULTRY SLAUGHTER

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January 1981

LIVE WEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTIONS totaled 1.61 billion pounds (730 thousand metric tons) during January 1981, virtually unchanged from January 1980 but 3 percent more than December 1980, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Inspections included 1.34 billion pounds (606 thousand metric tons) of young chickens, up 1 percent from January 1980 and 7 percent above December 1980; 86.6 million pounds (39.3 thousand metric tons) of mature chickens, a decrease of 11 percent from a year earlier, but 26 percent above December 1980. Turkey inspections totaled 178 million pounds (80.5 thousand metric tons), down 1 percent from the same month a year ago and 25 percent below December 1980. Duck inspections at 7.57 million pounds (3440 metric tons) were 2 percent below January 1980, and 13 percent below December 1980.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME totaling 1.16 billion pounds (528 thousand metric tons) ready-to-cook weight during January 1981, was virtually unchanged from January 1980 and 1 percent above December 1980. The percentage breakdown for the January 1981 total is 83 percent chilled and 17 percent frozen.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 283 million pounds (128 thousand metric tons) ready-to-cook weight, up 22 percent from January 1980, and 6 percent above December 1980.

CUT-UP PACKAGED poultry products totaled 426 million pounds (193 thousand metric tons) ready-to-cook weight, virtually unchanged from January 1980, but 3 percent below December 1980.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during January 1981 were 6.50 million pounds (2950 metric tons) live weight. Percent of quantities inspected equaled 0.40 compared to 0.41 percent for January 1980. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS were 32.7 million pounds (14.8 thousand metric tons) (N.Y.D. Weight), 2.26 percent of quantities inspected, the same as in January 1980.

POULTRY SLAUGHTERED (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) during January 1981 was 1.17 billion pounds (529 thousand metric tons) ready-to-cook weight, virtually unchanged from January 1980 and 1 percent above December 1980.

Other poultry - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the U.S.D.A. Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.
