A "FQDN" stands for **Fully Qualified Domain Name**. This is the ENTIRE DNS name that you would like to use in your round-robin configuration. For instance, while your server may be named "superapp", most users would not be able to simply type <u>http://superapp</u> and be able to get to a webserver. However, "superapp.il.gov" would be a FQDN and would be accessible to an internet user. In this configuration you can have the same FQDN point to multiple Ips (round-robin) for a load balancing or high availability scenario. If your group or agency will be hosting the site or service on your OWN servers than make sure to fill out the "FQDN IP" fields with the IP address(es) of the server(s) hosting the site. If the ITO will be hosting your site, then you can leave these fields blank as the ITO will be determining the IP addresses of the services. If you are using clustering, you will use the FQDN Names in this section to configure your clustering software.

Round Robin DNS is when you point the same DNS name to multiple servers in order to spread out requests for services amongst multiple servers. If you are going to be using this than this box needs to be filled out. In this situation, a user on the client side will have their request sent to one server, while the very next user will be sent to the second IP address. Note that in this setup the "RR Name" remains static while the IP addresses change.

If you will be using a fail-over type of clustering where only ONE IP address gets used, then in the event of a failover that SAME IP is transferred to a different server, than you do not need to fill out this section.

General Instructions

In an effort to streamline the DNS process, we have posted the new DNS on the Telecom web page. The form is a WORD2000 template. It is a form. You are able to TAB from field to field.

We suggest that you download it, and save it to your hard drive. As you use this form, you will be able to save a copy of order. The authorized telecommunications coordinator can transmit the DNS electronically to us as an email attachment. Their email address will serve as their electronic signature.
