## California's Potential for Flash Flooding Will Be Covered in DWR, CAL FIRE, NWS Briefing

State flood and fire officials, along with partners from the National Weather Service, will provide a briefing on current weather and land conditions as the rainy season begins and the potential for flooding increases. Officials will explain how the public can best prepare and will brief media on strategies under way by State and federal agencies to prepare for emergency flood response. There is heightened risk of flash flooding this year due to the effects of an ongoing drought and widespread fire across the state in the last couple of years. The combination of

burn scars and heavy rainfall can lead to landslides and debris flows that may impact roadways and communities.

- Demonstration of monitoring tool that uses multi-agency data to compile detailed, realtime ground conditions
- "Flooding After Fire" educational video, showing recent fire/flooding events and recommendations for taking precaution, produced by DWR
